### Pre-entries close midnight May 31, 2023 ALL FEES MUST BE PAID IN U.S. FUNDS

### **CLOSE OF ENTRIES/POST ENTRIES:**

- Entries whose qualifications were earned <u>before</u> the close-of entry-date must be postmarked by May 31st to be eligible for the early entry fees. Enclose the qualification form with your entry.
- Entries who qualify <u>on or after</u> the close-of-entry date may enter until 6:00 P.M. on Thursday, June 15<sup>th</sup> for the SHIH Classes and until 6:00 P.M. on Friday, June 16<sup>th</sup> for all remaining classes. Entry fees will be at the pre-entry fee and will be limited to time slots allowed in the schedule. Available time slots for late qualifying horses will be filled on a first come, first assigned basis.
- Entries for horses qualifying after the May 31st deadline must be either <u>received</u> by the show secretary no later than June 9th or hand delivered to the show office up until 6:00 P.M. Thursday June 15th.
- Exhibitors with questions on the best method to enter late qualifying horses are encouraged and welcomed to email the show secretary.
- Exhibitors are highly encouraged to enter classes through the online system, Equestrian Entries at <u>www.equestrianentries.com</u> prior to or on the initial closing date.

Covid-19:	<ul> <li>All state, federal and local COVID-19, including USEF obligations, CDC recommendations and Wisconsin State Department of Health requirements shall be enforced during set-up, tear-down, and during the duration of the Show. Qualifications:	• Submit the separate qualification record form to list where and when the entry was qualified for each regional championship class being entered. You may use the Region 10 form on the website or submit a printed Qualification Record from the AHA website with your classes clearly marked on the form.
Open/Close Entries:	<ul> <li>Pre-entries close May 31st (online entries completed on or before; mailed entries postmarked on or before)</li> <li>Entries accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis. Supporting documents such as copies of registration papers, card, vaccination records may be emailed to the show secretary if not included with mailed entries or online entries.</li> </ul>
On-line entries – preferred method:	<ul> <li>Equestrian Entries - <u>www.equestrianentries.com</u></li> <li>Create a member login at no charge.</li> <li>To pay online and submit your entry instantaneously, there is a 5% non-refundable, online processing fee.</li> <li>Print and save submitted entry</li> </ul>
Mailed Entries:	• U.S. Government postmark dates will be used for mailed entries. Metered postmarks are not acceptable.
Post Entries/Scratched Time Slots:	<ul> <li>A finite number of time slots will be available for Dressage, Western Dressage, and Sport Horse In-Hand classes.</li> <li>First priority for open time slots goes to late qualifying horses. Entry fee the same as pre-entered horses.</li> <li>Second priority for open time slots goes to horses entered by May 31<sup>st</sup> who were eligible to enter an additional class by the pre-entry date but did not do so with their original entry. Post entry fee required.</li> <li>Third priority goes to horses that were qualified but not entered into the show until after the closing date of entries. The post entry fee applies.</li> </ul>
Payment:	<ul> <li>US Funds Only</li> <li>All pre-entries and stall reservations must be either paid for through the online entry system or by a fully negotiable check included with the entry.</li> <li>Non-negotiable funds will incur a \$50 penalty per presentation.</li> </ul>
<b>Registration Papers:</b>	• A copy of the registration papers, showing ownership, must be presented.

USEF Membership & Fees:	<ul> <li>A current membership with a competition card must be presented at check-in for each owner, rider, handler, trainer.</li> <li>A \$23 Federation Fee will be collected &amp; remitted to USEF, or every horse entered in the competition. (\$15 D&amp;M + \$8).</li> </ul>
AHA Membership & Fees:	<ul> <li>Current AHA membership with a competition card is required for each owner, rider, handler, and trainer. A non-member fee NOT allowed at regional level.</li> <li>9-90 fee of \$20 required per horse</li> <li>Post competition fee of \$5 per horse</li> </ul>
WDAA Membership Requirements:	<ul> <li>To be eligible to participate and/or compete as an exhibitor, owner, lessee, agent, coach, or trainer in any Western Dressage class or at any Western Dressage Federation Licensed Competition persons must be active members of WDAA or pay a non-member fee equal to the price of an annual membership for each competition.</li> <li>Adult non-member fee \$45</li> <li>Junior non-member fee \$30</li> </ul>
Signatures:	<ul> <li>Signatures are required for each owner, rider, driver, handler, coach whose name appears on the entry form.</li> <li>If an exhibitor is under the age of 19, his/her parent or guardian, or if not available, trainer, must sign the entry blank on the minor's behalf.</li> </ul>
Confirmation of Entry:	• Confirmation of entry will be e-mailed to the rider. Please make sure all e-mail addresses are clearly printed. Make sure you turn off your spam filter for Fox Village or check your spam folder if confirmation does not arrive as expected.
Coggins – negative test required:	<ul> <li>BRING THE ORIGINAL COGGINS ON THE DAY OF THE SHOW!! Wisconsin requires a negative COGGINS TEST, dated within the current calendar year.</li> <li>Original report form or a health certificate with date of Coggins test must be presented prior to horse being unloaded at the show. Coggins must be legible.</li> <li>The State of Wisconsin requires a health certificate for all horses entering the state. For clarification, use horse's registered name on the Coggins test and not his stable name. Include photocopy with entry form.</li> </ul>
Equine Influenza & Herpes Virus Vaccine Documentation:	<ul> <li>Documentation of administration within 6 months of stable entry date for the Equine Influenza &amp; Herpes Virus vaccines must be sent in with entry form.</li> <li>A copy will also need to be presented and left in the Show Office if not sent in with entry form.</li> <li>Horses will not be allowed off trailers without proper documentation.</li> </ul>
Refusal of Entry:	• An individual who owes money to Region 10 from past non-negotiable checks will have their entry refused unless compete restitution, including fees.
Cancellation or Substitution of Entries, including Refund Policy:	<ul> <li>Exhibitors cancelling their entries for any reason after the official entry closing date shall forfeit office fees.</li> <li>No substitution of horses will be permitted.</li> <li>Fee refunds will be made only with the presentation of an acceptable veterinarian or doctor's certificate which must be on file with the Show Secretary by the end of the Show.</li> <li>Once a horse is on the grounds, the entry fee refund will only be made with the presentation of an acceptable veterinarian, or a doctor's certificate.</li> <li>Stall refunds will be made at the discretion of Show Management.</li> </ul>
No Shows:	<ul> <li>If you are unable to compete or choose to scratch, notify the secretary as soon as possible in advance of your assigned ride time or in-hand time. All "no shows" who do not show up for an assigned ride time or sport horse in-hand time will be considered a 'scratch' for the rest of the show and the time slots may be filled. Exhibitors enter with this understanding and agreement.</li> </ul>

Important information!!!	Please read carefully!!
Stabling:	<ul> <li>All horses entered must have an individual stall.</li> <li>Horses that are on the grounds but not entered in the Region 10 Championship Show must have a paid stall and paid office fee. These horses will be issued a non-competing number that must be displayed on the horse whenever it is out of the stall. These non-competing horses cannot be exercised or ridden during competition hours in the official warm-up areas or competition rings</li> <li>We are using Barns C and D. Box/tack stalls have doors and are 9'7" x9'7" in size. Footing is a sand/gravel mix.</li> <li>Tack stalls may be limited if entries warrant.</li> <li>Stall cleaning deposit will be returned after the barn manager/show manager has checked the stall and found it cleaned.</li> <li>Region 10 Patrons will have first choice of stabling location.</li> </ul>
Awards – Championship Classes:	<ul> <li>Champion: award choice, flower garland</li> <li>Reserve: flower garland</li> <li>Top 5 (remainder) Top 5 ribbon</li> <li>Top Five Awards will be made regardless of the number of entries in a class. However, only awards made to the top 50% of the class (rounded up and not to exceed 5 awards) will receive Arabian Breeders Sweepstakes payout, AHA Horse Achievement Award, Amateur Achievement Award (Adult and Youth), and High Point Horse and High Point Amateur Achievement Award points.</li> <li>Presentation of awards will be spaced throughout both days of the show. Additional details will be posted and announced during the show days.</li> </ul>
Region 10 All Around Sport Horse & Dressage Champion	<ul> <li>Two awards will be given, one to the Purebred Champion and one to the Half-Arabian Champion.</li> <li>To qualify, you must enter and complete at least one sport horse in-hand class, one sport horse under saddle class, and one dressage class (traditional or western).</li> <li>The scores from all three classes will be combined and the highest total score of Purebred and Half-Arabian will be awarded All Around Championship Garlands.</li> <li>If you enter more than one of any of the three types of classes, the highest score will count towards the combined score.</li> <li>You do not need to sign-up as scores will automatically be tracked. Winners will be announced towards the end of the day on Sunday.</li> <li>Presentation of awards will be spaced throughout both days of the show. Additional details will be posted and announced during the show days.</li> </ul>
Camping Fees:	<ul> <li>\$40/night. All camping is to be arranged with the show office and can be paid on your entry form.</li> <li>Camping area Lot #2 is the ONLY camping area available for use. Electrical poles have 30 and 50-amp connections. An expansion to the lot may be completed by the time of the show. There are no water hook-ups.</li> <li>There is an on-site dumping station, check in the show office for availability.</li> <li>There are also shower facilities.</li> </ul>
TBA Classes:	<ul> <li>A limited number of TBA class time slots are available, and only for the divisions offered at the show. The cost to add the class is \$150 plus the class entry fee. If there are four or more entries in the new class, \$135 of the TBA fee will be refunded.</li> <li>Requests for TBA classes must be received by the pre-entry deadline.</li> </ul>

Pets:	• All dogs or pets must be held on a leash of less than six (6) feet in length or otherwise restrained. Waste must be cleaned up and deposited in a trash receptacle.
Food:	• Per GR1216.4, Food will be provided on the show grounds with limited hours. Potable water will be available for the entire duration of each competition day beginning one hour prior to the start of the first class, and ending at the completion of the competition each day.
Show Office Hours:	• Open one hour before start of first class until one hour after last class of the day
Farrier:	<ul> <li>On-call.</li> <li>Contact info will be posted at the Show Office and in the barns.</li> <li>Katy Holcomb / KT Horseshoeing, LLC – (262) 758-9400</li> </ul>
Emergency Medical:	• Jeff Hooyman, Kaukauna, WI – See show office for details.
Veterinarian:	<ul> <li>On call.</li> <li>Contact info for after show hours emergencies will be posted at the Show Office, and in the barns.</li> <li>Great Lakes Equine (920) 779-4444 / <u>https://glequine.com/</u></li> </ul>
SafeSport:	<ul> <li>All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.</li> </ul>
Competition & Warm-up Arenas:	<ul> <li>Covered area 150' x 220', sand footing</li> <li>150' x 80' attached warm-up ring, sand footing</li> <li>Outdoor 150' 220' area with 80'x150' holding pen; sand footing</li> </ul>
Parking:	<ul> <li>We have contracted to use parking areas #2, #3, and #4.</li> <li>Parking is not allowed along roadways that are posted as such; violators may be cited by the Oshkosh Police Department.</li> <li>No parking in the manure pit area or in fire lanes.</li> </ul>
Stallions:	<ul> <li>Stallions may be shown by ladies and junior exhibitors in all under saddle classes.</li> <li>Junior exhibitors must be 15 years of age or older to show stallions in-hand.</li> <li>Half-Arabian/Anglo-Arabian stallions two years and over may compete in any performance class open to HA/AA stallions.</li> </ul>
Sharps Containers:	• Sharps containers for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments will be located in the barns. Competition management may fine any individuals, including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents, up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.
Printing Errors:	• The Show Committee is not responsible for any errors in printing. Any corrections to the prize list will be posted in the Show Office.
Evaluation Forms:	• USEF and AHA evaluation forms are available on-line from each association. Forms will also be available in the show office.
Stall Decorations:	• Tops of stalls or aisles are not to be covered with any material.
Fire Hazard Law:	<ul> <li>Aisles in barns must be open and not blocked in any way. If used, decorative material must be rendered and maintained flame retardant in accordance with state fire code (documentation required) and they must be retreated whenever washed or cleaned (documented).</li> </ul>
USEF Waiver:	Must be signed by all names on the entry form.

Protective Head Gear:	• From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para Dressage tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until the headgear is properly in place. USDF Statement on Animal Welfare
The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of individual members and over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.
Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.
The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.
Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.
While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.
As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

All horses exhibited in this show participate entirely at the owners risk. Neither the Organizing Committee, show volunteers and staff, the facility or its owners, any host GMO, USEF or USDF or their members will be responsible for any damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses, or property of exhibitors or spectators. All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damage to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

PARTICIPANTS IN THE FOLLOWING CLASSES ARE EXEMPTED FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS RULE: 1) LEADLINE; 2) EXHIBITIONS; 3) GAMES AND RACES; 4) CLASSES FOR 4-H MEMBERS; 5) WALK TROT (EXCEPTION: FRIESIAN PERFORMANCE FR231) AND ACADEMY CLASSES (ACADEMY CLASSES ARE CLASSES LIMITED TO HORSES USED REGULARLY IN A LESSON PROGRAM); 6) USDF INTRODUCTORY LEVEL TESTS, PAS DE DEUX AND QUADRILLE CLASSES; 7) NRHA ENDORSED REINING COMPETITIONS. 8) OPPORTUNITY CLASSES, 9) CITIZENS OF OTHER NATIONS WHO HAVE PROOF, IN ENGLISH, OF CURRENT MEMBERSHIP IN GOOD STANDING OF THEIR OWN NATIONAL FEDERATION, 10) USEA BEGINNER NOVICE DIVISION; AND 11) ASSISTANT HANDLERS IN DRESSAGE SPORT HORSE BREEDING CLASSES.

**MOTORIZED VEHICLES AND MINORS USEF Rule GR901.29/GR1301.7/GR1301.8**: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

WARNING: Under the Equine Activity Liability Act, each participant who participates in an equine activity expressly assumes the risks of engaging in and legal responsibility for injury, loss, or damage to person or property resulting from the risk of equine activities. Please be aware of the laws specific to the show location.

Show Management reserves the right to vary or add officials and refuse any entry for a cause; to disqualify any exhibitor and/or his or her horse for cause; to cause an exhibitor to forfeit his or her ribbons and winnings for cause; to return any entry and/or stall fee before or during the show for cause; all without being liable for damage or compensation. Show management reserves the right to make any changes deemed necessary for the safe and efficient conduct of this competition.

**Important Notice to all affected parties:** Third parties may come upon the property or enter the facilities where any herein described or listed event will occur; provided, that this is a license to enter the premises, for the purpose of observing or participating in the event, but not otherwise, and such license to any individual is subject to revocation by the owner, lessee or organizer, and entry for any purpose other than granted herein, shall be deemed criminal trespass and subject to appropriate legal proceedings.

ATTENTION COMPETITORS: Each competitor is responsible for supplying the show management with the correct and required association numbers of USDF and/or USEF for the horse, owner, rider, coaches, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not count towards national awards. The proof of these numbers must be in the form of either their actual membership/registration cards or a facsimile of them. Proof of membership must be included with entry form. Please provide the USEF/USDF Master Verification (www.eqverification.org) although membership cards or photocopies of cards are still acceptable. Failure to provide proof of USEF and/or USDF membership will result in competitor being charged non-member fees. Members that are unable to produce the USDF memberships cards/registrations or a facsimile will be asked to sign an affidavit and pay an affidavit fee. All entries are taken on a first come, first served basis. Some shows return late arriving entries after the show is filled, and some shows place entries on a wait list on an as-received basis. Please check each show for any additional policies. Send in the entries as soon as possible to assure entry to the show. Only one horse-rider combination, per entry form, per show.

### Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders

and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

### Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those
  sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at
  Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are
  exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot,
  academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM
  identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

### **Memberships Defined**

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEFlicensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program. Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

### USEF Equine Vaccination Rule

From the USEF Communications Department

Lexington, Ky. - In January, the USEF Board of Directors approved an addition to the rule book, which outlines equine vaccination requirements at licensed competitions. Beginning December 1, 2015, all horses entering the grounds of a Federation-licensed competition must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables.

Due to several high profile Equine Herpes (EHV) outbreaks in recent years that have involved the neuropathic strain of the virus (equine herpesvirus myeloencephalopathy-EHM), some competitions have placed vaccination requirements on their competitors that go beyond most accepted medical opinions and raise concern that unnecessary requirements can potentially put a horse at risk. The intent of this rule is to ensure that all licensed competitions comply with the vaccination guidelines for Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes (Rhinopneumonitis) published by the American Association of Equine Practitioners (AAEP). These guidelines are reviewed by infectious disease experts regularly, and recommend vaccinating competition horses at six-month intervals for both equine influenza (flu) and rhinopneumonitis (EHV-1 and EHV-4). There is not a vaccine that protects against EHM.

Intended to promote proper vaccination protocols, this rule does not anticipate an increased workload for competition management. The flu vaccination information can be added to the documentation already required by most competitions: a horse's health certificate and a negative coggins test.
