GENERAL RULES, REGULATIONS & INFORMATION

This Horse Show is conducted in accordance with the Rules of the USEF. The official Federation rulebook will prevail for this show. Each participant in this show is responsible for knowledge of these rules and is subject to these rules. Any changes or corrections of the rules will automatically become part of this prize list. Questions that may arise that are not covered by the USEF rulebook will be decided by the Show Committee and their decisions will be final.

Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

It is the exhibitor's responsibility to submit entries that do not constitute a violation of GR1304.

The Show Committee will not be responsible for any accident which may occur to any rider, driver, owner, groom or attendant, animal or equipment at the show. Nor will the Show committee be responsible for loss or destruction of any property or equipment or damages to or by any animals on exhibition at the show, grounds, or stabling area.

The Tri-State All Morgan Horse Show reserves the right to refuse any entry.

USEF Membership Statement

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules). Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding Classes.

AGE OF RIDER

The age of an individual on December 1 will be maintained throughout the entire competition year. (GR103)

Amateur rider/driver/handler must be at least 18 years old.

Ladies and Gentlemen rider/driver must be at least 18 years old.

Youth rider/driver must be 21 years old or younger.

Any junior exhibitor, ladies or gentlemen's class that does not have a dedicated championship shall qualify for the respective amateur championship when shown by an amateur in the qualifying class.

AMATEUR

An amateur is any exhibitor who cannot be defined as a professional. Only active Federation members may obtain amateur status. Every person who has reached his/ her 18th birthday and competes in classes for amateurs under Federation rules must possess the current amateur status issued by the Federation. (Exception: This is not required for Opportunity classes except for the Dressage Division if provided)

AMATEUR OWNED/TRAINED/SHOWN

Horses entered in Amateur Owner classes must be registered in the name of the competitor or a member of the competitor's family, as defined by rule MO104.9. (Horses registered in a farm/ranch/syndicate/partnership/corporation name may be shown in Amateur Owner classes provided the family is the sole owner of the farm or entity as defined by GR122). The sale of a horse does not eliminate this registration requirement. (Contract of Sale or Bill of Sale will not be accepted.) In the case of a junior exhibitor, the parent or guardian must sign.

ARRIVALS AND DEPARTURES

Horses will be officially admitted to the grounds at 8am Tuesday June 25, 2024 at \$115 per stall. Horses may arrive as early as 5 PM Monday June 24, 2024, arrivals on Monday will be charged an additional \$30 per stall, all stalls in a stabling assignment will be charged this fee regardless of how many stalls are in use on that day. Use includes horses, bedding, equipment, tack, curtains, or mats.

CAMPERS

All campers parked on the show grounds must pay \$50 per day/\$200 per week to Tri-State All Morgan. Call or text Amy at 440-479-8503 and she will direct you to your spot. Camper parking passes may be obtained from the show secretary and must be purchased prior to parking. Camping passes must always be displayed on the camper in plain sight. All campers that are found not to have purchased a parking pass will be subject to a \$100.00 fine and towed at the owner's expense.

CHAMPIONSHIPS

Horses must be shown in qualifying classes in order to show back in the championships and must be entered a minimum of one-half hour before the session starts.

CHECKS RETURNED/DECLINED CREDIT CARDS

All checks returned for insufficient funds or credit cards declined for any reason will be charged a \$45 handling fee and must be replaced by a certified check or cashier's check. No one will be allowed to show if he/she has a returned check, declined credit card or handling fee outstanding.

CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

Exhibitors are warned that any action of discourtesy or disobedience to the officials, on the part of the owner, rider or driver, will disqualify the horse. Exhibitors will be held fully responsible for any damage or discourtesy caused by their employees or guests. The management reserves itself the right to remove any groom, horse, owner, rider or driver from the show, without being liable for compensation. No exhibitor shall approach a judge with regard to a decision unless he or she first obtains permission from the steward who shall arrange an appointment with the judge at an appropriate time and place and under no circumstances, while any session of the show is in progress.

All riders, drivers and attendants must be appropriately dressed in all classes. In classes that show collectively, two minutes will be allowed after the first horse enters the ring. At the end of the two minutes, the gate will be closed, and the class will proceed.

A starting order will be established in classes in which horses compete individually and a maximum of one minute will be allowed for entry to enter the ring. The class is considered complete when the cards are handed to the ringmaster or announcer.

CROSS ENTRIES

Cross entries will be accepted in any class as long as USEF shoeing regulations are followed.

DOGS AND OTHER PETS

All pets must be on a leash of 6 foot or less. Pet owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their pets' behaviors. Please clean up after your pets. The show management will enforce the order and we ask you to cooperate.

DRESSAGE

All tests will be ridden in a standard size (20x60m) arena. USDF and WDAA memberships are not required. Post entries will only be accepted if there is available space. Test of choice classes may be entered more than once for each horse/ rider but must be a different test for each ride. Ride times will be posted in the office by NOON on Thursday. Best efforts will be made to accommodate riders competing in the main and dressage rings, but cannot be guaranteed. Championships will be offered at each level. To be eligible, exhibitors must enter the championship class and show in a minimum of 2 tests from that level, one of which must be the highest test of that level. Championships will be calcuated based on the average of the horse/rider combination's two highest scores, one of which must be from the highest test of that level. In the case of a tie, the combination with the highest score on the highest test of the level will prevail.

ENTRIES

One owner per Entry Blank. Entry Blanks must be completed in full, signed and accompanied by full payment. All entries wishing to stable together must be submitted together.

Membership for classes where they are required will be verified electronically; however, you may be required to present a copy of your card or papers if they are unable to be verified.

Cash, check or credit card may be used to pay for entries. A 4% convenience fee will be applied to all card payments.

If the owner or exhibitor is under 18 years of age, the Entry Blank must be signed by a representative who is of age and who, by such a signature, individually assumes responsibility and risk as stated above the signature. The Show assumes no responsibility, and this shall be a condition of entry.

Closing Date of Entries: ENTRIES MUST BE RECEIVED BY JUNE 7,2024.

Entries after this date will be assessed a \$30 per horse late entry fee.

ALL POST ENTRIES FOR ANY CLASS WILL CLOSE ONE HALF HOUR PRIOR TO THE START OF THE FIRST CLASS OF THE SESSION IN WHICH THE CLASS IS TO BE SHOWN. ANY CHANGE OF ENTRY WILL BE HANDLED AS A POST ENTRY. PLEASE NOTE SHOW OFFICE HOURS AS POSTED.

Entry fees for scratched classes cannot be transferred or refunded. Please be sure you are entering the correct class.

No horse will be allowed to enter the show ring without having a back number issued and a payment on file in the show office.

All checks returned for insufficient funds will be charged a \$45.00 handling fee and must be replaced by a certified or cashier's check.

FEED AND BEDDING

All bedding should be ordered from Amy Snyder and will be delivered to your stalls. Final bedding orders are due by 4pm on Friday June 14, 2024. No bedding will be available for delivery on Saturday.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: STATE OF OHIO

Each equine brought into Ohio:

Shall be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection issued at the point of origin immediately prior to entering Indiana, certifying that they have been given a careful, clinical inspection and been found free of symptoms of any dangerously infectious, contagious, communicable disease or known exposure thereto. Rectal temperature at the time of examination must be recorded on the certificate of veterinary inspection and If twelve months of age or more, shall be accompanied by evidence that the identified animal was negative to an official test for the disease, equine infectious anemia, conducted by a laboratory approved by the United States Department of Agriculture. This test must have been conducted within the twelvemonth period preceding the date of importation into Ohio. Proof of vaccination

must pre present either on the health certificate or documented on separate letterhead from the prescribing veterinarian.

HOLDS

All hold requests must be made to the show office a minimum of 1 hour prior to the start of the session. All approved holds will not be cancelled. Holds will be 2 minutes duration.

HEADERS

All headers must be a minimum of 16 years of age and should be suitably dressed to enter the show ring.

HELMETS

Riders must wear ASTM/SEI approved headgear with properly fitting harness in the following:

Hunter Seat Equitation classes, including Walk/Trot Leadline riders at all times when mounted.

Protective headgear is acceptable in any other division or class without penalty by the judge. See GR801.4.

HORSE REGISTRATION

Horses shown in this division must be registered with the American Morgan Horse Association, Inc., or an organization having registry reciprocity, (Canadian Morgan Horse Association, British Morgan Horse Society, Swedish Morgan Horse Society.) Horses must be entered under their full registered name or if under one year of age be eligible for registration. Horses must be entered under the names of the owner(s) or lessee of record. A copy of the registration papers showing recorded ownership or proof of lease must be submitted with entry form at the time of making entry. Competition management is responsible for notifying exhibitors of this requirement. 2. Canadian horses born after January 1, 1985, can be shown with Canadian registration papers as long as the papers do not state "not eligible for U.S. reciprocity." 3. Owners (lessees), riders, drivers, handlers, coaches, and trainers of horses participating at Federation licensed competitions in all Morgan sections must be current members in good standing with the American Morgan Horse Association, Inc., or an organization having registry reciprocity (or pay a nonmember fee. Set fees shall be payable to AMHA.) An original or a copy of the membership card must be

provided to the competition unless the competition, at their discretion, confirms membership electronically with one of these organizations. Lessees are considered owners in connection with this membership requirement. In the event of an entry under multiple ownerships, only one owner need be a member. Exceptions: Exhibitors in Lead line and/or Walk-Trot classes are exempt from this membership requirement. Additionally, a parent/guardian when only signing an entry blank for a minor is not required to be a member or pay a nonmember fee. 4. In classes for Maiden, Novice or Limit horses, ribbons won as a driving horse within a section do not count when reckoning the status of the horse as a driving horse in another Section. In classes for Maiden, Novice or Limit horses, ribbons won as a saddle horse within a section do not count when reckoning the status of the horse as a saddle horse in another Section. Ribbons won as a driving horse do not count when reckoning the status of a saddle horse and visa versa. 5. In classes for Maiden, Novice or Limit riders, ribbons won in any saddle class of any

Division or Section shall count in reckoning the status as a rider. In classes for Maiden, Novice or Limit drivers, ribbons won in any driving class of any Division or Section shall count in reckoning the status as a driver. (MO101)

JUNIOR/NOVICE/LIMIT

A junior horse is defined as four years old and under as of January 1. Maiden, Novice and Limit classes are limited to horses which have not won one/ three/six first place ribbons respectively.

MOTOR VEHICLE STATEMENT USEF Motorized Vehicle Statement

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a

parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

PERSONS NOT IN GOOD STANDING

Persons who are not in good standing with AMHA, this Show or any Regional Show may not participate in this Show, whether as an exhibitor, owner, trainer or otherwise. This policy includes all horses registered in the name of any such person, whether leased or under contract for sale. Procedures have been established to resolve any disputes concerning accounts with AMHA, this Show or any Regional Show.

PREMIUMS AND AWARDS

All prize money will be mailed to the owner of record within 30 days after the show.

Prize money will be withheld from exhibitors who do not have a clear account. Premiums will be paid as follows:

REFUNDS

Only those exhibitors canceling entries in writing by prior to closing date of entries shall be entitled to have entry fees returned less the 25.00 office fee. Horses withdrawn from a class without a certificate from the official horse show vet after arrival on the grounds will forfeit their fees. This certificate must be on file with the Secretary of the show no later than the day the class is scheduled. STALL FEES ARE NON-REFUNDABLE.

RING PROCEDURE AND CONDUCT

In class that horses compete collectively, entries will be allowed a maximum of two (2) minutes to enter the ring from the time which the first horse enters the ring. A starting order will be established in classes which horses compete when the card is handed to the ringmaster or announcer. All riders, drivers, and attendants must be appropriately dressed in all classes.

SAFE SPORT STATEMENT

Effective immediately, any competition with the start date of September 1, 2020 and later will be required to include the following Safe Sport statement in the Rules and Regulation section of the prize list: Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org

SHARPS

Competition management shall place a minimum of one sharps container per each competition, whether or not stabling is provided, additionally, at least one sharps container per fifty occupied stalls for the disposal of needles and other sharp instruments in convenient locations in barns housing competition horses. It is the competition management's responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. Competition management may fine any individual including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposal instruments.

SMOKING


No person will be permitted to smoke in any building on the show grounds at any time as per Ohio State Law

CLASS SPECIFICATIONS

MORGAN DIVISION

USEF (Chapter MO) EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH. Specifically, Chapter MO; Morgan Horse Division.

Horses shown in this division must be registered with the American Morgan Horse Association, Inc., or the Canadian Morgan Horse Association, or the British Morgan Horse Society and must be entered under their full registered names or if under one year of age be eligible for registration. Canadian horses born before January 1, 1985 must be registered with the American Morgan Horse Association, Inc., or have Canadian Morgan Horse Club registration papers showing as American registration number. Canadian horses born after January 1, 1985 can be shown with Canadian Registration papers as long as the papers do not state "not eligible for U.S. reciprocity".

Stallions are prohibited in Ladies and Junior Exhibitor classes. One attendant without whip must head each horse in the Park Harness and Pleasure Driving classes. Cross entering is allowed between Classic Pleasure and all other English Pleasure and Pleasure Driving provided requirements are met with USEF.

The purpose of Ranch Pleasure should reflect the versatility, attitude, and movement of a working horse. The horse's performance should simulate a horse working outside the confines of an arena and that of a working ranch horse. This class should show the horse's ability to work at a forward, working speed while under control of the rider. Light contact should be rewarded and the horse shall not be shown on a full drape of reins. The overall manners and responsiveness of the horse while performing the maneuver requirements and the horse's quality of movement are the primary considerations.

Horses should NOT perform or be rewarded for performing gaits as they do in Western Pleasure. The horses are to be presented in a more forward-moving style than the typical Western Pleasure Horse. The horse and rider will be scored on movement, which is cadence and rhythm of gaits, smoothness and consistency in performance, along with how they perform the optional maneuvers. For rules regarding correct Western appointments, refer to MO132.

The required gait maneuvers will include the walk, jog, and lope both directions; and the extended jog and extended lope going at least one direction; as well as stops, and a back. Optional maneuvers are side pass, turns of 360 degrees or more, change of lead (simple or flying), walk, jog or lope over a pole(s); or some combination of maneuvers that would be reasonable for a ranch horse to perform.

RANCH RIDING: Each horse will work individually, performing both required and optional maneuvers, and scored on the basis of 0 to 100, with 70 denoting an average performance.

RANCH PLEASURE: Horses will work as a group on the rail and will be asked to perform the required maneuvers only.

The overall cadence and performance of the gaits should be free-flowing and ground covering at all gaits, with an emphasis on forward movement. Transitions should be performed where designated, with smoothness and responsiveness.

WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree to be bound and abide by the rules, regulations, and policies of USEF as published in the USEF Rule Book and on the website at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves inherent risks and dangers. "Inherent risk of an equine activity" means a danger or condition that is an integral part of an equine activity, including, but not limited to, any of the following: (a) The propensity of an equine to behave in ways that may result in injury, death, or loss to persons on or around the equine; (b) The unpredictability of an equine's reaction to sounds, sudden movement, unfamiliar objects, persons, or other animals; (c) Hazards, including, but not limited to, surface or subsurface conditions; (d) A collision with another equine, another animal, a person, or an object; (e) The potential of an equine activity participant to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury, death, or loss to the person of the participant or to other persons, including, but not limited to, failing to maintain control over an equine or failing to act within the ability of the participant; (f) the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; (g) loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; (h) exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; (i) contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; (j) adverse weather conditions; (k) facilities issues and premises conditions; (l) failure of protective equipment (including helmets); (m) inadequate safety measures; (n) participants of varying skill levels; (o) situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers a

EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT WARNING:
