Arrivals/ Departures

<u>Arrival of Entries:</u> HORSES WILL NOT BE ALLOWED ON SHOW GROUNDS PRIOR TO 7AM ON THE FRIDAY PRECEEDING THE SHOW. However, stall setup may commence on the Thursday preceding the start of the show. Exhibitors traveling long distances that may need some exceptions to these rules must make prior arrangements with the show manager.

<u>Departures of Entries:</u> Horses must leave the fairgrounds no later than Sunday at 5pm (the day after the end of the show). Any exhibitor needing exception to this rule must make prior arrangements with the Show Manager.

From the South (NYC/Hartford/Springfield):

Take I- 91 North in Massachusetts to Northampton, Exit 25 (old Exit 19). Take Exit 25 and follow rotary onto Route 9 West (Bridge Street). Continue straight on Route 9 West (Bridge Street) to first set of lights and turn left onto Old Ferry Road or continue to your second left onto Fair Street.

From the North (Vermont):

Take I-91 South to Exit 26 (old Exit 20) (US Route 5 South/N. King Street). As you come off the ramp and onto Route 5 South/N. King Street, merge into the left lane. Take a left turn at the traffic light onto Damon Road. Continue Damon Road for approx. 1 mile to the traffic circle/rotary. Merge into the rotary and bear right at the first turn off onto Route 9 West/Bridge Street. Continue along Route 9 West/Bridge Street for approx. ½ mile to Fair Street. Turn left onto Fair Street.

From the East (Boston):

Take the Massachusetts Turnpike (Interstate 90) to Exit 4. Take Exit 45 (old Exit 4) and follow I-91 North to Northampton, Exit 25 (old Exit 19). Take Exit 25 and follow rotary onto Route 9 West (Bridge Street). Continue straight on Route 9 West (Bridge Street) to first set of lights and turn left onto Old Ferry Road or continue to your second left onto Fair Street.

From the West (Albany):

Take the Massachusetts Turnpike East (Interstate 90) to Exit 4. Take Exit 4 and follow I-91 North to Northampton, Exit 25 (old Exit 19). 

Each of the four categories is worth 250 points. It is not necessary to compete in all four divisions. The high point winner in each division will culminate into the Walk-Trot Youth of the Year (12 & under not cantering in competition), a junior youth of the year (13 & Under) and a Senior Youth of the Year (14-21). Categories: winner trophy and ribbons through eight places in each division. Divisional High Point awards: Champion and Reserve trophies with ribbons through eight places, The Senior winner receives a \$750.00 scholarship to compete in the AMHA Youth of the Year Finals. A senior youth may only win one qualifying contest in a calendar year but may compete for category awards.

General Rules & Information

- This prize list covers the rules and regulations of the New England Regional Morgan Horse Show, which may also be referred to in this document as "the Show."
- The United States Equestrian Federation may be referred to as "USEF" or "the Federation."
- Every class offered herein which is covered by the Rules and Specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. USEF points are awarded in accordance with USEF 11-D.
- It is the exhibitor's responsibility to submit entries that do not constitute a violation of GR1304.
- Management reserves the right to change or alter the officials listed without notice prior to or during the Show.
- The New England Regional Morgan Horse Show reserves the right to refuse entries.
- ❖ Health and Coggins certificates must NOT be forwarded to the Secretary with entries. Exhibitors will be required to present their horse(s) Coggins and health certificates/other necessary information to receive horse numbers.
- When possible, corrections to this prize list will appear on the Show's web site: www.nemha.com.
- ❖ The Show does not add classes after the prize list has been published.
- The Show does not accept any responsibility for the use of the class results from the Show.
- Entries will be accepted on a first come, first served basis. Please enter early.
- A copy of AMHA registration papers and lease agreement (if any) must accompany all entry blanks.
- The use of green sawdust or over-bedding of stalls is not allowed per fairground regulations. Non-compliance to any of the above rules will result in charges to the horse show from the fairground association and will in turn be charged to the exhibitor occupying the effected stalls.

AGE OF RIDER

The age of an individual on December 1 will be maintained throughout the entire competition year (GR103).

- Amateur rider/driver/handler must be at least 18 years old. EXCEPTION: Specialty Amateur In-Hand and Amateur Championships (when a junior exhibitor championship is not offered).
- Ladies and Gentlemen rider/driver must be at least 18 years old.
- Youth rider/driver must be 21 years old or younger.
- Amateur Masters rider/driver must be 50 years old or older.

AMATEUR CERTIFICATION

• AMATEUR CERTIFICATION CARDS. Every person who competes in classes for amateurs under Federation rules must possess current amateur certification issued by the Federation. See GR1306 and GR1307. All exhibitors 18 & over in Classic Pleasure classes are required to have amateur certification.

AMHA RULES FORUM

The Rules Committee of the American Morgan Horse Association invites you to participate in a discussion of proposed rule changes. The forum will be held on Monday at 1PM.

ASSOCIATION/FEDERATION FEES

AMHA

All Owners, Trainers, Riders, Drivers, and Handlers (excluding Lead line & Walk Trot) competing in an AMHA Regional Championship must be members of The American Morgan Horse Association or pay an AMHA non-member fee of \$45.00 **USEF**

All Owners, Trainers, Riders, Drivers, and Handlers (excluding Lead line & Walk Trot) competing in an AMHA Regional Championship must be members of and the United States Equestrian Federation or pay a USEF Show Pass fee of \$45.00.

Copies of current American Morgan Horse Association ("AMHA") and USEF membership cards (or reciprocal cards from other nations) must be presented before numbers are issued.

ASSOCIATION/FEDERATION MEMBERSHIP RULES

AMHA

AMHA Standard or Premium Level, Life, Individual and Junior AMHA Members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at the Show without further charge. Associate level AMHA members may participate upon payment of \$35 fee to upgrade to Standard Level, or non-member fee of \$45. (Non-members may participate as a rider, driver, owner, lessee, coach, agent or trainer upon payment of a \$45.00 fee.) Participants in leadline, walk-trot classes and residents of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their national federation are exempted from the requirements of this rule.

USEF

USEF Eligibility Statement: Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR218) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

USDF

Membership Benefits: USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Member Guide* or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

This competition is recognized by USDF for 2024

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form.

In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

By calling or writing the USDF office at (859) 971-2277, 4051 Iron Works Parkway, Lexington, KY 40511 The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.

ATTENTION-GETTING DEVICES

- •Attention-Getting Devices and/or other noisemakers (including but not limited to tape measures, blow horns, altered bamboo poles, babypowder, etc.) are not allowed in and around the make-up/schooling/ warm-up and competition rings during the scheduled competition sessions.
- Use of explosives and fi re extinguishers by or for exhibitors/ competitors (except in the case of fi re) are not allowed on competition grounds at any time. GR838.4j and GR839.

ATTIRE AND ENTRANCE TO RING

- All riders/drivers/handlers, attendants and awards presenters must be neatly and appropriately attired to enter the show ring for all performances or may be denied entrance.
- Entrance to the arenas must be made through the gates. No jumping over the rail into the arena.

AWARDS

A trophy and eight ribbons will be awarded in all classes except as noted in certain classes. Stake classes will receive championship level awards. Champions will receive a Cooler, Ribbon & sash, Reserve ribbon & sash, ribbons through eight places.

CAMPERS

CAMPER SPACES ARE LIMITED.

CAMPER SPACE MUST BE RESERVED IN ADVANCE. If you had a camper spot last year, you will be sent a reservations form. If you did not receive a form or if you are a new "camper", there is a copy in this prize list, on-line at www.nemha.com or can requested from the show secretary. Camper reservations are due June 1, to secure spots that you have had in the past. Confirmation cards will be sent to those who have made reservations by the June 1st date. Camper spaces will be assigned by the horse show manager with preference given to space(s) occupied in previous years. The total number of camper spaces is limited and will be filled on a first come first served basis.

Camper Fees:

\$500.00 Campers requiring 30 amp service or less for the duration of the show

\$650.00 for campers requiring 50 amp service for the duration of the show. Camper spaces have water, electrical and sewer. Spaces not having sewer connections will be pumped on an every other day rotation starting the Monday of the show. Additional pumping must be scheduled by and paid by the camper owner. Additional pumping availability is not guaranteed by NEMHS.

NOTE: STATE LAW PROHIBITS THE DISCHARGE OF GRAY WATER ONTO THE GROUND.

Camper Arrival: Campers will be allowed to arrive starting on Thursday before the show, between the hours of 7am and 7pm. Campers arriving after these hours will not be allowed to park until the next morning.

ALL CAMPERS MUST BE PARKED WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF THE CAMPER SUPERVISOR FROM 7AM TO 7PM DAILY. CAMPERS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO ARRIVE AFTER THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE SHOW ON MONDAY.

CANCELLATION OR COMBINING OF CLASSES

Management has the right to combine or cancel classes.

CHECKS RETURNED/DECLINED CREDIT CARDS

- •All checks returned for insufficient funds or credit cards declined for any reason will be charged a \$50 handling fee and must be replaced by a certified check or cashier's check. No one will be allowed to show if he/she has a returned check, declined credit card or handling fee outstanding.
- A billing fee of \$25.00 will be charged to any account not settled before leaving the show.

COMPLAINTS AND DISPUTES

Complaint procedures must follow rules in the USEF Bylaws, Part VII.

CROSS ENTERING

CLASSIC PLEASURE. Cross-entering is **NOT allowed** between the Classic Pleasure (Driving or Saddle) Sections and the English Pleasure or Pleasure Driving Sections, but Cross-entering between the Classic Pleasure Sections and all other Sections is allowed.

EQUITATION. Cross-entering is **NOT allowed** for riders between Saddle Seat Classic Equitation and Saddle Seat Equitation classes. This does not apply to AMHA Saddle Seat Medal and UPHA Challenge Cup classes.

DRUGS AND MEDICATIONS

- •A horse exhibited at this Show that receives any medication which contains a forbidden substance shall not be eligible for competition unless otherwise exempted under USEF Chapter 4.
- •The Show Committee has requested USEF to test this show for use of forbidden substances.

ELECTRICITY

Electricity for stalls should be used for essential items only such as horse fans, clippers and vacuums. Non-essential items-refrigerators, air conditioners, etc. are to be limited and you may be asked to discontinue use if a power problem exists. An additional fee could be assessed for excessive use of electricity.

ELIMINATION OF HORSES

If a horse is eliminated after the placings have been tabulated, the horses placing below the eliminated horse will move up in sequential order.

ENTERING

Emailed entries will not be accepted. ALL Entries are to be made via horseshowsonline.com.

Entries close June 7TH. Entries postmarked later than June 7th, will be assessed \$50.00 per horse (An Entry consistent of a horse being entered in 1 class). Entries received after July 1 will be assessed a fee of \$100.00 per horse. There will be no post entry fees charged at the show for regular or championship classes if the horse was entered prior to the post entry dates. DRESSAGE ENTRIES CLOSE June 7TH, changes are not guaranteed accommodation after July 1st. Late Fees will be waived for any owner who has entries entered prior to the closing date of June 7th and wishes to add a late entry to existing entries if there are stalls available. Payment for stalls must accompany request. Stalls will be assigned based on the horses that are entered. Tack stalls will be determined based on availability and number of horses entered. Transfer of entry fees will be accepted at no penalty prior to the start of the show. After the start of the show, transfers will not be accepted. Post entries during the show must be made one session prior to the session in which the class is held. There is an office fee of \$30.00 per horse. We are unable to split show fees among exhibitors. We are unable to hold checks from exhibitors. The registered owner or leasee is responsible for payment of entire entry.

HOW TO USE HORSESHOWSONLINE.COM

What you need: A free account at Horse Shows Online. If you don't already have an account you can create one at www.horseshowsonline.com. Horse Shows Online basic membership is free. A record in your account for each person and horse that you will use on show entry forms when you enter a show. Records will be saved and can be used for future shows.

How to get started: Login to Horse Shows Online at www.horseshowsonline.com, click on the member services button on the main menu.

- Once you are logged in click the "My Horses, People, Shows" button in the member menu. At the People, Horses, Shows page, add any new people and horses to your account as required on the appropriate tab (ie: My People, My Horses). People and horses are saved with your account. Once you have those records in your account you can use them at every show you enter.
- Click the "Enter Show" button to select the show you want to enter and follow the steps in the outline entry wizard. Steps to enter a show Select the show you want to enter from your "My People, Horses, Shows" page on the My Show Entries tab, or find the show you want to enter in the show selector and click the Online Entry Icon. This will start the online entry wizard. Make sure you have already created the horses and people in your member account. The online entry wizard will guide you through the steps to complete the entry form. The basic steps in the wizard are: Select the horses, people and riders for your entry Select the classes each rider is entered in Select the quantity for stalls and other fees Confirm your selections Checkout and submit the show entry The final steps generates the completed entry form and submits your entry to the show for review and acceptance. If the show requires a payment at entry time you will be prompted for your credit card information.
- Tips-You can cancel the entry part way through the wizard and resume the entry later on. For example, if you need to add more people to your account, or just want to come back and complete the entry later. Unfinished entry forms are listed in your "My entries" tab and will allow you to edit the entry. People and horses you create in your account are saved permanently and can be used in other shows you enter.

EQUINE VACCINATION RULE

At Federation licensed competitions, horses more than seven months of age entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. GR844.1.

FIRE REGULATIONS

- •The use of two wire extension cords (ZIP cords) will no longer be allowed on the fairgrounds as they are deemed unsafe in agricultural settings. All extension cords must be GROUNDED (3wire/prong) cords. All appliances (ie. fans, clippers, etc.), must have a UL approved label attached. It is recommended that old fans with ungrounded cords be replaces with fans that have 3 wire grounded cords.
- •NO SMOKING will be permitted in Arena or Livestock area (BARNS).
- •Parking—Exits and entrances must be kept clear. Designated fire lanes must be kept clear. Any vehicles parked in unauthorized areas will be towed and charged at the owner's expense.
- •No motorized vehicles are allowed in the buildings with the exception of golf carts for special circumstances and motorized wheelchairs.
- •Aisle: Blocking of barn aisles is strictly prohibited. This includes drapes or other obstructions and may be removed by Management.

FOOTING

Main ring footing is a sand fiber mixture-280'x80'. Warm up track is sandy loam, dirt mixture-40'x2000'. Warm up rings and dressage area are stone dust 250'x80'. The COVERED WARMUP ring is 144' X 80'.

FORBIDDEN APPLIANCES AND CONDUCT

- •Items such as, but not limited to, tape measures, blowhorns, lighters, split bamboo poles, chains, laser beams or whips that might affect the performance of a horse or disturb another horse while performing in a class will not be allowed at the entrance to any of the show rings, ringside or any public place.
- •Any tail-setting device that promotes an obvious or unnatural breakover is prohibited on the show grounds. Rolled or round bustles are permitted.
- •USEF rules will be enforced including GR839 (includes, but not limited to firecrackers, laser beams, fire extinguishers and whipping). Provisions of the Horse Protection Act will be enforced.
- •Exhibitors are urged to familiarize themselves with USEF rules regarding forbidden appliances and conduct. Rules will be enforced and yellow warning cards will be issued to anyone found not in compliance.

GOLF CARTS

- •Golf Carts may only be operated by Licensed Drivers as defined in USEF Rule GR1301.7
- •Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
- •The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.
- •Golf carts may not be operated between midnight and 6:00 AM.

- •THERE WILL BE A LIMITED NUMBER OF GOLF CARTS AVAILABLE FOR RENTAL. Rentals start the first day of the show and must be returned the last night of the show by midnight. Prior to July 1ST for reservations use form online at www.nemha.com, after July 1ST contact the NEMHA show manager by email at nemhsmanager@aol.com.
- •Golf carts rented by NEMHA may not to be operated by unlicensed minors (per USEF Rule GR1301.7) any golf cart operated by an unlicensed minor will be confiscated for the remainder of the show.

HEADERS

All headers in the Morgan Division must be a minimum of 16 years of age and dressed appropriately (USEF horse show age, see GR103).

HEADGEAR

Riders must wear ASTM/SEI approved headgear with properly fitting harness in the following:

- All classes where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the show grounds (exception: Trail classes)
- Hunter Seat Equitation classes, including Walk/Trot
- Dressage riders when warming up for and riding in Dressage classes (exception: Western Dressage)
- Leadline riders at all times when mounted. Protective headgear is acceptable in any other division or class without penalty by the judge. See GR801.4.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

- •Massachusetts Department of Public Health requires that no equine over 6 months of age is permitted at any horse show in the Commonwealth unless it is accompanied by a negative Coggins Test which was conducted within the previous 12 months. Foals under 6 months of age shall be exempt from the requirements provided that the foal is with its dam and the dam is accompanied by an official negative Coggins test.
- Further, the shows themselves require that all horses must have a certificate to prove the Eastern and Western Equine Encephalitis vaccination has been administered.
- •All horses will be required to have a Health Certificate. Horses stabled in the state of Massachusetts must have a current health certificate dated after January 1 of the calendar year. Out of state horses must have a health certificate dated within 30 days.
- •NON-SHOWING HORSES All health requirements apply to these horses.

HEARING DEVICES

Electronic communication devices used for purposes of coaching exhibitors during a competition are prohibited in all classes in the Morgan Division. Exhibitors with a permanent hearing impairment are permitted to use an electronic communication device upon submission of a written certification from a treating medical professional's office certifying the permanent hearing impairment and certifying the requirement of an electronic communication device. The medical certification on must be provided to the competition Steward, within a reasonable Θ me prior to competing, who shall attach a copy to the Steward's report.

LOCATION OF CLASSES

Management reserves the right to change the arena location of classes.

MEASUREMENTS

Measurement cards are not required. Management reserves the right to measure feet before any protests are lodged. A courtesy measurement by the Steward is available to all exhibitors. All Champions and Reserve Champions must have one foot measured immediately upon leaving the ring. Toe length specifications can be found in MO103.

PADDOCK ANNOUNCEMENTS

Paddock calls and announcements regarding classes are provided as a courtesy to exhibitors. Checking in and showing up for a class remains the responsibility of the individual exhibitor.

PARKING

All vehicles must be parked in areas designated by management. Parking will not be permitted in front of barns or in fire lanes. All horse trailers and vans must be parked in designated areas. Failure to comply will result in towing at owner's expense.

PARTIES/MEETINGS/SPECIAL EVENTS

The week of the Show includes many special events, parties and meetings. Please join us. You'll find a list of events in the Show Program, and in your exhibitor's packet.

PERSONS NOT IN GOOD STANDING

Persons who are not in good standing with USEF, AMHA, this Show, The Morgan Grand National and World Championship Show or any Regional Show may not participate in this Show, whether as an exhibitor, owner, trainer or otherwise. This policy includes all horses registered in the name of any such person, whether leased or under contract for sale. Procedures have been established to resolve any disputes concerning accounts with USEF, AMHA, MGNWCHS, this Show or any Regional Show.

RAFFLES/SOLICITATION/FUND RAISING

Any raffle/solicitation/fund-raising held at the Show must be approved by the Show Committee and have the appropriate permitting.

REFUNDS

- •Refunds for golf carts, box seats, campers and pre-order items will be refunded at the discretion of the Show Manager, based on the availability to resell or re-issue the item.
- •All refunds are subject to a \$30.00 office fee. All entry fees and stall fees will be refunded on request before the closing date for entries. After this date, refunds of entry fees will be made due to bona fide casualty to horse, exhibitor, or exhibitor's family provided cancellation and appropriate certificates are received no later than the first day of the show. •Office fees will not be refunded.
- •At the discretion of the Show Manager; stall fees may be refunded if the cancellation is received in time to reassign the stalls to another exhibitor.

RING PROCEDURE & CONDUCT

- In classes which show collectively, two minutes will be allowed after the first horse enters the ring. The gate will be closed at the end of two minutes or when all entries have entered the ring, whichever comes first. A class will be considered completed when the cards are handed to the Ringmasters or Announcer.
- CONDUCT IN THE SHOW ARENA(S) Unseemly behavior in any show arena while a class is in session may result in expulsion from the Show. This includes, but is not limited to, the application of ginger or other similar substances to a horse in any show arena or warm-up arena.

SAFE SPORT POLICY

Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

Any USEF Competing Member who is 18-years-old and older (based on your actual birthday) is required to take the SafeSport training, including amateurs, professionals, juniors who are 18-years-old and older, and owners who have an annual, three-year, or lifetime membership. Others required to take the SafeSport training include USEF licensed officials, Chefs d'Equipe, Staff, Board Members, Competition Management, Coaches, Human Physios, Farriers, Trainers, Veterinarians, and Selectors hired or contracted by USEF. The SafeSport training requirement does not apply to USEF Subscriber Members or USEF Competing Members under the age of 18 (based on your actual birthday). Any individual signing an entry blank as Trainer or Coach, must have completed the Safe Sport Training prior to the first day of competition. Anyone joining USEF for the first time must complete the Safe Sport Training with 7 Days of joining.

SAFETY

Management reserves the right to deny entry into the ring to any unruly horse or one whose actions threaten to endanger the rider, driver, handler, other exhibitors or entries.

SCORING SYSTEM

When multiple judges are used, the Majority Opinion System (MOS) will be utilized. See https://www.usef.org/forms-pubs/G81-lpECgi8/majority-opinion-three-judge-scoring for more information on the MOS system.

SEATING

- •Box Seats: \$650 Box seats in sections of 6 may be available.
- •Please refer to the NEMHA Box Seat Policy located on nemha.com.
- •The Box Seat Renewal forms will be mailed the first of the year and must be paid by April 1. For more information contact John Lampropoulos, Show Manager.

SECURITY

Security is hired to assist with around-the-clock protection of exhibitors and horses. However, it is impossible for the officers to be in all places at all times. You are urged to take careful precautions in the stable area and on the grounds with purses, billfolds and other belongings.

SHARPS DISPOSAL

Safe and proper sharps disposal (needles, syringes and other hazardous objects and materials) is the responsibility of individual stables. Containers are available throughout the stabling area and will be properly disposed of by competition personnel when full or after the show. **Any syringes found in stalls by Fairgound staff will be charged back the exhibitor.**

SHOW EVALUATIONS

- USEF Evaluation Forms may be obtained from the Show Office.
- Show and Judging Evaluation Forms are available in the Show Office. Please fill them in and leave them with the Show Secretary when you check out or utilize USEF.org.

SPLITTING OF CLASSES:

- •Qualifying classes and Walk Trot Championships may be split at the discretion of the horse show management and will be posted outside the horse show office prior to the start of the session. Each section will be pinned.
- •Qualifying classes with more than 24 entries will automatically be split.
- •Championship classes being split will have a call back to pin one champion. Splits will be posted outside the horse show office prior to the start of the session.
- Management reserves the right to split a class due to concerns for safety of horses and/or exhibitors.
- •Procedure: A class list will be run in numerical order. The office will split the class by circling every other entry starting at the top of the page. Those circled will be in the second half of the class; those not circled will be in the first half of the class. Should the class have an uneven number of entries, the first half will be the section with one less entry. In the event a Post entry is accepted in the class, it will be put in the first section. The next post entry will be put in the second section, etc. If an even number of entries are in the class, any post entry, if accepted, will be put in the first section. The next post entry will be put in the second section.
- •Management reserves the right to refuse any additional (Post) entries once the class has been split.
- •It is the responsibility of exhibitors to check to see that they have been entered in the proper classes and split section.

STABLING

Stabling Policy: Stabling Committee shall assign stabling and will consider the following factors, not necessarily in this order: Length of time the exhibitor has supported the Show and/or NEMHA. Degree of support of the Show, and/or NEMHA by the exhibitor, give due regard to support by means of personal time & efforts, support by contribution of money and exhibition of horses. Whether prior stabling assignments to the exhibitor have been more preferred stabling or less preferred stabling. Judges and other officials who have given up preferred stabling to officiate will be eligible to receive comparable preferred stabling assignments in the year following their year of service to the show. In addition, possessing knowledge of history and location on an annual basis with careful consideration for the efficient use of the total available stalls. Only Management may reassign stalls. Reassignments may be necessary if an exhibitor cancels after stall assignments have been made or does not use all stalls assigned. Entries requesting to be stabled with a particular barn or trainer will not be considered unless your name appears on their stable list on their entry blank. We will do our best to meet these requests. However, decisions will be based on availability.

Permanent and temporary stalls (with doors) are available on a FIRST COME, FIRST SERVED BASIS. Stabling is prioritized for horses entered in the show.

Stalls: \$225.00

TACK STALL CHANGES

The chart represents the number of tack stalls available per entered horses, charged at the regular price of \$225.00. Stalls ordered over this number will be charged **\$450.00** per stall. A horse that is entered and then scratched must return the stall to management or be charged an additional \$225.00. You can request as few or as many as you want; this is the base number of allowed tack stalls at the lower rate. Management reserves the right to limit the number of tack stalls.

STALL PANEL REMOVAL POLICY

Stall panels may be removed by approved NEMHS Staff only. Please contact Show Manager. There will be a \$100.00 fee to put any stall panels back up and must be done by fairgrounds personnel.

VENDORS

Vendor Policy: Exclusive rights to perform as an official vendor on the show grounds shall be granted only by written contract signed by the Manager. Any exhibitor requiring an outside vendor to provide services normally provided by an official exclusive service provider (i.e., veterinarian, blacksmith, photographer, etc) shall notify the Manager with the name, service or merchandise to be provided and the time frame of the activity. IMPORTANT: Outside vendors must register with Management. Upon review by the Manager, a temporary license to conduct a specific venture may be provided. The Manager will determine the time and scope of the temporary license. All vendors must be properly licensed and provide acceptable insurance coverage. Any fees or percentages to be paid to the show will be determined by the Manager.

VIDEO REVIEWS

Videos will not be reviewed by Judges, Show Management or Stewards concerning class placings. Decisions of officials are final.

WHIPS

No item may be used inside or outside the ring while showing a horse except one whip per handler. Regulations of all whips will be in accordance with USEF rules applicable to the respective division. See GR803. LASH/LONGEING WHIPS ARE NOT ALLOWED IN ANY WARM-UP OR SHOW RING, VICTORY PASSES INCLUDED.

Carriage

- •Appropriate carriage driving customs, rules and traditions are to be followed. The Carriage Driving Division will be held in accordance with the most current USEF rules. It is the competitor's responsibility to be familiar with the current rules.
- •Divisions- **Open Division**: Open to all junior, adult and multiple drivers. **Limit Division**: Open to any horse or driver (junior, adult, multiples) not having won six (6) first place ribbons, which must include at least one first place ribbon from each of three (3) approved USEF carriage pleasure driving or ADS pleasure driving competitions.
- Entry: Entry is defined by horse and driver combination.
- Driver: Drivers may compete more than once on same course with a different horse. Grooms and passengers may compete as a driver in the same course. Junior drivers under the age of 14 must be accompanied by a knowledgeable adult driver capable of rendering assistance. All junior drivers must wear a properly fitted ASTM/SEI approved headgear with the chinstrap fastened always.
- Vehicle: Different vehicles may be used in different classes. It is the driver's responsibility to present the correct vehicle for measuring prior to any obstacle classes.
- No cantering is permitted in Carriage Driving classes. A break to canter is defined as three full strides if an advantage has been gained; six full strides if no advantage is being gained.
- Horse: Horses may compete more than once on the same obstacle course, but not in the same class (except as part of a multiple).
- Order of Go: Will be posted on the official carriage notice board, located in the carriage ring. Dressage and Reinsmanship will have a specified drive time. Management will do its best to accommodate conflicts with classes in the main ring. It is the competitor's responsibility to notify the carriage coordinator as soon as conflicts are identified. It is the competitor's responsibility to be ready to go when called. After a reasonable wait, management may announce that a time limit may be invoked. Some classes may be run back to back.
- High Point Awards will be tallied and posted, as the show progresses, at the Carriage Field. The Awards Presentation will be held Friday Afternoon at the end of the afternoon session.
- High Point Awards and Stake awards will consist of Champion Ribbon, Cooler, Neck Sash and Reserve Champion Ribbon & Neck Sash.
- CARRIAGE PLEASURE DRIVING WORKING. To be judged 70% on performance, manners and way of going of the horse(s); 20% on the condition and fit of harness and vehicle, 10% on neatness of attire. See CP218.
- CARRIAGE PLEASURE DRIVING REINSMANSHIP. To be judged 75% on handling of reins and whip, control, posture and overall appearance of driver, 25% on the condition of harness and vehicle and neatness of attire. See CP222.

- CARRIAGE PLEASURE DRIVING TURNOUT. To be judged: 70% on the condition, fit and appropriateness of harness and vehicle, spares and appointments, neatness and appropriateness of attire and overall impression; 30% on performance, manners and way of going. See CP217.
- DRIVEN DRESSAGE. Tests can be found at USEF.org

Hunter Over Fences

- Riders in all classes where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the show grounds must wear protective headgear. GR801.2.

Excessive speed at the hand gallop should be penalized. Light contact with the mouth is required. Horses should be obedient, alert, responsive and move freely. Horses should not be eliminated for slight errors. Horses entering the Under Saddle class must also be shown in at least one Over Fences class within that division.
- THE CHAMPION AND RESERVE CHAMPION HIGH POINT AWARD will be awarded to the top two of the four horses that acquired the most points in the over fences classes in each respective division. In addition to these points, only the top four horses receive points for ribbons won in the Under Saddle class for that division and is based upon a point system of 10, 6, 4, 2, 1, ½. Ties are broken per Hunter Rules, HU152; the horse scoring the most points over fences wins the tie; or, in the face of a tie after that, the horses are shown and judged as an Under Saddle class.
- SCHOOLING ROUNDS are included in the entry fee.
- HUNTER HACK. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Horses are then individually asked to jump two fences and hand gallop one way of the ring. Fences 1'6"-2'0".

- High Point Champion awards are based on the same horse/rider combinations, calculated on a point basis from the highest placings in the three classes offered. The Championship ceremony will be held in the Grandstand Ring. Time to be determined. ALL ELIGIBLE PARTICIPANTS ARE ECOURAGED TO ATTEND. You will automatically be entered in the Championship, no need to enter on the entry blank.
- Ties for first place may be worked off using the same pattern, order of go and scoring technique as was used in the event; however, there will not be more than one work off. 

- Safety of our young riders is of the utmost importance and classes may be split if entries warrant and/or there are any safety concerns.
- Horses may enter other classes in any Section, providing the requirements for that Section are met.
- Cross entering between Classic Pleasure and English Pleasure in the Walk Trot Section is not permitted.
