Iron Horse Cup

The Iron Horse Cup is open to all horse/rider combinations competing in the Gold, Wild Rose, Western Dressage and Pony Club classes. Horses must compete in Dressage, Prix-Caprilli, Fun and Flat Classes.

The horse with the highest overall score will be the 2022 Iron Horse.

The maximum total score is 100.

Dressage will count for 50% of the overall score. The top 2 tests over the show will be used in the Iron Horse tabulations. Freestyles, Introductory and Walk/Jog not to be included for the Iron Horse Cup.

Prix-Caprilli will count for 30% of the overall scores.

Fun, flat and road/show hack classes accumulate points over multiple classes to a maximum of 10 points for Fun Classes and 10 points for Road/Show Hack Classes.

Dressage and Prix-Caprilli points are calculated by adding the placing points to 50% of the test score.

In case of a tie the Champagne Class will determine the winner. The Champagne Class will be held at the end of the day on Sunday. All Iron Horse Cup contenders will be automatically entered into the Champagne Class.



Gold Show General Information

The Spring into Dressage Competition is sanctioned as a Gold competition member of Equestrian Canada, 308 Legget Drive, Suite 100, Ottawa, ON K2K 1Y6 and is governed by the rules of EC.

Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book.

An Equestrian Canada Gold (or higher) Membership and an AEF membership are required for the rider. Fees should be paid to Equestrian Canada www.equestrian.ca and AEF www.albertaequestrian.com respectively. Horses must also have an EC horse recording or temporary horse license.

Statement of Principle

Equestrian Canada (EC), the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

All persons shall be committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.
- Ensuring that all Equestrians including owners, trainer and competitors or their respective agents, use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their own horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
- Providing current information on Code of Practice for the Care and Handling of Equines and other equine health and welfare initiatives.
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.
- Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions and:
- Actively promoting the development of and adherence to competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

The standard by which conduct, or treatment will be measured is that which a person who is informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and competition procedures would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

Per Article A801, every entry at an EC sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person(s) responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC sanctioned competition to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.

Pony Club General Information

Canadian Pony Club tests are being offered for regional members of the Canadian Pony Club. Tests for CPC members will be CPC Entry, CPC Starter and CPC Pre-Training, EC Training, EC First Level. CPC rules apply for tack / dress.

Wild Rose Show General Information

Spring into Dressage is sanctioned as an Alberta Wild Rose Competition: EC tests, Pony Club tests (CPC), WDAA tests for Western dressage, Prix Caprilli tests, flat and hack classes are being offered in the Wild Rose Show. Alberta Equestrian Federation Wild Rose sanctioned competitions are to be run in accordance with the AEF Wild Rose Rules. An AEF membership is required to show in the Wild Rose Show. Fees should be paid to AEF — www.albertaequestrian.com

Para-Dressage General Information

Para-Dressage Dispensation Certificate/Classification

- In order to compete at EC Silver/Gold competitions, para-dressage athletes must have an EC Classification Profile.

Para-dressage competitions are governed by Section E of the EC Rules. EC para-dressage national tests and/or the FEI para-dressage tests, including the FEI Introductory Test A (Grade I-V), and the FEI Introductory Test B (Grade I-V) may be used. EC para-dressage tests can be found at www.equestrian.ca/sport/para-dressage/tests. Please refer to the FEI website for FEI para-dressage tests.

- All EC para-dressage tests are held in a 20m x 40m arena.
- FEI tests for Grades I-III are held in a 20m x 40m arena.
- FEI tests for Grades IV-V compete, wherever possible, in a 20m x 60m arena.
- EC Sport Licence (Platinum, Gold, Silver, Bronze) equal to level of competition.
- Athletes of all grades, as well as horses, may compete in a maximum of four tests per day.
- Competitors who use compensating aid(s) and are competing at the EC Bronze level must have either a Para-Dressage Dispensation Certificate or an EC Classification Profile that identifies the compensating aid(s) that they are permitted to use in competition.
- Competitors with a physical or visual impairment who use compensating aid(s) and are competing at the EC Silver or Gold level must have a Para-Dressage Classification Profile.
- Para-Dressage athletes are required to submit a copy of their Para-Dressage Dispensation Certificate and/or EC Classification Profile with their entries for each show. They must be listed on the Para-Dressage Classification Master List and Para-Dressage Dispensation Master List.

Western Dressage General Information

The Western Dressage classes will be run in the Wild Rose show and run in accordance with the WDAA rules**. Should any matter not be covered by such rules, the AEF rules will apply. **The following exception shall apply regarding safety headgear: ALL competitors must wear an ASTM/SEI, BSI/BS EN or AS/NZS approved helmet while mounted. Competitors must wear appropriate western attire, including a shirt with long sleeves and collar, safety approved helmet correctly fastened, western pants with belt, and cowboy boots. Spurs, chaps, and gloves are optional. Showmanship competitors may wear either Western or English attire. Boot/shoes worn while riding anywhere on the competition grounds must have a distinguishable heel.

Westerner Park - Camping at the show. If you will be staying in an RV or trailer onsite *you must check in at the campground UPON ARRIVAL* (North Entrance of the Park) and purchase your camping pass. Available for \$26+gst a night. Any units plugged in and not showing a valid paid camping pass, will be ticketed and fined. This is enforced by Westerner Park 24/7!

ENTRY INFORMATION

- 1. **Entries** must be received by midnight, April 30, 2022 with full payment. There are two ways to enter:
 - Equestrian Entries online at www.equestrianentries.com. This allows the use of a credit card to pay for your entries. Equestrian entries does charge a fee for this service however you will also pay a lesser office fee if you choose to enter this way.
 - Mail your entries with a cheque made out to PA/ADA. Mail to Spring Into Dressage Show, Attn: Suzanne Hanley, 367 Kline Cres., Edmonton, AB T6L 6K8
 - Please note that no entries will be accepted by courier or by scan with e-transfers. Please plan accordingly!
- 2. **Western Dressage** will be run as part of the Wild Rose show and will utilize the WDAA tests, following the WDAA rules**. Any matters not covered by the WDAA rules or in question, will follow the AEF rules.

 ** EXCEPTION: SAFETY APPROVED PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR MUST BE WORN BY ALL COMPETITORS WITH NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 3. **Para-Equestrians** will use the EC para-dressage national tests and/or the FEI para-dressage tests, including the FEI Introductory Test A (Grade I-V), and the FEI Introductory Test B (Grade I-V). Riders are to indicate their level and test of choice on the entry form.
- 4. Canadian horses competing in Gold classes are required to hold an EC Horse Recording and have paid the EC Horse Recording annual Activation Fee to compete, or if owned by a temporary sport license holder, a Temporary Horse Registration form must be purchased at each competition entered. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit. (See A602.4).
- 5. Horses competing only in the Wild Rose classes do not require a horse recording.
- 6. Both the rider (athlete) and the owner require an Equestrian Canada Gold license or a one-time upgrade from a Bronze (or Silver) or a Temporary Sport License to compete in the Gold Show. Upgrades and temporary sport licenses will be available in the show office. An AEF membership is required for the rider and must be purchased before an EC Gold sport license can be purchased.
- 7. Riders competing only in the Wild Rose classes do not require EC sport licenses for the rider and the owner. They do require an AEF membership.
- 8. "All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations: All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within 7 days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be asked to leave the event site at the discretion of Competition Management."
- 9. Entries will be processed in the order in which they are received. The show committee reserves the right to limit and/or refuse entries.
- 10. Riders may pay one administration fee and enter both Gold and Wild Rose Classes
- 11. Entries in the Gold show must pay a mandatory DC levy of \$10 and an EC drug fee of \$7.
- 12. Entries in the Gold show may be selected for equine medication control testing. (A602.5). Any horse entered in any class at a Gold competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location.
- 13. Late entries will be accepted only if space permits and at the show secretary's discretion. Entries accepted after April 30, 2022 will be charged a \$50.00 late fee.
- 14. Post entries to fill scratches will be allowed if scheduling permits. To be eligible for post entry, the horse/rider must already be registered in the show as either a competing or non-competing horse. Please come to the show office to inquire about post entries.
- 15. All entries must have the signature of the owner or authorized agent and a signature for the person(s) responsible for the horse. Riders will not be allowed to compete without a signature from a person(s) responsible.

- 16. Junior riders must have permission to participate in the show as indicated by the signature of a parent or guardian.
- 17. Hors Concours entries will be accepted with full fees into either the Gold or Wild Rose shows. Entrants are subject to EC rules for the Gold shows and AEF rules for the Wild Rose shows. Hors Concours entries are not eligible for ribbons or awards.
- 18. Non-competing (schooling horses) will be accepted into the Wild Rose Show. Entries must pay the administration fee, a non-competing horse fee and stabling or haul-in fee.
- 19. Cancellations prior to the closing date will have all fees less the Administration fee refunded
- 20. <u>Cancellations</u> after the closing date and prior to Thursday, May12 at 1pm before the show will have the stabling, EC fees and class fees refunded. The administration fee will not be refunded. Cancellations after this date must provide a vet certificate or medical doctor note to receive a refund of stabling, EC fees and 50% of class fees.
- 21. Horse substitutions are allowed until one hour before the first class the horse is competing in.
- 22. **All athletes of the Spring Into Dressage show**, regardless of age or level of competition, must always wear properly fitted and fastened safety approved protective headgear when mounted at any EC-sanctioned dressage competition. (E.4.0). *This extends to all classes offered at the show.*
- 23. Wild Rose Introductory, Training level, Western Dressage Intro and Basic level, Rail Classes and Fun Classes may be scheduled in the 20x40 covered outdoor dressage arena. Depending on scheduling needs, Gold introductory and Training level may also be scheduled in the 20x40 outdoor dressage arena. All other tests will be scheduled in the 20x60 indoor dressage arena.
- 24. Entry numbers must always be worn and visible in the schooling area as well as in the competition rings. Horses are to wear halter numbers when out of their stalls for i.d. purposes.
- 25. Stabling is optional for competitors of the Spring Into Dressage show. The stabling fee includes free choice shavings provided by the show. The stabling is not available until 11:00am on the day before the show (move in day). Please do not plan your arrival before this time. There is ample room for trailer parking and tying to trailers however all parking is on pavement.. Horses that do not require a stall must pay the haul in fee.
- 26. Power hookups are available per night and must be booked through the Westerner Park Campground. Plugged in trailers and campers will be fined if a valid parking pass is not displayed on your unit. This is fully enforced by Westerner Park.
- 27. Horses must leave the show grounds within 2 hours of classes ending on Sunday. Any arrangements to stay extra time must be made in advance with the show office.
- 28. Warm up in the show rings will be allowed on move in day from 3:00pm until 8:00pm, unless there are classes scheduled in the outdoor 20 x 40 ring on Friday evening, in which case the indoor show ring will be available for warm up. Horses that are not stabled on the grounds may also haul in on move in day and school in the show rings. Schooling in the show rings is not allowed on show days.
- 29. Lunging will be allowed in a dedicated area outdoors.
- 30. The warmup areas are open during the show and schooling times & one hour before the show starts each day.
- 31. Show correspondence will be handled through email and Fox Village. Ride times will be posted on the Fox Village website once they are ready and an email will be sent to riders and owners once times are posted. Ride times will also be posted at the show office and in the barns. Riders are responsible for checking the day sheets as ride times may change. Please provide a correct email on your entry form!
- 32. Volunteering at the show is requested and for PA/ADA members, will count towards volunteer time for the PA/ADA Education Subsidies Program. To keep costs low, we rely on volunteers to assist with ring set-up, tear-down, gate keeping and running of dressage tests to the show office. If a barn wishes to come early and help with ring set up, or stay late and help with tear down, they may contact the show secretary. The dressage arena will arrive at 12 noon on move in day and on tear down day the trailer will be brought in and the rings are to be wiped down and loaded up. Set-up and tear down both go very quickly with lots of people! During the show volunteer times will be scheduled for 1½ hours. Please indicate your volunteer preferences on the attached form. Thank you for volunteering!

PRIZES AND AWARDS

- 1. Any horse receiving less than 50% of the total points obtainable in a test shall not be eligible for awards, ribbons or prizes (E9.10.7)
- 2. Gold Show: When there is only one horse in a class, ribbons and prizes shall be awarded in accordance with the following chart of percentages:
 - $1^{st} = 60\%$ or higher, $2^{nd} = 57\%$ to 59.9%, $3^{rd} = 54\%$ to 56.9%, $4^{th} = 51\%$ to 53.9%, No ribbons or prizes shall be awarded below 4^{th} position (E9.9.10)
- 3. Class ribbons and show championship ribbons will be distributed at the show office. Class ribbons will be awarded to 5th place by category of rider (Amateur, Junior, Open) if entries warrant. Organizing committee reserves the right to combine classes.
- 4. All Wild Rose classes, which includes Iron Horse classes, are not rated for EC awards.
- 5. There will be show championships awarded at the end of the show. The average of all tests ridden will be used to determine the Champion and Reserve Champion and at least two tests must be ridden to be eligible for championships. In the event of a tie, the competitor with the highest single percentage score will be declared the winner. Freestyle scores will not count toward championships.
 - ⇒ Championships to be awarded if entries warrant:
 - Junior Champion & Reserve, Gold (average all tests training and above)
 - Junior Champion & Reserve Wild Rose (average all tests training and above)
 - Adult Amateur Champion & Reserve, Gold (average all tests training and above)
 - Adult Amateur Champion & Reserve, Wild Rose (average all tests training and above)
 - Open Champion & Reserve, Gold (average all tests)
 - Open Champion & Reserve, Wild Rose (average all tests)
 - Introductory Champion & Reserve, Gold (average all introductory tests; Jr, AA to be combined)
 - Introductory Champion & Reserve, Wild Rose (average all introductory tests; Jr, AA to be combined)
 - Pony Club Champion & Reserve, Wild Rose (may be split by ages if entries warrant)

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS & RULES

Prix Caprilli (Iron Horse) – A Prix Caprilli is a dressage test with jumps in it. Three Prix Caprilli courses will be set. One test for the novice jumpers will be cross rails – pattern Prix Caprilli #1. The second course for the more experienced riders will be set up to 2' – pattern Prix Caprilli #2. The third course for advanced riders will be set up to 2'6" - pattern Prix Caprilli #3. Iron Horse points assigned based on placing and percentages. Ribbons to 6th place.

Wild Rose Flat (Rail) Classes

Novice Pleasure (English or Western, Walk/Trot) – To be shown at walk and trot/jog, not to canter/lope. Judged 50% on performance, 40% on manners and 10% on conformation. Restricted to riders who have not won 3 first places.

Novice Equitation (English or Western, Walk/Trot) – To be shown at walk and trot/jog, not to canter/lope. Judged 40% on rider's position and seat, 40% on rider's correct and effective use of the aids and 20% on harmony between horse and rider. Restricted to riders who have not won 3 first places.

Lead Line Child Equitation (English or Western, Walk/Trot) – To be shown at walk and trot/jog, not to canter/lope. Judged 40% on rider's position and seat, 40% on rider's correct and effective use of the aids and 20% on harmony between horse and rider. Restricted to riders who have not reached their 10th birthday on the date of the show. Rider must be accompanied by a leader over the age of 18.

English Pleasure – To be shown at walk, trot and canter, not to gallop. Judged 50% on performance, 40% on manners and 10% on conformation.

Western Pleasure – To be shown at walk, jog and lope. Judged 50% on performance, 40% on manners and 10% on conformation.

Equitation – To be shown at walk, trot and canter, not to gallop. Judged 40% on rider's position and seat. 40% on rider's correct and effective use of the aids and 20% on harmony between horse and rider. Rider may show in English or Western tack. Bitless bridles are acceptable.

Road Hack – To be shown at walk, trot, strong trot, easy canter and hand gallop. Maximum of 6 horses to gallop at once. Judged 55% on performance, 20% on quality, 15% on conformation and 10% on manners.

Show Hack – To be shown at walk, trot, extended trot, canter and extended canter. Maximum of 6 horses to extend the canter at once. Judged 55% on performance, 20% on quality, 15% on conformation and 10% on manners.

Wild Rose Fun Classes


Costume (Iron Horse) – To be shown at walk and trot only.. Judges 30% on performance, 10% on manners and 60% on the costume. Rider may show in English or Western tack. Bitless bridles are acceptable. Ribbons to 5^{th} place. Iron Horse placings to 6^{th} .

Champagne (Iron Horse) – Riders will be given a glass of "champagne" which they must carry throughout their class. They will be shown at walk, trot and canter, not to gallop. Riders may ride with one or two hands. Rider may show in English or Western tack. Bitless bridles are acceptable. At the end of the class the rider with the greatest amount of "champagne" will be the winter. Ribbons to 5th place. Iron Horse placings to 6th place. In case of a tie in the Iron Horse placings the Champagne class will be the tie breaker.
