Individual Dressage Tests	\$25.00
Equitation, Suitability classes &	\$15.00
Costume Class	\$15.00
Arena Fee	\$10.00
Stabling: 10 x 10 stalls	\$25.00 per day.
Shavings: First bale provided, additional:	\$7 each.

Camping/RV: Overnight camping fee is \$20 per night per unit. Some electrical hookups are available. Spaces are available after 3:00 PM Friday.

Closing date of entries: Thursday, June 2, 2022, unless the show becomes over- subscribed, in which case entries will be limited and will be accepted as received.

Telephone or emailed entries will not be accepted.

Post Entries: Management reserves the right to accept post entries if space allows. There will be a post entry fee of **\$10.00** per class.

Refunds:

A) Refunds **BEFORE CLOSING** day less \$10 Secretary fee.

B) Refunds **AFTER CLOSING DATE** *allowed* only upon presentation of a veterinarian's or doctor's certificate. Otherwise, no refunds of entries or stabling after closing date unless there is a waiting list for the stall/ride and the space <u>can be filled</u> from a waiting list at least 5 days prior to day of competition.

C) A 10 Secretary fee <u>will be deducted</u> from all refunds made after the closing date.

Ride Times: A ride schedule will be emailed **to each rider** after the closing date. If ride times are not received, it is the responsibility of the rider/owner to contact Show Management. Any changes in Time Schedule will be posted outside the **SHOW OFFICE**. Tentative start times will be **8am each day**.

Combination of Classes: The show management reserves the right to cancel or combine (where less than three horses are entered), or divide classes, or change order for award purposes.

Competition Tests:

Introductory Classic Dressage tests will be the 2019 USDF tests.

All Classic Dressage Training Level and above tests, including rider tests, will be the *2019 USEF* tests.

Eventing dressage tests will be the 2022 USEA tests.

Western tests will be the 2022 WDAA tests.

Test of Choice Classes: There will be no changes to Test of Choice classes after entry closing date.

Arena: All tests will be ridden indoors on dirt/sand footing. Western Dressage Intro and Basic and USDF Intro <u>will</u> use & Training <u>may</u> use 20M X 40M arena; otherwise, Training and all other classes will use a 20M X 60M arena.

There is a covered warm up arena and one additional outdoor arena is available for warm up and lunging.

Show Office: Located inside the large MAIN indoor arena. Open one hour prior to first class and will close one-half hour after the last class.

Barn chart: will be posted at the office and stalls will be marked.

Judge's decision in all classes is final. No one shall approach a Judge regarding a decision unless they first obtain permission from the Show Secretary who will arrange an appointment at a proper place and time.

Accuracy of Scores: It is the responsibility of the competitor to verify the accuracy of scores. Any scoring errors must be reported to the Show Secretary and/or the assistant within two hours of the last ridden test for that class. Failure to report any errors within the time allowed will mean that the error will not be corrected and there will be no change in class placing.

DOGS: Please leave your dogs at home, if possible. Dogs on the show grounds *must be controlled on a leash*, confined to vehicles, or crated, always. A 'donation' of \$50.00 will be required to free an impounded canine.

STALLIONS: No stallions over the age of 18 months may be stabled or ridden on the ground except during sponsored events and must be managed by an Adult 18y.o. or over.

CONDUCT: Show Management reserves the right to refuse any entry of an exhibitor or the participation of any agent, trainer or rider who has demonstrated unsportsmanlike behavior at a Appleatchee Show or to its Management.
