Division & Championship Awards

Intro Open, Intro Junior, Intro Novice Horse, Intro Novice Rider, Intro Adult Amateur, Training Level Novice Horse, Training Level Novice Rider, Training Level Junior, Training Level Open, Training Level Adult Amateur, First Level Open, Second Level Open, Third Level Open, Fourth Level and Above, Open Equitation, Musical Freestyle, Western Dressage Intro Open, Western Dressage Intro AA/ Junior, Western Dressage Basic Open, Western Dressage Basic AA/ Junior, Western Dressage Level One Open, Western Dressage Level Two Open, Western Dressage Level Three Open, Western Dressage Level Four Open

Up to 6 Ribbons will be presented per class at each show. Champion and Reserve awards for all divisions. To be eligible for year-end awards, the same horse and rider must compete as the same combination, and attend a minimum of six shows. Each day counts as one show, meaning you must attend six days of showing to be considered for year end awards.

Division Qualifications

- Novice Rider: Rider is in the 1st or 2nd year of showing at any dressage show and may show only in this class for 2 years maximum, on any horse.
- Novice Horse: Horse, with any rider, is in the 1st or 2nd year of showing at any dressage show and may show only in this class for 2 years maximum.
- Junior Rider: Riders 18 and under as of January 1 of the current show year.
- Adult Amateur: Riders 19 and over. Amateur refers to riders that obtain NO income from riding, training or teaching.
- Open: Any age and professional.
- Leadline: Open to any age rider.
- Eventing Test of Choice: Riders may choose between Beginner Novice Tests A or B, Novice Test A or B, and Training Test A or B. Classes will be split by test, if enough entries. Please indicate your division on the entry form.
- Open Classes: Classes will be split by AA, JR, Open, if enough entries. Please specify the Division you plan to ride on your entry form.
- Test of Choice Classes: Classes will be split by test, or even AA, JR, Open if there are enough entries.

Please specify the Level, Test, and Division you plan to ride on your entry form. Classes may be entered up to 3 times with the same horse/rider combination. Each ride must be ridden with a different test following USEF/USDF rules regarding showing consecutive levels.

PLEASE INDICATE YOUR DIVISION AND CLASS DESCRIPTION (LEVEL AND TEST NUMBER) ON ENTRY FORM; FAILURE TO DO SO WILL RESULT IN BEING PLACED IN OPEN IF CLASSES ARE SPLIT.

RULES & REGULATIONS

The Wyn Farm Horse Show Management or "Management" reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of an incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules/Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management, their decision to be final.

The Horse Show Management reserves the right to limit entries, refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without claim for damages; to cancel or combine any classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or judges; to change specifications in dressage classes in order to facilitate the time schedule or as competition warrants, or make any changes management deems is in the best interests of the show.

Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show, its members, directors and employees, sponsoring entities, and facility harmless for any loss or accident to his horse, horses or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire, negligence or otherwise.

USDF/USEF Rules apply. Open to ALL Breeds

Shows start at 9:00AM, but subject to change, please review ride times. Changes in ride times may be made by show management after the closing date and publications of ride times. Ride times available Thursday before the show at wynfarm.com around noon. Check posted ride times at www.wynfarm.com or at the show office for official times.

Multiple riders are permitted to show one horse, but not to exceed a total of 4 tests per horse/rider combination or 4 tests total per horse/two riders per day. Feature class not to count. Each horse can be ridden in 2 consecutive levels.

EMT on grounds during show hours.

Concessions will be on site pending Management approval.

Tests are the current USDF, USEA, or WDAA Tests. Horses may be entered in two consecutive levels only. Riders may have all tests read. WFDSS test scores may be submitted for ADA, MDA, WDAA and TIP year-end awards by ADA, MDA, WDAA or TIP members.

Sale horse or stallion service advertisement: \$10 per horse per weekend fee to announce small 1-2 sentence description including horse's name, age, gender, breed, and contact information if interested. This description will be announced following the announcement of horse and rider entering the ring. Announced during each test over the weekend.

Coggins: No entry will be accepted without a photocopy of a negative Coggins test for each horse brought to the show grounds, with horse's name matching entry forms. A photocopy of a negative Coggins test dated within 12 months of the closing date of entered show must be submitted with each entry form. Entries submitted without a negative coggins test will not be accepted.

Stall Fees: Stall fees are \$90.00 per stall for the weekend. Stalls available after 3pm on Friday. Horses staying both nights will be given preference over single nights. Reservations are accepted on a "first pay, first served basis". Stalls will not be reserved without a check! Non-Showing horses will be charged an additional \$30.00 per day. Stabling consists of at least 10x10 permanent stalls with stall gates or 12x12 wood and steel bar stalls. First bedding is not provided, but shavings are available upon request (\$8/bag or \$9 day of). Stalls will be available at 3pm on Friday. **STALLIONS MUST BE STALLED.** Stalls after the closing date are non refundable in any circumstance.

Horses Showing out of Trailers: There will be a \$20.00 per day per horse tie to trailer fee for horses showing out of trailers. Horses wishing to school on Friday must pay an additional haul in fee per horse.

Campers: Camper Fee \$25.00 per weekend. No Electric or water hook up. May bring generators.

Entries: Entries must be submitted via online form, found at <https://eqentries.com>. Entries close at 6 PM 2 WEEKS PRIOR TO THE SHOW. Payment can be submitted online through EqEntries, or with a check sent to Wyn Farm, postmarked by the closing date. You will be charged for all fees after this time. There will be a \$25.00 blanket post entry fee per entry after this time. No entries will be taken over the phone. All entry forms must be completely filled out and signed. Checks should be made payable to WYN FARM LLC. All Entry Fees are non refundable after the closing date. There will be a service fee of \$40 for any non-negotiable checks. NO CLASS CHANGES WILL BE MADE AFTER THE CLOSING DATE UNLESS DUE TO SHOW MANAGEMENT ERROR. Please make sure all final submissions are correct!

Protective Headgear: All riders must wear an ASTM/SEI approved riding helmet while mounted anywhere on the show grounds (Professionals included). Any rider violating this rule will be immediately prohibited from further riding until the headgear is properly in place. Wyn Farm LLC makes no representation or warranty, expressed or implied, about any protective headgear, and cautions riders that serious injury may result despite wearing protective headgear as all equestrian sports involve an intrinsic element of risk.

Schooling: Schooling will be available any show rings starting on Friday after 3pm until ½ hour prior to commencement on the day of the show. Management reserves the right to limit schooling in the show rings as needed. Lunging is only permitted in designated areas; prohibited on grass and in show arenas

Rings: All weather footing Main Ring: 300' x 285' Schooling Ring: 180' x 90'. USDF Introductory, USDF Training Level tests 1 and 2, WDA Introductory, WDA Basic, and all USEA Eventing tests are to be run in a 20x40m (small) arena. All other tests (USDF Training Level Test 3, First Level and above, and WDA Level 1 and above) will be run in a 20x60m (standard) arena.

Scratches: After the closing date, cancellations for any reason are charged all fees.

Dogs: All DOGS must be leashed. Dogs must be leashed at ALL TIMES while on the show grounds, (including handheld dogs). No dogs will be allowed in any schooling area or show ring or in the secretary office. Management reserves the right to ask a dog to leave the property.

Smoking: Smoking is ONLY allowed in designated smoking areas. Butts must be disposed of in provided containers.

Attire: All riders MUST wear approved ASTM helmets while mounted. Boots with a heel, shirt/jacket with collar and sleeves required. Riders in Intro may show in a polo shirt with a collared neck and half chaps. Western dressage riders must wear show attire, but chaps are optional.

Awards: Up to 6 ribbons per class will be presented at each show. Champion and Reserve awards for all divisions, 3 entries per division must compete for championships to be awarded, divisions may be combined or split at management discretion. Championships will be awarded based on average rider percentages. Divisions may be combined. Upon completion of the show, prize money will be mailed within 30 days or awarded at Sunday checkout.

High Point Trainer Award: Awards to be presented at the year-end awards banquet. Points will be counted based on combined rider percentages. The trainer must use the same trainer name at each of the shows. Please make sure all entry forms declare trainer name prior to the start of the show, no late acceptances. Forms that do not declare trainer name WILL NOT COUNT towards this award.

Annual Perpetual Trophies

Rising Star Award, Sponsored by: Chandra Nielson Riding and competition with horses isn't just about the awards, but the journey it takes. Riding dressage is about the improvement of harmony and lightness between horse and rider. The Rising Star Award is given to the rider/horse combo that improves their score in the same level and test the most from the beginning of the year to the end of the season.

Silver Rider Award, Sponsored by: Wyn Farm This award recognizes those riders who understand that riding is a lifelong endeavor and seek continuous improvement. Every time we put our foot in the stirrup we are taking a risk, those risks become greater as we grow older but our over 50 riders are the bravest of the brave as they continue to face their fears and accomplish their equestrian goals. Highest average percentage for riders age 50 and above, can only be awarded once per horse/rider combination.

Supercalifragilistic Award, Sponsored by: Silver Fox Equestrian Center Supercalifragilistic Award recognizes the oldest dressage horse who has competed in the Wyn Farm Dressage Series. These horses are incredibly special as they are the true school masters and have years of experience behind them, and have so much to give to all riders alike. Horse may perform a test of any level, and is open to Western Dressage horses as well. This award is in honor of Monte Poppins and Hideaway's Erin Prophet.

Salute to Excellence, Sponsored by: Spectrum Horse Services LLC This award recognizes the amateur rider who strives for self growth in classical dressage. Overall high point Amateur rider 1st Level and Up.

The Professor Cup, Sponsored by: Silver Fox Equestrian This award is given to the lesson horse with the highest average percentage showing at any level and any discipline. Anyone who has learned to ride can think back to a special horse who taught them the basics with unending patience and unwavering love. They are kind enough and wise enough to know what you're asking for even when you ask them entirely wrong. Lesson horses are responsible for helping us grow into the riders we are today, and for that we wish to recognize them.

Shiloh Training Center Harmony Award, Sponsored by: Shiloh Training Center The purpose of the Shiloh Training Center Harmony Award is to recognize and reward sensitive, caring empathy and harmony between horse and rider. During the show day, judges may nominate individuals for this award when they are impressed by kindness, trust, and sensitivity in the arena. The judge may be impressed by a rider throughout their test, or an incident may happen during the test in which the rider handled it more for the benefit of their horse's confidence than for their own score. We are looking to reward "putting the horse first" as we develop confidence-building, trust, and a very happy equine partner! The Shiloh Training Center Harmony Award Trophy will be presented to the individual who receives the most nominations from the Wyn Farm judges throughout the summer. As it is a true honor to receive a nomination by a judge for impressive harmony, all nominees who did not win the trophy will receive recognition at the year end banquet!

Circuit Championship

Awards to be presented at the year-end awards banquet. Champion and reserve awarded in Intro Open, Intro Junior, Intro Adult Amateur, Intro Novice Horse, Intro Novice Rider, Training Level Novice Horse, Training Level Novice Rider, Training Level Junior, Training Level Adult Amateur, Training Level Open, First Level Open, Second Level Open, Third Level Open, Fourth Level and Above Open, High Point Equitation Open, Musical Freestyle Open, Western Dressage Intro JR/AA, Western Dressage Intro Open, Western Dressage Basic JR/AA, Western Dressage Basic Open, Western Dressage Level 1 Open, Western Dressage Level 2 Open, Western Dressage Level 3 Open, Western Dressage Level 4 Open. Awards will be based on the highest score under at least 3 judges in a division. Riders must attend at least 6 of the 10 shows to qualify. Each day is considered a show. In order to receive points towards year-end awards the rider must use the same name at each of the shows. The points follow each horse and rider combination. Awards through 6th place.

Special Classes Rules and Regulations:

- **English and Western Musical Freestyles**
 - The Musical Freestyle class will be judged following the USDF guidelines for Training Level through Fourth Level, and the WDAA guidelines for Intro through Level 4. The performance should clearly show the unity between rider and horse as well as harmony in all the movements and transitions. It is an open class, so that all levels of riders and all test levels will be combined for placings. A sound system will be available. Please have your music selections available as a MP3 on a device that can be plugged in using an auxiliary cord or a USB thumb drive, with a backup copy on a CD.
 - To be considered for year end awards, horse/rider combinations must earn at least two musical freestyle scores at the same level under two different judges. Both scores must be at least 60%. Awards will be determined by the highest average of the two combined scores, and all levels will be combined for placings.
 - **English and Western Equitation Classes:**
 - Open to all Adult Amateur, Junior, and Open riders. Riders will be judged on hands, seat, aids, performance of the horse, and harmony between horse and rider. The class is offered as Walk/Trot (Jog) or Walk/ Trot (Jog)/ Canter (Lope) and will be performed on the rail, and will show the gaits in both directions. Horses should back easily and stand quietly.
 - A horse/rider combination is eligible for Walk/Trot English Dressage Equitation if they are not competing in above the Intro Level at the individual competition. A horse/rider combination is eligible for Walk/Jog Western Dressage Equitation if they are not competing in Western Dressage above the Intro Level at the individual competition.
