Hope 4 Hooves – Our Mission

Executive Director Dr. Valerie A. Porter AG-ACNP (501(c) 3 # 84-4809958) Dr. Porter started rescuing hooved and other farm animals in 2017. Hope 4 Hooves officially became a non-profit 501 (c) 3 entity February of 2020. This organization has transported 21 kill pen horses for re-home, lease and training since 2017. Many of our horses are re-homed with kids learning to ride and compete for the first-time others are re-homed with experienced riders or families looking to add to their home. Many of their horses/animals have been through the auction pipeline multiple times before being purchased by a slaughter buyer, others are dropped off at auction and sold for their weight.

All have many valuable years left to give!

OUR GOAL

The goal of Western Dressage is to develop a partnership between a happy equine athlete working in harmony with its rider. A system of progressive training produces a horse that is physically strong, balanced, supple, and flexible; this equine athlete also demonstrates a calm, confident, attentive attitude and is happy to do its job. Silver State Western Dressage is an Open Breed Horse show open to any rider/horse combination in compliance with USEF WDAA Rules.

- Junior Riders
- Adult Amateur Riders
- Open Riders

2024 Buckle Series will be awarded for each Rider Horse Combination (Junior/Adult Amateur/Open).

- ✓ **Minimum 3 shows required.**
- ✓ **Minimum of 1 rail class participation.**
- ✓ **WD Tests for average of 5 highest scores submitted.**
- ❖ **If Sponsored** - Musical Freestyle may also be awarded minimum 3 shows required and minimum 1 rail class participation – average of 3 highest scores for Show High Point Ribbon and/or Buckle.
- ❖ **If Sponsored** - Suitability Rail Buckles based on points earned per Division determined by # of horses in the class.

- Stalling information listed on your entry form is only used by the show secretary to calculate your show bill (you must contact the Barn Manager to reserve stalls).

SSWD & H4H Competition Rules

(pages 4-6)

ENTRIES: No entries will be taken by Show Secretary over the phone. Entries must be accompanied by a signed check/money order/Zelle Payment. Pre-entry applies to entries postmarked or received in person before Midnight (Pacific Time) on online registration date printed in the premium. All checks presented to **SSWD & H4H**, that fail to clear their banking facility for any reason whatsoever, will be assessed a \$40.00 returned check fee in addition to the amount of the original draft. All fees and assessments must be paid by the maker of the draft within ten (10) days.

CANCELLATIONS/WITHDRAWALS: Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or cancel any entry of any exhibitor.

NON - RESPONSIBILITY CLAUSE: All horses exhibited in this show will be done so entirely at the owner's, rider's, driver's, or handler's risk. SSWD & Hope 4 Hooves and Clark County Horseman's Park will not be responsible for any loss, damage, or injury to horses exhibited, or for any article of any kind or nature that may be lost or destroyed or in any way damaged. No alcohol or controlled substance may be consumed on Clark County Park (Horseman's Park) Facility. Each exhibitor will be responsible for all injury that may be caused to each person, whosoever, by any horse (or other animal) owned or exhibited by him/her, or that may arise from negligence of the person in charge of such animal. Signing the entry or entering online binds you to all the rules of the show and affirms you have read, understand, and agree to all information in the show prize list.

Horses to be judged in accordance with USEF WDAA current rules & 2022 tests. [WDAA test 2022](#) from the Western Dressage Association of America (WDAA), the branch of USEF that designs the tests. [USEF Western Dressage Rule Chapter Link](#). Our Western Dressage Classes are recognized as California Western Dressage (CAWDA) & Western Dressage Association of America (WDAA) Shows. Silver State Western Dressage & Hope 4 Hooves require WDAA Membership, California Western Dressage Association Membership is optional.

Ties will be broken according to USEF WDAA rules. USEF Rules WD127 Scoring, Classification and Prize-Giving: Individual Classification. In all competitions the winner is the competitor having the highest total points. In the case of a tie, it is at competition management's discretion whether to break ties and it must be stated in the prize list. If ties are to be broken, the following process must be followed. Exception:AR226

- a. The competitor with the highest scores for Collective Marks shall be declared the winner of the tie.
- b. In the event a tie remains, the competitor with the highest Collective Mark scores by the judge sitting at C shall be declared the winner of the tie.
- c. In the event a tie still remains, the competitor with the highest free walk score shall be declared the winner.
- d. In the event there is a tie on the free walk, the competitor with the highest sum of scores with coefficients greater than one shall be declared the winner.
- e. If a tie remains, the judge(s) must break the tie.

All WD tests and rail classes must be judged by USEF-licensed Western Dressage judges.

- USEF "r" Western Dressage judges are approved to judge Western Dressage Intro, Basic, and Level 1 tests and all rail classes.
- USEF "R" Western Dressage judges are approved to judge all levels of Western Dressage tests and all rail classes.
- Dressage Judges and L graduates are not eligible to judge WDAA recognized shows.

Amateur Status: If you are entering amateur classes, you will need to indicate your amateur status to show management by your entry signature.

Junior Status: Riders are eligible to compete as juniors if they are 17 years of age or less at the beginning of the 2023 competition year (December 1, 2023 – November 30, 2024). GR 103.

Numbers: Each horse will be assigned a unique number. You will be provided with 2 large numbers for each side of your saddle blanket while showing during and in warm-up arena.

Horses may be ridden by two riders. Each horse/rider combination requires a separate entry with all signatures and emergency contact.

No horse may be ridden in the same class number more than once (even with a different rider) per WD102.2

Horses who have shown in Western Hack are no longer eligible for Western Suitability.

Horse/rider combinations showing in walk/jog rail classes are not eligible for other rail classes or any test other than Introductory Level (Different horse/rider combinations are eligible for other rail classes and tests)

Horses may not compete in more than 6 tests per day.

Horses may only compete in levels that are adjacent with the same rider. For example, a horse may not be ridden in a basic level test and a level two test UNLESS with a different rider. WD 102.

A horse may be ridden by a maximum of two riders. WD 102.

To be eligible for Intro Level, a horse/rider combination must not have shown in a Western Dressage test at First level or above in the same competition year. WD 130.1.

Horses Not Competing: Non-showing horses are allowed on the grounds if space is available. The owner must enter the horse on an entry form, pay office, stall, and grounds fees and meet all health requirements.

Attire and Equipment: USEF rules and guidelines will be used for attire and equipment. For more information, please review the USEF rule by clicking this link WD 120 121 122 123.

Hazardous weather, Acts of God, Accident Policy: Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accidents, or emergencies. Every effort will be made to reschedule. No refunds for cancellations 10 due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accidents, or emergencies. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules and of the current USEF/WDAA rules will be judged in accordance therewith.

WALK JOG/LOPE RAIL CLASSES Horses enter at a working jog, in a counterclockwise direction. Horse must perform all gaits both ways of the ring. Gaits shall be the working walk and working jog. Free walk on a loose rein with horse stretching forward and down to be performed in at least one direction. Horses will be asked to reverse direction at the working jog or working walk at the judge's discretion. Jog work may be ridden sitting or posting. In the lineup, horses must stand quietly and may be asked to back individually or as a group.

Musical Freestyle Classes All freestyle classes, including Introductory and Basic levels will be held in a 20m x 60m arena. Intro and Basic Freestyle - entries limited to 15 rides. Winners will be announced immediately following the last ride-High Score Junior, Amateur, Open Level 1- Level 5 Freestyle. Music will be submitted to the announcer prior to the show. Please refer to USEF rulebook WD-9 FREESTYLE, WD131 Western Musical Freestyle and WD122.6 for Freestyle rules.

Please include on SSWD & H4H Show Waiver Form Rider Status (Junior, Adult Amateur, Open) and if you are WDAA member and/or CAWDA member provide those numbers for Owner, Rider, Trainer and Coach.

Scheduling Ride Conflicts: Competitors with multiple horses and horses with multiple riders are urged to bring enough help. If a conflict is discovered, notify the show secretary immediately.

Final Salute Directions: The show must stay on schedule or riders with multiple horses will experience conflicts in different arenas. To help with this, after your second salute, please walk forward a few steps and turn toward exit at A. In other words, do NOT walk all the way to C before turning to exit the arena.

Management reserves the right to change officials, limit entries, combine or cancel classes, and modify the schedule to make whatever changes are required by circumstances to the competition specifications listed herein. Management reserves the right to cancel classes insufficiently filled and to refuse or require withdrawal of an entry for cause deemed enough by Show Management.

Tests will be scored with scores posted on a scoreboard by the show office. It is the responsibility of the competitor to verify the accuracy of all scores. Scoring errors must be reported to the Show Secretary within one hour of the official posting of the scores from the last class of the show day during which the score was earned. Tests may be viewed in the show office once the office process of verification is completed. Original copies of test will be given only at the end of the show in case there is a tie.

Horseman's Park Warm Up Arena Protocol: With only one warm up pen both lunging and riding for warm up is allowed. Please be considerate when sharing warm up arena (i.e., when lunging, do not snap whip when horses with riders are present in the warm-up arena. When we are on a two-day show schedule, please allow horses in the competition that day the opportunity to warm-up safely. Please show courtesy to our Clark County Maintenance Personnel and exit all arenas are being prepared/dragged in preparation of our show.

USEF Membership: This is a recognized CAWDA/WDAA local competition. NO USEF memberships, non-member fees, or horse registrations are required to compete in this show.

Memberships: All owners, trainers, and riders ARE ENCOURAGED to be a member of WDAA & CAWDA. If you are a WDAA and/or CAWDA Member, please include your member numbers on your online registration form under the Rider and Show Waiver. 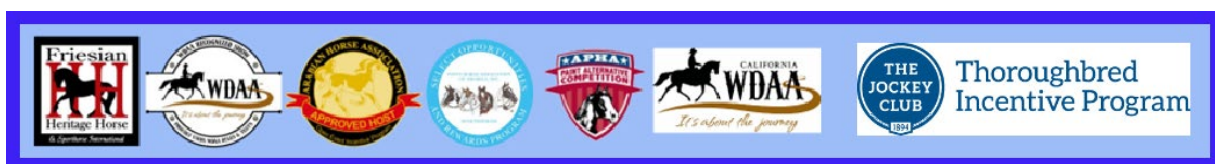
