2024 WDAA World Show Qualification Requirements:

- The horse qualifies.
- The horse must qualify in every level that it will show in at the World Show.
- For Introductory – Basic levels, the horse must earn 63% or higher, in at least 1 WDAA Recognized show, either in person or online.
- For Level 1-5 the horse must earn 60% or higher, in at least 1 WDAA Recognized show, either in person or online.
- The qualification period begins October 1st, 2023, and ends August 26th, 2024.
- If the horse has qualified in the appropriate levels by the requirements above, there is no need to qualify for rail classes or freestyle with a score.

A word from the WDAA Judges Ed Committee - Joanne Coy

The Judge Education Committee has been very busy these past several months. We have redesigned the process for judges to become licensed, giving applicants and current judges many more options. All of the requirements are listed on the USEF/WDAA websites. A few significant changes to the licensure process include (but are not limited to):

The addition of scribing and sitting hours required of small r applicants, Mandatory sideline apprenticing as well as attending the WDAA World Show Judge Education Training Program and passing that program with a satisfactory rating required of r applicants. To become eligible to start the process obtaining a small r license, the applicant must either already have a current Federation License, or be a USDF L Graduate or have completed a minimum of three requirements that range from judging experiences at a schooling show to having trained a horse that places in the top 5 at the world show. There are other options that an applicant may choose, these are just some examples.

Requirements for R Applicants now include Sideline Apprenticing as well as attending and passing the WDAA World Show Judge Education Training Program. The Sideline Apprenticing opportunity allows R WD Judges to work with apprentices at live shows (with prior permission from show management, of course) so that apprentices can gain as much knowledge from our WD experts ringside.

All of these methods, coupled with our Online Judge Seminar and annual in person Judge Seminar in Colorado, help to prepare our current judges and our apprentices to better evaluate our riders. The consistency in judging that we gain from our very carefully outlined judge education program is so valuable. We want our riders to feel that they are performing for

judges who are prepared and compassionate, judges who will recognize their efforts and help them with constructive criticism so they can better educate themselves and their horses. The best gift we can give our horses is an education so they may live a long useful life. Our Judge Education Committee consists of Gail Matheus, Director, Joanne Coy, Chair, Cindy Butler, WD President, Jodi Ely, and Joyce Swanson. It's a team of dedicated professionals who value the hard work of all of our WD members, fellow judges and WD Staff.

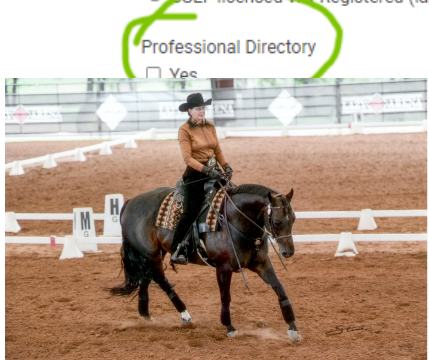

- Level 1 Freestyle: 4/5/2022 Total points correction on cover page only.

UPDATE

- Level 2 Test 2: 3/30/2022 Movement 15 clarification that the collect jog begins at V. Changed sidepass from 4 steps to 4 strides.
- Level 2 Test 2: 5/23/2022 Changed sidepass from # of strides to go to the first quarter line.
- Level 2 Test 4: 2/15/2022 Changed sidepass from 4 steps to 4 strides.
- Level 2 Test 4: 5/23/2022 Changed sidepass from # of strides to go to the first quarter line.
- Level 2 Freestyle: 1/7/2022 Movement 10 has had the verbiage "through the jog" removed. And now states only "Simple change of lead".
- Level 3 Freestyle: 4/26/2022 Total points correction on cover page only.
- Level 4 Freestyle: 4/26/2022 Added L|R to movements 9 & 10. Removed L|R from box 11. Corrected total points on cover page.
- Level 5 Test 1: 12/10/2021 Added "Left Lead" to movement #1 to clarify the lead to take from the halt.
- Level 5 Test 3: 12/10/2021 Added "Left Lead" to movement #1 to clarify the lead to take from the halt.
- 2022 Western Dressage Equitation Tests: 11/30/2022 Tests Retired.
- 2023 Western Dressage Equitation Tests: 12/1/2022 Added using the new Walk-Jog, Intermediate, and Advanced categories.
- 2023 Western Dressage Equitation Patterns: 02/22/2023 Changed the word "test" to "pattern".
- 2024 Western Dressage Equitation patterns: 01/18/2024 Movement #4 Lope to Halt movement changed to "Halt through the Jog."
