


The WDAA Year End High Point program is active, the ONLY thing you need to do is get your WDAA Horse #.

- Level 2 Test 2: 5/23/2022 Changed sidepass from # of strides to go to the first quarter line.
- Level 2 Test 4: 2/15/2022 Changed sidepass from 4 steps to 4 strides
- Level 2 Test 4: 5/23/2022 Changed sidepass from # of strides to go to the first quarter line.
- Level 2 Freestyle: 1/7/2022Movement 10 has had the verbiage "through the jog" removed. And now states only "Simple change of lead".
- Level 3 Freestyle: 4/26/2022Total points correction on cover page only.
- Level 4 Freestyle: 4/26/2022Added L|R to movements 9 & 10.
