If not specified as Open (O), Adult Amateur (AA) or Junior/Young Rider (JR/YR) on the entry, you will be entered in the OPEN division. <u>Adult Amateur riders must have a current USEF AA card to</u> ride as an amateur. Junior/Young Riders must include birth date on entry.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply proof CDS membership may not be counted toward CDS awards.

Adult Amateurs who fail to supply proof of USEF Amateur standing by the closing date will ride in the Open division.



High Point Qualifications for All levels – Intro through Grand Prix – Traditional and Western:

- Minimum classes to be ridden 3 at Intro through Third Level; 2 at Fourth level and above
- Minimum score for Year End awards, 55.000%
- Two tests per day/show will count. The highest two scores to be used.
- Qualifying period October 1 to September 30
- > Points earned: First place = 5 points, Second place = 3 points, Third place = 1 point

To be eligible for year-end awards, you must do one of the following:

- Be a TEV chapter sponsor
- OR Volunteer a minimum of 4 hours per horse/rider combo. Volunteer hours may be assigned to horse/rider combo of choice in Rated or Schooling show. Volunteer hours may be earned by 1.) Working at any TEV show (rated or schooling (Show set-up and tear-down worth double hours!) 2.) Serving on a committee, 3.) Helping with a TEV educational event
- **OR** pay a nomination fee per horse/rider combo in current year. TEV chapter member \$25, non TEV chapter member \$35.

RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

1. EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

2. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management whose decision shall be final.

3. Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse how management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

4. The management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and cancel award prizes without claims for damages; to cancel or combine unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges.

5. Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees.

6. Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation.

7. In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio-hazardous medical waste containers will be provided. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

8. No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform.

9. It is the tradition of the show that riders be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed and the horses properly presented. Management may in its discretion bar any person from entering the ring if not suitable presented to appear before an audience.

10. Life, Senior active and Junior active CDS Members shall be eligible to participate, A non-member may participate as a rider, owner, lessee, agent, or trainer upon payment of a \$15 CDS non-member fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the requirements of this rule: USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux, quadrille and Opportunity classes

11. ENTRY PROCEDURE: Entries must be made on an official entry form or photocopy of same and must be filled out completely, including all classes entered, <u>all signatures</u>, (no dittos), organization membership numbers and fees. Please include a photocopy of current membership ID for rider, owner, and trainer. Amateur must provide a copy of their Amateur card or proof of application for an Amateur card. An Internet search *will* be done for entries missing any of the required membership photocopies at a charge of \$20. Entries are accepted on a first-come, first served basis until classes are filled. Entries received after the closing date will be accepted only if the schedule permits. Each late entry that has been accepted shall be assessed a late fee of \$50. Changes to entries (\$25 fee) after the closing date will be at the sole discretion of the show management. **No telephone** entries will be accepted. Complete entry with check or credit card information must be mailed by closing date or a complete entry (with card copies and credit card payment) may be faxed to 760-728-6325 or emailed to dianaloire@aol.com. Payment in full or an open check or credit card information must accompany the entry. Mail complete entries to: E.R. Hamilton, PO Box 732, Bonsall, CA 92003.

12. AMATEURS AND JUNIORS: Amateurs are defined by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book. All riders entering the Amateur classes must possess or have applied for an USEF Amateur Card prior to riding in the class. All riders in Amateur Divisions must present an USEF Amateur Card by the closing date or they will be entered in the Open Division. Cards may be applied for at the show office. Individuals are eligible as Juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they will be 18 years of age. Individuals are eligible as Young Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 years and until the end of the calendar year in which they reach 21 years of age. Competitors will compete as Adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22. Individuals possessing current amateur certification are only eligible as Adult Amateurs from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22.

13. REFUNDS: All fees, less a \$30 administrative fee, will be returned if horses are scratched before the Closing Date. THERE ARE NO REFUNDS OF CLASS FEES OR STALL/TACK ROOM FEES FOR ANY REASON AFTER THE CLOSING DATE. Exception: class fees and drug fees will be returned if scratched by 6:00PM the Sunday before start of the show.

14. RETURNED CHECKS: Checks returned by the bank for any reason are regarded as a most serious offense and will be handled according to the following procedure: A 10% penalty (minimum \$25.00) will be assessed for each returned check. Credit cards that do not go through will incur a penalty of at least \$10 for each occurrence.

15. ARENA: Show arena is 20 X 60 meters. Footing consists of sand mixed with dirt. Only those horses registered with the show management are permitted use of the show facilities, warm-up arena and show arena. All horses in the warm-up arena must wear their competition numbers. Lunging is allowed in specific areas only and upon receiving permission of the ring steward.

RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION continued

16. STABLING, GROUNDS FEE: MD type 12x12 stalls with doors. Stalls, and grooming stalls and tack stalls \$150 (Friday thru Sunday). If you need to arrive before Friday, or stay longer than Sunday, you must call and make arrangements (951) 201-0686 extra days at \$25. Day stall fee \$100 during show (Saturday OR Sunday). Grounds fee per show day of \$30 applies if not stabled.

17. BEDDING and FEED: Shavings and hay may be ordered on your entry or by emailing <u>dianaloire@aol.com</u> or faxing to 760-728-6325. Orders MUST be received by noon Thursday before the show. There will be no deliveries during show. No straw allowed.

18. RV PARKING: In stable area. \$35/night.

19. SHOW STATUS: In the event of inclement weather, natural or other disasters prior to the show, it is the competitor's responsibility to contact management as to the show status. Please call (760) 728-6325.

20. DOGS: Dogs must be on a leash. All animals should be managed so as to not disturb the competitors.

21. SCORED TEST: Tests will be distributed to riders, or their authorized representative, after the results have been finalized and awards presented. Scores will be posted when available.

22. STALLIONS: Stallions must be in a stall or remain in the trailer unless being managed by a qualified person.

23. SCHOOLING HORSES: Horses not entered in the show must be registered with the Horse Show office and will be given a number to be worn at all times when not in a stall or tied to a trailer. Appropriate stall or grounds fees mandatory fees of \$58 and a \$25.00 per day fee must be paid. Any person(s) riding a schooling horse must have signed an official entry blank. A schooling horse may be allowed in the warm-up arena at the discretion of the ring steward.

24. RIDE TIMES: Times will be emailed and will be posted at TEV-CDS.com. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to contact show management if times are not received. Failure to enter the arena at the specified time may incur elimination.

25. HEADGEAR RULE: From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted.

26. GOLF CARTS: and all other motorized vehicles require a valid driver's license to operate. Wheelchairs, etc., for people with disabilities are exempt. *USEF rule GR1301.7*

"Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a

motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule."

27. GR845 Equine Vaccination Rule:

- At Federation licensed competitions horses, more than 7 months of age, entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine 103 manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.
- In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.
- In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.

In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse
reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the
veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical
concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the
competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while
on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition
Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.

CDS PONY AWARD

CDS has created a Pony Award. The high scoring pony at Training - Grand Prix (Freestyles excluded) at each CDS recognized show will receive a High Score Pony Ribbon.

The shows should:

 Identify the high scoring pony on their CDS COVER SHEET.

2. ATTACH a copy of the USEF DRES-

SAGE pony measurement card.

The CDS Central Office will send out the award to the pony rider. All pony riders should inform show management that they would like to be considered for the CDS Pony Award.

To be eligible, all ponies <u>must</u> have a current USEF DRESSAGE Pony Measurement Card.

If the pony is measured at a show and receives a temporary show measurement, that measurement will be good for all CDS shows during that show season.

CDS will also offer a Year End Award to the Highest Scoring Pony in Open, Amateur and Junior Divisions.

Ponies

Technical Delegates are certified to measure ponies with the USEF approved stick. Measuring must be performed by a TD, with the show veterinarian. In order to be officially measured, the pony must be entered in the competition. The owner must be a USEF member or pay a fee.

Dressage and/or DSHB competitions which offer classes or divisions limited to ponies are required to have an official measuring stick available and the TD must be on the Federation list of those approved to measure, or a licensed Steward must be present.

If classes restricted to ponies are not offered, the competitor is responsible for arranging the measurement and the cost of the on-call vet.

Adults and Juniors may show ponies in dressage. If you own a pony, read the entire section in the USEF Dressage Rules. www.usef. org.

CDS will accept temporary show measurements and the competitor may take that measurement form and use it for that show and any CDS show during the current show year. The USEF official DRESSAGE PONY measurement cards will be accepted as a valid card.

There are no courtesy, or trial measurements. Once the show officials place the stick on the pony, the measurement is final. Ponies must be re-measured annually until they reach the age of eight.

Your responsibility as a pony owner and or rider:

 Know the rules. If you have any questions, call USEF.

2. If a pony class is offered at a show and your pony does not have a current measurement card, contact the show management to make sure they have an approved metric stick, and at the same time letting them know your pony needs to be measured prior to its class.

 If you are in possession of a valid USEF DRESSAGE pony measurement card, then, simply enclose a copy of it with your entry.

The WDAA Horse Lifetime Points & Awards Program tracks points achieved by a horse throughout their Western Dressage career.

Points must be earned at WDAA recognized shows (find shows under Events on WDAA website)

Open to all horses, ponies, and mules regardless of breed, type, age, etc.

Points may be earned with more than one rider.

Owners and persons participating and/or riding a horse in the program must be current WDAA members in good standing.

Points awarded at all WD levels and Freestyle tests, as well as for rail classes.

WDAA World Championship Show test/classes earn triple points.

USEF shows with a USEFlicensed Western Dressage judge earn double points. Check the WD judge directory on the WDAA home page under "Important Links" to see whether your judge qualifies for double points.

Regional Schooling Show Awards Program Rules

General Information:

- 1. Program year is December 1 through November 30.
- 2. Scores may be earned in any USDF region.
- 3. Late nominations, applications and results submissions will not be accepted.

Rider Eligibility & Requirements:

- Rider must have a USDF Group Membership that is recorded by the Group Member Organization (GMO) at the time the scores are earned.
- 2. Riders affiliated with an International GMO must declare a USDF region.
- 3. Owner must have at least a USDF non-member number at the time the scores are earned.
- Horse must have at least a USDF Horse Identification Number at the time the scores are earned.
- Rider must submit a one-time yearly online nomination and \$35 nomination fee for each horse/rider combination no later than 14 days after the last day of the first competition. The nomination fee must be paid annually.
- Riders may change their division status during the program year. A rider's status will be determined at the end of the program year.
- Rider must submit scores to USDF online no later than 21 days after the last day of the competition.
- Only USDF members in good standing are eligible to compete in the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program and receive awards.

Award Divisions & Levels:

- 1. Four award divisions will be recognized per region:
 - a. Open: from the beginning of the calendar year the rider reaches age 22, not a USEF Adult Amateur (AA), not a non-professional.
 - b. Junior/Young Rider (Jr/YR): up until the end of the calendar year the rider reaches age 21.
 - c. AA: from the beginning of the calendar year the rider reaches age 22 and possess a current USEF AA card.
 - d. Non-Professional: from the beginning of the calendar year the rider reaches age 22, not a current USEF AA, not a professional.
- Seven levels (freestyle, pas de deux and quadrille not included) will be recognized per division. Exception: only 6 levels are recognized in the open division:
 - a. Introductory (only in Jr/YR, AA and non-professional divisions)
 - b. Training
 - c. First
 - d. Second
 - e. Third
 - f. Fourth
 - g. FEI combination of Prix St. Georges, Intermediate I, Intermediate II and Grand Prix scores.
