Kentucky Dressage Association

Due to COVID-19 the show committee plans to implement social distancing policies at the shows and ShowSecretary.com plans to operate under a CLOSED SHOW OFFICE to help protect exhibitors, staff, and officials. Some of these policies will include:

- Anyone who exhibits COVID-19 symptoms, has tested positive for COVID-19 within last two weeks, or *has
 been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 within the last two weeks cannot
 enter the competition grounds. *Exception: Healthcare personnel who have treated patients using
 appropriate medical grade PPE during the course of performing professional duties are exempted from
 this restriction.
- Staff, officials, and volunteers will have their temperatures taken upon arrival each morning.
- Participants and their support crew are required to self-monitor their temperature once daily prior to
 entering the competition grounds. Support crew is limited to TWO people per horse in addition to the
 rider.
- All participants, including licensed officials and volunteers, must provide emergency contact information and execute an updated Waiver and Release of Liability, Assumption of Risk and Indemnity Agreement required by USEF, as a condition of participation.
- Anyone with a temperature of 99.4° F or higher may not enter the facility.
- All attendees are required to social distance by a minimum of six feet.
- A staff member will patrol the barn areas to remind people to stay six feet apart from each other and to wear masks when within six feet of another.
- A facemask or face covering is required for all staff, officials, volunteers, service providers, and
 participants in any setting where there is a possibility of being within six feet of any other individual, and
 when not mounted on a horse. Competitors and their support crew are required to provide their own
 masks.
- All entries <u>must be perfect</u> to facilitate pick up in the breezeway of the Dressage Complex pavilion. No
 office visits will be permitted. Please send only one person per group/barn to pick up all packets for your
 group.
- Scratches and rider/horse changes will be communicated via text, email and/or phone with the show office.
- Issues that need staff or official's attention will be initiated by a phone call to the office and, if needed, the appropriate staff or officials will address the item at the exhibitor's stalling area.
- Stalling charts will be created using as much space as possible between barns.
- Competitors are encouraged to not spend extra time at the Kentucky Horse Park outside of their ride times and time to properly attend to their horses.
- Competitors may not report to their warmup area more than one hour before their ride time.
- The number of horses in each warmup area will be limited to 6.
- Spectators will not be permitted.
- The Competition Organizer has the authority under GR 702.1 and GR914 to remove from the facility any person who does not comply with the regulations and requirements in effect at the competition.

^{*} The Kentucky Horse Park \$10 (per horse) Equine Facility Fee has been enacted to produce a sustainable stream of revenue to support show facility maintenance. ENTRIES SENT WITH SIGNATURE REQUIRED WILL INCUR A \$30 POST OFFICE VISIT FEE.

E-mailed entries will NOT be accepted.

<u>Reminder:</u> This prize list covers two shows. You must submit <u>TWO</u> entry forms if entering both shows. Payment required with entry. Each horse/rider combination requires a separate entry form.

Entry is not complete until payment is received. Checks will be deposited upon receipt. No post-dated checks accepted. Dishonored checks or declined credit cards will require complete repayment prior to the show plus a service charge of \$50. All outstanding fees must be paid before show packets are issued. No bridle number will be issued without full payment and completed entry, including signatures and emergency contact information.

<u>Complete entries MUST include</u> A copy of a negative Coggins taken within 12 months of the show dates showing the same horse name as on the entry (GR907.4) A parent or guardian signing on behalf of a junior exhibitor does not need to be a USEF member. All entries must include a signed copy of the <u>USEF Waiver and Release of Liability</u> (page 23).

Entries missing any of these items will be considered incomplete. Incomplete/incorrect entry fee is \$10.

Entries are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis based on postmark or online entry date and entries may be limited. Those entries postmarked after closing will be accepted at the discretion of the show secretary, based on a space available basis, and charged a \$50 late fee per show. If the classes are oversubscribed, a Waiting List (in the order of receipt) will be maintained. Management reserves the right to refuse any entry. Entries may close early if time limits for judges are filled. Remaining entries will be placed on a wait list. **Late entries**, if accepted, must be complete and submitted by 11 a.m. the day before start of class. Late Entries will not be included in the program. Entries are limited to one arena. Send your entries early to ensure getting into the shows.

<u>Noncompeting Horses</u> are welcome on a space-available basis. Owner must fill out an entry form with all release signatures, send a current Coggins, and pay noncompete fee per show, office fee per show, and a stall fee or trailer-in fee, but no USEF drug fees. Noncompete horses are still subject to and must comply with the Drugs and Medication rules and are subject to drug testing. Noncompeting horses must wear current issued bridle number when out of the stall. Noncompeting horses may only school in competition and warmup arenas after show hours.

<u>Conditions of entry</u> Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but the Horse Show Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show Management, Facility and its Directors harmless for any loss or accident to his horse, horses or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

Confirmation of entry will be e-mailed. All e-mail addresses must be CLEARLY printed.

NOTICE: A horse may NOT compete in the KDA Summer Classic I & II Dressage Shows and the KDA Western Dressage Shows I & II on the SAME days. If you wish a horse to compete in both Classical Dressage and Western Dressage, you must choose Classical Dressage one day and Western Dressage the other day.

HORSE/RIDER MEMBERSHIPS and SAFE SPORT

A **TRAINER**, as listed on the entry form, is defined as any adult (18 & older) who has responsibility for the care, custody or performance of the horse while the horse is on the competition grounds. This adult must sign the entry form as trainer. If the rider is considered the trainer, the rider must sign as the trainer. A parent or guardian signing on behalf of a junior exhibitor does not need to be a USEF member. A **COACH**, as listed on the entry form, is defined as an adult (18 & older) who gets paid for instructing, teaching, schooling or advising a rider with their horse on the competition grounds. This adult must sign the entry form as coach. If there is no coach, the signature for coach may be left blank.

<u>USEF Membership</u> This is a USEF LITE competition. NO USEF memberships, non-member fees, or horse registrations are required to compete in this show.

To be eligible to participate as a rider, owner, lessee, coach, or trainer at Federation LITE competitions, persons need NOT be members of USEF or WDAA.

EXCEPTIONS Those wishing to be eligible for USEF HOTY awards must have USEF horse registration and be USEF members, and those seeking WDAA WHLPAP points must be WDAA members.

USEF SAFESPORT TRAINING REQUIREMENTS TO COMPETE

January 1, 2019, every USEF adult member (18 & older) with an active senior competing membership must complete USEF's Safe Sport Training, overseen by the U.S. Center for SafeSport. An adult member may be OWNER, RIDER, TRAINER and/or COACH. Adult members listed on the entry must complete the entire course and be Safe Sport Trained before the first day of competition. Safe Sport Training must be completed by all adult members on the entry or the rider will not be allowed to compete. You may access the Safe Sport modules from your USEF member dashboard at www.USEF.org.



Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules and of the current USEF/WDAA rules will be judged in accordance therewith.

REFUNDS, SCRATCHES, and HAZARDOUS WEATHER POLICIES

Refund Policy Cancellations accepted only in writing by mail or e-mail. Cancellations prior to or on the closing date will be refunded less \$50 cancellation fee, office fee, and online convenience fee. No refunds will be issued after closing date (even if closing date is extended) except for fees collected on behalf of USEF (drug fees) and USDF (qualifying fees) provided all outstanding fees are paid in full; else it will be applied to those fees. Refundable fees will be mailed within one month after the end of the competition for entries that were cancelled. Refunds of less than \$15 will be considered donations to the Dressage Complex Renovation Fund unless owners opt out of the donation opportunity on the entry form or by notification to show secretary at the show.

Once you are at the show, please notify the show office if you are scratching a class. A no show is defined as a scratch for the entire show. Please do not be a 'NO SHOW'.

<u>Scratches During Show</u> Competitors have the responsibility to inform the Show Secretary in the Show Office of their intent to scratch a ride prior to the scheduled ride time. Scratches will be accepted at the competition arena or with the Ring Steward but the competitor or representative must contact the show office via text, e-mail, or phone to officially scratch their ride. Scratched rides are not refundable.

<u>Hazardous Weather/Act of God/Accident Policy</u> Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accident, or emergency. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to Great American\USDF qualifying classes being offered. No refund for cancellations due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accidents, or emergencies. GR305.4

CLASS RESTRICTIONS

- Horses may be ridden by two riders. Each horse/rider combination requires a separate entry with all signatures and emergency contact. <u>WD 102</u>
- No horse may be ridden in the same class number more than once (even with a different rider) per WD 102.2
- Horses who have shown in Western Hack are no longer eligible for Western Suitability.
- Horse/rider combinations showing in walk/jog rail classes are not eligible for other rail classes or any test
 other than Introductory Level (Different horse/rider combinations are eligible for other rail classes and tests)
- Horses may not compete in more than 6 tests per day.
- Horses may only compete in levels that are adjacent with the same rider. For example, a horse may not be ridden in a basic level test and a level two test UNLESS with a different rider. WD 102.
- A horse may be ridden by a maximum of two riders. <u>WD 102.</u>
- The open division is for all nongaited horses regardless of breed and all riders regardless of age or status (professional, adult amateur, or youth.)
- The gaited division is for all gaited horses regardless of breed and all riders regardless of age or status (professional, adult amateur, or youth.)
- Nongaited and gaited horses compete together in the suitability and equitation rail classes as well as classes 114TOC and 214TOC.

<u>Tests</u> both nongaited and gaited horses will use 2017 WDAA/USEF Western Dressage tests, which are available at www.westerndressageassociation.org.

Attire and Equipment: USEF rules and guidelines will be used for attire and equipment. For more information please review the USEF rule by clicking this link <u>WD 120 121 122 123</u>.

Protective headgear is required for ALL riders.

OFFICE INFORMATION

<u>Office Hours</u> The show office and stabling will open at 12:30 p.m. on Friday, July 3. During the show, the show office will be open one hour before the first ride until one hour after the last ride. Contact with the show office must be via text, e-mail, or phone. No in-person visits to the show office will be permitted.

<u>Ride Times</u> Stabling assignments and provisional times will be available at <u>www.showsecretary.com</u>. Management reserves the right to change the time schedule after provisional times have been posted. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the provisional schedule.

Official times will be available at noon the day before each show. Check online for official times. Printed times will not be available. This show follows USEF GR830 with regard to rescheduled ride times.

Any changes after closing date initiated by rider or owner will incur a \$20 per change fee.

<u>Schedule</u> Classes may not necessarily be run in the order listed in the class list. See page 18 for management rights. Rail classes will run after all WD dressage tests are completed. Approximate start times will be given for rail classes, but exhibitors are responsible to keep track of the pace of the show and be on time for classes.

Schooling will begin Friday, July 3 at 12:30 p.m. All competitors must have their current issued bridle number before riding. Schooling on Friday will continue until dusk. Saturday schooling will be available *after* the show until dusk.

<u>Hand-walking</u> of unmounted horses is allowed around the exterior of the competition rings from sunrise until 30 minutes before the first ride. No mounted horses allowed.

Bridle numbers All horses must always wear current issued bridle numbers or back numbers when out of stall.

Anyone mounting, getting on, riding, or trying a horse at the facility during the weekend of the show (including warmup day) must sign a show release form in the show office.

Please contact show secretary for any questions regarding entering competition/entry forms.

NOTICE: A horse may NOT compete in the KDA Summer Classic I & II Dressage Shows and the KDA Western Dressage Shows I & II on the SAME days. If you wish a horse to compete in both Classical Dressage and Western Dressage, you must choose Classical Dressage one day and Western Dressage the other day.

STABLING and GROUNDS INFORMATION

Exhibitors are not permitted to attach nails or screws to barns. Only fans with 3-prong plugs permitted in barns.

Stabling 10 x 10 Permanent shed row stalls with sliding doors. Early arrivals must notify the show secretary and pay all appropriate early arrival stall fees. See fee schedule. If your stall is used prior to your paid arrival date, you will be charged an early arrival stall fee of \$65 per day. The stalls are monitored daily by the KHP and KDA. Setting up your stalls prior to horses arriving does get charged by the KHP as a stall being used so, therefore, KDA will have to bill you an early arrival stall fee. Moving or changing of any horse or tack stall without prior approval of the show secretary may incur a \$50 penalty.

<u>Groups</u> Please note stalling groups with your entry. Your group should decide on a "group name" that all competitors provide on their entry. Stabling requests honored when possible. *Groups will be separated from other groups with empty stalls or tack stalls as much as possible to create social distancing.*

All entries must pay either a stall fee or a trailer-in fee per horse.

Setting up or bedding a stall prior to noon on Friday will be charged an early arrival fee, whether occupied by a horse or not. Horses staying after 8 a.m. on Monday will be charged a late departure fee.

No bedding will be supplied. You may bring your own or see page 11 how to order from Dever.

Tiered Stabling fees on page 5 are designed for those showing one day or two days. A one-day stall fee is only available to those showing one day. If you are showing both days, you must pay the full show stall fee.

Footing/Arena Sand/clay base arenas and warmups. Lungeing on the track only at the east end near the KHP museum. The small 20m x 40m ring may be used for Introductory and Basic levels. All other classes will be in the standard 20m x 60m ring.

No one on foot (except leadline handlers, ring stewards, equipment checkers, emergency medical service, and show management) is allowed in designated warmups. *Coaches, trainers, spectators, and other unmounted individuals must stand outside fence or partition of warm-up arenas.* Lungeing permitted in designated outdoor areas only. All horses in the warmup arenas must wear their current issued competition numbers.

If tack adjustments or rider changes are needed, personnel must perform them outside of the arena.

<u>Golf Carts</u> Golf carts will only be permitted at the Dressage Complex in designated parking areas. These areas will be marked. Only KDA Official golf carts will be allowed near any rings or warmup.

AWARDS

<u>Scores</u> It is the responsibility of the competitor to verify the accuracy of all scores. Scoring errors must be reported to the Show Secretary within one hour of the official posting of the scores from the last class of the show day during which the score was earned. Tests will be scored electronically and streamed continuously. You may check your score at www.showsecretary.com.

<u>Ties</u> In case of equality of points the competitor with the highest marks received under General Impressions shall be declared the winner. When the scores for General Impressions are equal the horses must remain tied. Errors on a test may not be used to break ties.

<u>Class Awards</u> First place award and six ribbons for each class for divisions specified on the class list. When classes are posted as **final online**, you may pick up your ribbons. Paper results pages will NOT be posted. Management reserves the right to make any changes required by circumstances. One set of ribbons will be awarded for each class. Any rider may enter these classes. Upon request, awards and ribbons not picked up by the end of the show will be mailed to the winners at their expense.

<u>High Score Ribbons</u> One set of champion and reserve ribbons will be awarded for nongaited horses and a second set will be awarded for gaited horses each day. All levels are included, Introductory through level 4. Rail classes are not eligible for high score ribbons.

SERVICES

<u>Announcements</u> Class announcements and ride time announcements are a courtesy to the exhibitor and not all shows provide the capability of public address announcements. Exhibitors are responsible for presenting themselves to the ring at their designated time and accept the full responsibility for doing so. Competitions offering public announcements will make every effort to maintain a working PA system, but it is stressed that it is still the exhibitors' responsibility to be on time. No protest will be upheld, nor any ride time changed, on the basis of a PA breakdown or missed announcement. Ring stewards will also make every effort to keep people informed and entering the ring in a timely fashion. Exhibitors are responsible for knowing the correct show time and their scheduled performance time regardless of PA announcements or ring stewards. No protest will be upheld, nor ride time changed due to failure of the exhibitor to meeting their responsibilities.

You are responsible for reserving/ordering your own straw, shavings, stall mats, turn-out paddocks. *It is requested you order before your arrival*. <u>Equine Vaccination Rule</u> All equine entering this competition must provide with their entry, proof of current flu/rhino vaccinations within 6 months of the show BUT should be no later than 7 days before the show. Please read GR845 for full explanation.

Exhibitors should exercise extreme caution before medicating their horses and should be aware of the US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION rules governing drugs and medications. Any questions about the use of certain medications and regarding Rule IV should be directed to the USEF Federation Equine Drugs and Medications Program, 956 King Avenue, Columbus, Ohio 43212-2655. (800) 633-2472, (614) 299-7707, FAX (614) 299-7706.

<u>Kentucky Health Regulations</u> Owners with horses from other states are responsible to check for most up-to-date health regulation Kentucky State Veterinarian website information before arrival.

All horses entering Kentucky Horse Park grounds must have valid proof of negative Coggins test (within 12 months). A 30-day certificate of veterinary inspection is required for all horses arriving from outside the state of Kentucky. All horses considered Kentucky based must have a certificate of veterinary inspection dated within 12 months. Horses who fail to arrive with appropriate paperwork will not be allowed to unload on park grounds.

<u>Liability</u> Horses by their inherent nature present a risk. Neither the organizing/show committee, the show volunteers and staff, the facility or its owners, any host GMO, USEF or USDF or their members will be responsible for any damage, injury, loss to persons, horses, or property of exhibitors or spectators/attendees. All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up-to-date.

Each participant in an equestrian activity expressly assumes the risk of and legal responsibility for any injury, loss or damage to person or property which results from participation in an equestrian activity. Each participant shall have the sole individual responsibility for knowing the range of his or her own ability to manage, care for, and control a particular horse or perform a particular equestrian activity, and it shall be the duty of each participant to act within the limits of the participant's own ability, to maintain reasonable control of the particular horse or horses at all times while participating in an equestrian activity, to heed all posted warnings, to perform equestrian activities only in an area or in facilities designated by the horseman and to refrain from acting in a manner which may cause or contribute to the injury of anyone. If while actually riding in an equestrian event, any participant collides with any object or person, except an obviously intoxicated person of whom the horseman is aware, or if the participant falls from the horse or from a horse-drawn conveyance, the responsibility for such collision or fall shall be solely that of the participant or participants involved and not that of the horseman.

<u>Accidents</u> A participant involved in an accident shall not depart from the area or facility where the equestrian activity took place without leaving personal identification, including name and address, or without notifying the proper authorities, or without obtaining assistance when that person knows or reasonably should know that any other person involved in the accident is in need of medical or other assistance.


<u>Important notice to all affected parties</u> Third parties may come upon the property or enter the facilities where any herein described or listed event will occur; provided, that this is a license to enter the premises, for the purpose of observing or participating in the event, but not otherwise, and such license to any individual is subject to revocation by the owner, lessee or organizer, and entry for any purpose other than granted herein, shall be deemed criminal trespass and subject to appropriate legal proceedings.

<u>Dogs</u> are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be held on a leash or otherwise restrained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule will be issued a Yellow warning card and may be subject to penalty under Chapters 6 and 7. (GR1301.6) No other pets or livestock other than horses and mules allowed on grounds.

<u>Directions</u> The Kentucky Horse Park is located north of Lexington, KY, at 4089 Iron Works Parkway, Lexington, KY 40511. From I-75, take Exit 120. From other highways, watch for Kentucky Horse Park signs. Enter main gate entrance of the park, watch for signs to KDA stabling (or ask for directions from the gate attendant). When you arrive at the park, the Kentucky Horse Park charges a \$15 fee for a Show Pass, which is good for all the days you are there for the shows.

- PARKING Passes may be obtained from the Parking Booth or Visitor Information Center upon entry. \$15.00 fee
 assessed for each parking pass per event. All trailers must park in approved lot. NO PARKING is allowed in the barn
 area. Trailers should be dropped in the appropriate parking lot and NOT in the stabling area.
- CAMPING- Must go to campground for all camping, unless event has made separate arrangements with KHP Special Events. NO CAMPING ALLOWED IN BARN AREA AT ANY TIME! CAMPING- Please call 888/4KY-PARK (888/459-7275) or reserve on-line at www.parks.ky.gov. Groups of 20 or more, please call 859/259-4257 or 800/370-6416. Check-out time is at noon. Violators will be towed.
- GOLF CARTS/ MOPEDS ETC. A privilege-not a right- extended to show participants. Must be at least 16 years of age
 with valid driver's license. Not allowed in the tourist/visitor areas of the Park. NO ALL TERRAIN (4-wheeler, 3wheeler, dirt bikes over 50 cc's) VEHICLES ARE ALLOWED ON HORSE SHOW GROUNDS!
- DOGS- Must be on a leash (not to exceed 6 feet in length) or suitably restrained in a tack stall/cage etc. Loose
 animals/ animals left in vehicles in distress, etc. can and will be removed from the grounds at the owner's expense.
- HORSES AND HORSE DRAWN VEHICLES / STABLING Horse and carriages have the right-of-way at all times.
 Competitors must comply with contracted ship-in and ship-out dates.
- EXHIBITOR PROBLEMS/SPECIAL REQUESTS-All non-emergency problems or special requests must be relayed through show management to ensure prompt attention.
- 7. PACKAGES/DELIVERIES- The Park is not responsible for any deliveries to an event or event participant. <u>All packages are delivered to Central Receiving at the Maintenance Complex; addressee is responsible for retrieving packages.</u> Park mail service personnel will try to assist if conditions allow, however, any delivery/package may be refused/returned to sender, etc at any time without notification.
- PARK ADMISSION- Reduced Park admission is available to event participants and must be obtained at the Visitor Information Center.
- FIRE CODES As of May 15, 2006, The Kentucky Horse Park will not allow the following inside of barns or tents, which will be enforced by the Fire Marshal:
 - a. any 2-wire appliances
 - b. any 2-wire extension cords
 - c. light duty cords for indoor use
 - d. any 3-way adaptors unless specifically made for outdoors
 - e. any adaptors without 3-wire connections
 - f. any cut or damaged cords
- EVENT MANAGEMENT is responsible for notifying/ making available all Park rules/regulations to participants in their
 event. Included, but not limited to, exhibitors, officials and volunteers.

Other Kentucky Horse Park violations include:

- Multiple connectors



US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION RULES

"EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH."

US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION rules are in force from the moment show management allows access to the show grounds. This includes conduct, correct saddlery and equipment, and attire.

<u>USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT</u> *DR901.9* Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR222) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

MOTORIZED VEHICLE RULE In accordance with GR1301.7: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Sharps Containers Competition management shall place a minimum of one sharps container per each competition, whether or not stabling is provided. Additionally, at least one sharps container per fifty occupied stalls for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments in convenient locations in barns housing competition horses. It is competition management's responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. Please do not use garbage cans for this material. If local law has different requirements, local law will prevail.

<u>Protective Headgear</u> is required for all riders.

THE RULES MAY HAVE CHANGED FROM THE CURRENT RULE BOOK. IT IS THE COMPETITORS' RESPONSIBILITY TO CHECK THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK FOR ANY CHANGES. The listed rules Are only general and are subject to change at the discretion of the Board of Directors of USEF.

IT IS THE RIDER'S RESPONSIBILITY TO KNOW RULES FOR SHOWING AT A DRESSAGE SHOW.

MANAGEMENT RIGHTS and SHOW POLICIES

Show Management reserves the right to change officials, rotate rings, limit entries, add, combine or cancel classes insufficiently filled, modify the schedule or reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors, and modify or cancel awards and/or make whatever changes are required by circumstances to the competition specifications listed herein.

Show Management reserves the right to refuse or require withdrawal of an entry, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, and/or prohibit entries deemed sufficient by Show Management without claims for damages.

Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees.

Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation.

No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform.

It is the tradition of the show that riders be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed and the horses properly presented. Management may in its discretion bar any person from entering the ring if not suitable presented to appear before an audience.

Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions regarding or arising out of any incident in the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the horse show management; their decision will be final.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").
