New York State Fairgrounds, 581 State Fair Blvd., Syracuse, NY 13209. Gate 2 is the main entrance.

From the west: Exit 39 from Interstate 90 (the NYS Thruway). Follow Rt 690 East to the Fairgrounds.

From the east: As above or Exit 34A from Interstate 90. Follow Rt 481 South to Rt 690 West to

the Fairgrounds. Exit 39 is closer to the Fairgrounds and is recommended.

Campers & RVs - Campers and RV's must be parked in designated areas, which are on a "first come, first served" basis. Camper fee is \$265 from Monday to Sunday, should you wish to arrive early, prior arrangements may be made with the show manager at an additional \$35.00 per day. Water and electricity are available in all locations. Sewers are available in some locations. Campers requiring heavy duty power should ask for a location that will satisfy those needs. All campers must display a permit issued by the show office. There are four dumping stations on the grounds, or a pump truck (if available) will come in for a fee.

GENERAL RULES AND EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

- EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT UNITED STATES EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION (USEF) RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.
- Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of the this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; and 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding Classes.
- Management reserves the right to change or alter the officials listed without notice prior to or during the show.
- Management reserves the right to cancel, combine, or divide any class where it is deemed advisable and to reschedule any divided class. There will be two sets of ribbons in all divided classes.
- Copies of current American Morgan Horse Association (AMHA) and USEF membership cards and proof of horse registration must be presented with entries before back numbers are issued.
- Horses shown in this division must be registered with the American Morgan Horse Association, Inc., or an organization having registry reciprocity, (Canadian Morgan Horse Association, British Morgan Horse Society, Swedish Morgan Horse Society.) Horses must be entered under their full registered name or if under one year of age be eligible for registration. Horses must be entered under the names of the owner(s) or lessee of record. A copy of the registration papers showing recorded ownership or proof of lease must be submitted with entry form at the time of making entry. Competition management is responsible for notifying exhibitors of this requirement.
- Horses must be made available for inspection by an official designated by the American Morgan Horse Association.
- Entry in New Yok Member Classes requires proof of current membership in the New York Morgan Horse Society
- The New York Morgan Regional Horse Show assumes no responsibility for situations and actions resulting from an individual serving or consuming alcohol on the show grounds.
- The New York Morgan Regional Horse Show reserves the right to refuse entry.
- Safe Sport Policy: Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. AMHA Medal Classes

AMHA Medal Classes – Exhibitors in AMHA medal classes must be AMHA members in good standing. Riders in the Saddle Seat, Western Seat, Hunter Seat on the Flat and Reining Seat must be under 22 years of age as of December 1st of the competition year.

Arenas & Footing

Coliseum: 90' x 220', Warm-up Arena ring 85' x 190'. Both rings have Travel Right footing. The 4-H arenas are 221' x 110' with a mix of stone dust and sand. The 80'x 165' Exercise Arena behind main barn with stone dust and sand will be available for lunging during the show.

SCHOOLING: The coliseum will be open for schooling on Monday.

Arrivals and Departures

The NYS Fairgrounds are available for arrival on Monday September 9, 2024 and must be vacated by 11 am Sunday September 15, 2024. ANY EXHIBITORS NEEDING AN EXCEPTION TO THESE TIMES MUST MAKE PRIOR ARRANGEMENTS WITH THE SHOW MANAGER.

Stabling

Box and Tack Stalls are \$155.00 each. Stall reservations will only be accepted with payment. Entries wishing to be stabled together must indicate so on each individual stabling list. Tack stalls may be shared, but exhibitors wishing to do so must send their entries in together. We will do our best to honor preferences, but such cannot be guaranteed. Anyone who removes stall doors will be billed for the expense of rehanging the doors. Overnight stabling in vans or trailers is prohibited. Stalls added after the stabling chart is completed will be assigned in the closest available proximity to the original group. Permanent and temporary stalls are 10x10

Box Seats

Reserved seating in the Coliseum consists of 6 chairs. Box Seating is available for \$150 for a group OR as part of a sponsorship package.

Golf Carts & Motorized Vehicles

Golf Cart rental is available for \$350. All Golf Carts must be pre-ordered.

Drivers are subject to USEF GR 1301.7. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. GR 1301.7, GR 1301.8.

Parking

Horse trailers must be parked in the lot on the back side of the Expo Center. Cars must park in designated areas. Cars should not be parked in camping spaces. There will be no loading or unloading between the barns while the show is in session. This will be strictly enforced.

FIRE AND SAFETY REGULATIONS

NO SMOKING in ANY buildings on the grounds per NYS Fairgrounds rules. Fireproof material must be used for all stall decorations. Aisles of the barns must remain clear. Tack stall decorations must not extend more than 18" into the center aisle of main barn. Drapes may not be placed across aisles. Bedding and similar are not permitted on the floor of any aisle.

SMOKING, BICYCLING, AND ROLLERBLADING INSIDE ANY BUILDING IS EXPRESSLY PROHIBITED.

Sharps Disposal

Exhibitors' attention is directed to USEF Rules pertaining to Drugs and Medications. Exhibitors must dispose of sharps in containers provided throughout the stabling area.

USEF/AMHA Rules Forum

If there are proposed rule changes, AMHA will conduct a Rules Forum in the Coliseum at the conclusion of the In Hand classes on Wednesday morning.

Headgear

Riders must wear ASTM/SEI approved headgear with properly fitting harness in the following:

- When jumping anywhere on the show grounds
- Hunter Seat Equitation classes
- Dressage riders when warming up for and riding in Dressage classes (exception: Western Dressage). See USEF and DR120.6.
- Leadline riders at all times when mounted.
- Protective headgear is acceptable in any other division or class without penalty by the judge. See USEF GR801.

Awards

Winners of each qualifying class will receive a ribbon w/ medallion. Winners of championship classes will receive tri-color ribbon and prize according to championship (cooler, picture frame) & reserve will receive tri-color ribbon. Ribbons will be presented to entries placing first through eighth in all classes.

Payout for the NYSSA & NY Futurity will be in accordance with each division's guidelines.

Ring Procedure

While classes are in session in the Coliseum, only those horses showing in the next class will be allowed in the warm-up arena.

In classes which show collectively, two minutes will be allowed after the first horse enters the ring. The gate will be closed at the end of two minutes or when all entries have entered the ring, whichever comes first. A class will be considered completed when the cards are handed to the Ringmaster(s) or Announcer.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR HORSES

- At Federation licensed competitions, horses more than 7 months of age entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. USEF GR 845. Proof of current Rabies inoculation administered within 12 months of the current show dates must be presented for each horse.
- **HORSES STABLED IN NEW YORK STATE:** Must present a Negative Coggins test certificate dated in 2023 or 2024. Please bring legible copy to show office when checking in.
- HORSES STABLED OUTSIDE NEW YORK STATE (INCLUDING CANADA): Must present a Negative Coggins test certificate dated since September 2023 and a current Health Certificate from your local veterinarian, dated within 30 days. Please bring legible copies of both Coggins and Health Certificate to show office when checking in.

Entries, Show Office Information & Procedures, Fees

- Electronic Entries VIA WWW.HORSESHOWSONLINE.COM are **PREFERRED & STRONGLY ENCOURAGED**. (Academy Entries must be done by paper form.) A basic Horse Shows Online account is free. With a basic Horse Shows Online account you can submit online entries to participating horse shows. If you have never used the site, select Online Show Entry from the banner near the top and follow the instructions to create an account and complete your entries.
- ONLINE ENTRIES COMPLETE ENTRY AND BRING ALL REQUIRED HEALTH & MEMBERSHIP DOCUMENTS WITH YOU TO THE SHOW OFFICE UPON CHECKIN. DO NOT EMAIL OR MAIL PAPERWORK. (See paper entry forms for instructions.)
 - Academy entries are on a separate entry form and close on August 12th, 2024
 - Payment may be made by credit card by phone (607-731-9572) or by mailing a signed, blank check to Pam Turner, 584 Ridge Rd, Horseheads, NY 14845. No stalls will be assigned without pre-payment.
 - Late/Post Entries must be done electronically and will be assigned a late fee of \$25 per horse.

Check in at the show office is BY APPOINTMENT ONLY. All exhibitors, including dressage exhibitors, are required to CHECK IN at the show office in the Main Barn. Appointments may be made online at SignUpGenius.com home page and enter the following email address pfturner584@yahoo.com or call Pam Turner at 607-731-9572 to schedule.

- o Wednesday Saturday: One hour before start of the show until end of the last class of the day

Dressage Exhibitors: if you are not coming to the show early, please allow for extra wait time for check in after Tuesday.

No back numbers will be issued until the appropriate membership cards, health papers (see HEALTH REQUIREMENTS) and stall reservation payment are on file in the show office.

Additions/Scratches

Qualifying classes are non-refundable after Aug. 12, 2024. Qualifying classes may be scratched and replaced with another qualifying class, with the same horse, without penalty. Championship classes may be scratched without penalty. Any class may be cancelled at the beginning of the session due to insufficient entries at that time. Cancelled classes will not be reinstated

Add/Scratch Forms will be available outside the office or at HorseShowsOnline.com and must be done 2 hours before the session. There will be a \$20 penalty fee added for horses shown without entering through the office.

Convenience Fee

4% convenience fee will be assessed when using a credit card.

Refunds

All fees will be refunded upon request made to the Show Secretary on or before August 12th, 2024. Management reserves the right to decline any entry and to return any entry fees before or during the show without being liable for compensation. MISSING A CLASS IS NOT SUFFICIENT FOR A REFUND.

PLEASE TAKE TIME TO REVIEW YOUR BILL AT CHECK OUT. Except for USEF fees, all bills are final on Oct. 7, 2024. No refunds after this date.

USEF Entry Agreement

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of New York Morgan Horse Show. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4. If not currently a USEF Active Competing member or Subscriber, I acknowledge that I will be enrolled for no cost as a USEF Fan and my USEF Fan Account will continue to annually automatically renew in USEF's sole discretion. Additionally, I acknowledge that the benefits of a USEF Fan are subject to change without notice. USEF may in its sole discretion, at any time, terminate my USEF Fan status, I acknowledge that I may opt out at any time by going to My USEF Dashboard or calling (859) 810-8733.

Show Pass

Federation Show Pass Fee – the amount of the Show Pass fee will be established annually by the Federation. The fee must be collected by all appropriate competitions and remitted to the Federation (for exceptions see FR901.9). Non-US citizens who are members in good standing of the National Federations are exempt from payment of the Federation Show Pass fee. Eligible exhibitors are prohibited from obtaining more than one (1) Show Pass per competition year. While riders and owners are eligible for one Show Pass, trainers and coaches are no longer eligible to participate under a Show Pass and must be an Active USEF member. Anyone that signs an entry blank or acts as a trainer or coach must be an Active USEF member and is not eligible for a Show Pass. Show Pass purchases can only be made online by exhibitors. https://www.usef.org/show-pass

Owners of entries in all Futurity and Futurity Alumni classes must be members of the New York Morgan Horse Society. All foals must be products of stallions and mares nominated before July 15th of the weanling year. To be eligible, the yearling, 2 yr. old and 3 yr. old must have been nominated (not necessarily shown) in the weanling, yearling, 2 yr. old and 3 yr. old divisions, respectively. All payments are to be made to the Futurity by 5pm Tuesday, September 10th. Any payments after 5pm Tuesday, until 12/31, are considered late and will be accepted at double the normal fees. Each age group will be shown in two divisions: (A) Colts, **includes stallions and geldings**, and (B) Fillies. Champion and Reserve will be named for each age group. PLEASE PROVIDE COPIES OF MEMBERSHIP CARDS UPON CHECK IN.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non- Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group
 classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted
 dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory
 Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions,
 games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan (B/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF- licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program. **Business Membership (BM):** A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

The Championships for Introductory, Basic, Level 1 and Level 2 will be awarded based on the average of *three* scores at that level; one score MUST be the highest test of that level. The Musical Freestyle Class will count toward championship awards and will be deemed the equivalent of the highest test at applicable level.
