General Show information:

Entries are payable by PayPal (convenience fee applies), Venmo and check – please make checks payable to Aly Rattazzi

Returned Checks: a \$25 fee will be charged to any competitor whose check is returned.

For entries to be complete: Make sure you have signed the Five Points Farm and GDCTA release forms. Proof of a negative Coggins test required. Payment may be made by check, PayPal or Venmo.

Refunds: No refunds after closing.

This Show will be run in the spirit of the USEF Rules for Dressage, Eventing, and Jumpers. They are available at www.USEF.org. Knowledge of these rules is the responsibility of the rider, owner, trainer, and parent/guardian.

2022 Western Dressage Tests, 2022 Eventing Tests, and 2023 USDF Tests will be used.

No stalls available.

Show office will be open one hour before the first dressage ride. Jumping courses will be posted and are available to be walked up until start time for the first horses on course.

Special Requirements: Jackets are not required. Half chaps with paddock boots are permitted. Competitors should wear neat, conservative riding attire, appropriate for the weather conditions. Horses must wear bridle numbers when on the grounds day of show. Braiding is optional. All dressage tests through second level require snaffle bits. Whips must be 47.2 inches or less in length including the lash. All riders are responsible for knowing the USEF rules. Lunging is prohibited in the warmup area.

Dressage arena is in the covered arena. Stadium is in the grass.

Entry restrictions:

Jumping – a horse may be entered in a maximum of 4 jumping rounds

Dressage – a horse may be entered in a maximum of 4 dressage tests

Combined Tests – a horse may be entered in a maximum of 2 CT classes at adjacent levels

Show Jumping and New Event Horse Classes:

Pre-Amoeba (12" MAX); Amoeba (20" MAX); Starter (2'3" MAX); Beginner Novice (2'7" MAX); Novice (2'11" MAX), Training (3'3" MAX); Prelim (3'7" MAX)

New event horse classes judged on rideability, softness, temperament, and suitability.

Exceptional Rider Classes:

Exceptional Rider Division may be added upon request.

Coaching:

No coaching from the side of arena is allowed during dressage tests. Dressage tests may be called at all levels in Dressage, Western Dressage and at specified levels in combined training (Pre-Amoeba, Amoeba, and Starter).

No coaching from the side of stadium arena is allowed during Combined Training Classes. Coaching is acceptable for Jumper rounds and New Event classes.

Time Penalties:

Combined Training Show Jumping: Pre-Amoeba and Amoeba classes are timed but no time penalties are added. For all others the time penalty is .4 points per second over optimum time.

Show Schedule:

Ride times will be posted Thursday evening prior to the show.

Scheduling depends on the entries. In general, the CT dressage classes will be scheduled before dressage only classes, starting with Amoeba and going up the levels. For Show Jumping, Lead Line will be scheduled first, followed by Pre-Amoeba CT, show jumping, then new event horse. In the event of rain, the order of classes may be adjusted to allow for all classes to be held in the covered arena.

Year End:

Year-end Series Championships will be awarded for Combined Training, Dressage, Western Dressage at the October 28, 2023 show.

Horse and rider must have shown at the same level at 2 of the 4 shows in 2023 to qualify. Points accumulate based on your placings.

Waiver of Liability, assumption of risk, covenant not to sue and release and hold harmless agreement.

I, _____ have read, understand, acknowledge, and confirm, and freely and voluntarily enter into this RELEASE and hold harmless agreement with Aly Rattazzi and The Farm at Five Points and, their agents, servants, employees or officers. I fully understand and acknowledge the potential danger that I or my child/children could incur in possible injury or death to myself, my child/children, other people and/or horses by mounting, riding, walking, feeding, including but not limited to any interaction or participation with horses.

I, by signing this waiver/release agree to hold harmless, discharge, release and indemnify Aly Rattazzi and The Farm at Five Points and, their agents, servants, employees or officers, from all liability whatsoever and AGREE NOT TO SUE on account of or connection with in any way claims, causes of action, injuries, damages, costs, expenses or loss to myself, my family, my children, my horse, my property, my friends, guests and/or any others as a result of any interaction or participation of any kind equine or otherwise that takes place at Bartow County Saddle Club, or any interaction or participation with horses except in the event of wanton and willful negligence. I hereby release and relieve Aly Rattazzi and The Farm at Five Points, and all affiliated companies, partnerships, employees, representatives, heirs, successors and assign each and every member of his/her family from any liability whatsoever for any loss, claim, damage, injury or death which I, my child, horse, or any person claiming by, through or under me may suffer or sustain as a result of participation or interaction of any kind, equine or otherwise that takes place at Bartow County Saddle Club. I hereby waive any rights I may have to bring claim or suit against any said individuals arising out of any such damage, injury or death.

IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE EQUINE PARTICIPANT to carry full and complete insurance coverage on his/her horse, personal property and himself/herself. I further understand and grant permission for treatment if an emergency medical treatment is required to be transported to the closest medical facility at my expense.

I understand and agree and have accepted all rules and regulations that are currently in effect or may be established from time to time by Aly Rattazzi and The Farm at Five Points and, their agents, servants, employees, or officers. My failure to abide by such rules and regulations may result in Aly Rattazzi and the Farm at Five Points and, their agents, servants, employees, or officers prohibiting my participation in any equine related activities at Bartow County Saddle Club.

GDCTA Hold Harmless Clause

The undersigned competitor/rider and all signors below hereby (1) agrees to release the management of this show or clinic, their officers, directors, employees, members, or agents, and the owners or managers of the grounds where this event is held, from any loss, damage, liability, or injury arising out of or resulting from this show or clinic or competitors/riders participation therein; (2) agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and defend the Georgia Dressage and Combined Training Association, Inc., the organizer, facility owner, and the management of this show or clinic from and against any and all claims for loss, damage, liability, or injury, however caused, resulting directly or indirectly from competitors/riders entry or participation in this show or clinic or from acts or omissions of competitor/rider or competitor's agents; and (3) acknowledges that activities with and around horses and horse shows or clinics involve inherent risks including but not limited to substantial risk of bodily injury, death, property damage and other dangers including, but not limited to, bodily injury or death resulting from kicks and bites, falling off horse or horse(s) falling on Rider, being dragged by a foot caught in the stirrups, Rider being thrown by horse, equipment failure or collision with horse(s) or vehicles or other inanimate objects, as well as any and all risks of contracting Covid-19. In the event of injury to competitor/rider or to competitor's/rider's animals, permission is hereby granted to management for emergency medical treatment. Every entry at a Georgia Dressage and Combined Training Association, Inc. (GDCTA) recognized competition or clinic shall constitute an agreement and affirmation that all participants (which include, without limitation, the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver, handler, the horse, volunteers and staff), for themselves, their principals, representatives, employees, and agents: (1) shall be subject to the constitution and rules of the GDCTA and the local rules of the competition or clinic; (2) represent that every horse, rider, driver, and handler is eligible as entered; (3) agree to be bound by the constitution and rules of the United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) and of the competition or clinic, and will accept as final the decision of the hearing committee on any question arising under said rules, and agree to hold the competition or clinic, the GDCTA, their officials, directors and employees harmless for any action taken; (4) agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, they authorize the GDCTA and the competition or clinic management to market, transfer, assign, or otherwise make use of any photographs, likenesses, films, broadcasts, cablecasts, audiotapes, or videotapes taken of the horse(s) and participant(s) while on the grounds, incident to, or in transit between the stabling facility and the event site, in any way they see fit for the promotion, coverage, or benefit of the event, sport, or the GDCTA, without compensation to any of them, so long as the use neither jeopardizes amateur status nor endorses a specific product or service, and hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation; and (5) agree that they participate voluntarily in the competition or clinic fully aware that horse sports and the competition or clinic involve inherent dangerous risk of serious injury or death, and by participating they expressly assume any and all risks of injury or loss, and they agree to indemnify and hold harmless the GDCTA, the competition or clinic, and the officials, directors, employees, and agents from and against all claims including for any injury or loss suffered during or in connection with the competition or clinic, whether or not such claim, injury, or loss resulted, directly or indirectly, from the negligent acts or omissions of said officials, directors, employees, or agents of the GDCTA, competition or clinic. The construction and application of USEF Rules are governed by laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against USEF must be filed in New York State, see Article 1502.5.

United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. Entry Agreement

I have read the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") Entry Agreement (GR906.4) as printed in the Prize List for this Competition and agree to all of its provisions. I understand and agree that by entering this Competition, I am subject to Federation Rules, the Prize List, and local rules of the competition. I agree to waive the right to the use of my photos at the competition, and agree that any actions against the Federation must be brought in New York State.

Release, Assumption of Risk, Waiver and Indemnification

This document waives important legal rights. Read it carefully before signing.

I AGREE in consideration for my participation in this Competition to the following:

I AGREE that the "Federation" and "Competition" as used above includes all of their officials, officers, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers, and affiliated organizations.

I AGREE that I choose to participate voluntarily in the Competition with my horse, as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, trainer, or as parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor. I am fully aware and acknowledge that horse sports and the Competition involve inherent dangerous risks of accident, loss, and serious bodily injury including broken bones, head injuries, trauma, pain, suffering, or death ("Harm").

I AGREE to hold harmless and release the Federation and the Competition from all claims for money damages or otherwise for any Harm to me or my horse and for any Harm of any nature caused by me or my horse to others, even if the Harm arises or results, directly or indirectly, from the negligence of the Federation or the Competition.

I AGREE to expressly assume all risks of Harm to me or my horse, including Harm resulting from the negligence of the Federation or the Competition.

I AGREE to indemnify (that is, to pay any losses, damages, or costs incurred by) the Federation and the Competition and to hold them harmless with respect to claims for Harm to me or my horse, and for claims made by others for any Harm caused by me or my horse while at the Competition.

I have read the Federation Rules about protective equipment, including GR801 and, if applicable, EV114 and I understand that I am entitled to wear protective equipment without penalty, and I acknowledge that the Federation strongly encourages me to do so while WARNING that no protective equipment can guard against all injuries.

If I am a parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor, I consent to the child's participation and AGREE to all of the above provisions and AGREE to assume all of the obligations of this Release on the child's behalf.

I represent that I have the requisite training, coaching and abilities to safely compete in this competition.
