

COVID-19 Action Plan

GENERAL COVID PROTOCOL: We plan to implement several modifications to the shows to facilitate physical distancing, including, but not limited to:


- Prior to the show, please check your entry confirmation and provide any items needed to complete entry. Entry must be COMPLETE prior to competition.
- Number packets will be on a table outside of office.
- Face coverings or masks should be carried by all on show grounds to use when in areas that distancing
 is not possible.
- Scoring is live streaming to FoxVillage.com and at the show office. Tests will be available for pick up on table out side of show office.
- Prepackaged snack foods and water will be available complementary, throughout show.

SHOW CANCELLATION POLICY

Please be aware of our show's good faith cancellation policy.

- Factors outside of show management's control may cause a show to be interrupted, stopped or cancelled. Factors include, but are not limited to, human communicable disease, equine communicable disease, directive from USEF, or other. If a show must be cancelled in advance due to reasons outside of show management's control, management will execute a good faith refund policy.
- If show management deems it necessary to cancel a show for any reason in advance of the competition, submitted entry fees will be handled as follows: * Organization fees (USEF, USDF) refunded in full * Stabling fees—refunded in full * Show management will endeavor to refund to entrants as much of their show fees as possible. * Office Fees— not refunded.
- Shows are held "rain or shine". No refunds are given for any of the following weather conditions: heat, cold, rain, wind, lightning, air quality or other environmental conditions. Conditions may cause interruptions or show stoppage due to safety concerns. A competitor is free to choose to scratch, when a competitor choses to scratch or cancel the entry, no refund will be due.

Therapeutic Riding Guidelines for WDAA EXCEPTIONAL RIDER TESTS

- This class is for riders with special needs (not limited to physical disabilities only). Classes
 may be split between youth and adult if entries warrant.
- Tack and Apparel: Western tack and attire may be used. Specific equipment needed for adaptive use to assure safety is permitted. A description of the adaptive equipment must be listed on the entry form with rider information.
 - a No chain lead ropes are permitted. The lead rope may be attached to the noseband of the bridle or a halter or cavesson that is properly fitted and worn underneath or over the bridle. Under NO circumstances may the lead rope be attached directly to the bit. Attaching the lead rope to the bit will result in immediate disqualification.
 - b. An ASTMI approved riding helmet must be worn by riders at all times while mounted or on ground accompanying any equine.

3. Rider Assistance:

Leadline Tests:

The rider may have a leader and up to two side-walkers as required for the safety and security of the rider. These assistants must be approved by the instructor/owner of the horse. Assistants will not be provided by the show location and must have signed show grounds waiver.

- <u>LEADER</u>: The leader must safely control the riders mount. They may guide the horse
 and must maintain safe control of the mount at all times. They are not permitted to pull
 or tug the horse in any direction unless for safety reasons. Leaders are permitted to
 help the rider guide the horse, if they are physically incapable of doing so. The leader
 may not give any coaching towards the rider, their job is to have complete control of the
 mount.
- <u>SIDEWALKER</u>: Each sidewalker must stay at the seat position of the rider while the
 rider is mounted. Their job is to ensure the riders balance and safety. They are
 permitted to keep physical contact with the rider for assistance and safety. The
 sidewalker is not permitted to physically touch the horse for any "push" or forward
 movement. One sidewalker is allowed to coach the rider while mounted if there is no
 COACH present in the arena.
- <u>COACH</u>: A coach is permitted to call the test and help give direction from either letter E
 or B at the side of the arena.

Coached Tests:

The rider may have a coach but NO leader or sidewalkers in order to ride in the "Coached" level therapeutic western dressage tests. The coach must be an instructor of the rider and must have signed a show grounds liability waiver to participate.

- <u>COACH:</u> A coach is permitted in the arena with the rider and mount to assure safety of
 the rider and to help guide and focus the rider. The coach must be at least ten feet
 away from the rider while performing a dressage test. The coach is only permitted to
 physically help the rider or horse if there are safety concerns or the rider is having
 physical inability to finish the test. The coach may help the rider with verbal guidance
 and encouragement.
- 4. Coaching is allowed by the instructor, coach, or sidewalker ONLY.
- Reins may be attached to the bit, bit-less bridle, side rings of the halter, bosal, or sidepull.
 Reins may or may not be attached to the bit depending the rider's ability. Rider must keep control of the reins to the best of their physical ability.
- 6. Rider must make an effort to keep his/her feet in the stirrups at all times unless they do not normally do so by instruction. Adaptive footwear is allowed but must be listed on entry form.
- 7. Disqualification: At the judge's discretion, the rider may be disqualified in the event that the judge feels that there is a safety issue. This includes but is not limited to: if the horse has an obvious illness/ lameness issue, unsafe tack or equipment, is unsportsman-like, or any other reason the judge seems fit.
- 8. A liability release must be signed at each individual show grounds.
- 9. JUDGING: Horse and rider will be judged on
 - a. Connection of rider and mount. How well is the communication between the rider (at the best of their abilities) and how does the mount respond to the connection and communication of the rider.
 - b. Balance/Effort/Equitation of the rider: Rider effort to perform to the best of their abilities in order to successfully execute each maneuver of the test being performed. The rider's equitation and balance in their position on the mount with or without assistance.
 - c. Accuracy of maneuvers: The successful completion and execution of each maneuver given in the test being performed.
 - d. Gaits/Responsiveness of Mount: Quality and regularity, freedom of movement of the horse under the conditions of the test being performed. How well does the horse respond to the maneuvers being asked with the quality expected of a dressage horse BUT ALSO how well the horse can perform this quality while also being responsive to the needs of the rider.



It is the responsibility of all attendees to foster a spirit of belongingness, an atmosphere of community enjoyment, and a mutual respect for all participants and their equine partners.

All attendees must commit to the following oath:

In representation of the participants at this event, I promise to respect and abide by the governing rules of the Interscholastic Equestrian Association and to represent myself, my team, and this association in the spirit of good horsemanship and honorable competition.

Dressage Individual Class Descriptions

i=individual T=team

D1i. Varsity Open Dressage Test

Test: IEA Open Rider Test

Open to riders in grades 9-12 who are not other eligible for the Varsity Intermediate, or lower, divisions. Riders must be able to walk, trot, canter & halt in a group class. Riders participating in Varsity Open Dressage Test are expected to compete throughout the season in Varsity Open Dressage Seat Equitation. To be eligible for post season competitions (individual or team) riders must have accumulated the required points and participated in a minimum of two (2) Varsity Open Dressage Seat Equitation classes during the regular season.

D3i. Varsity Intermediate Dressage Test

Test: IEA Intermediate Rider Test

Open to riders in grades 9-12. This division is open to all riders who have not competed in a recognized or schooling dressage competitions at Second level. Riders must be able to walk, trot, canter & halt in a group class. Riders may not have competed in the FEI 5 year old test or above. Riders may not have been rated B or higher by the United States Pony Clubs, Inc. Riders who have won 10 or more blue ribbons in jumping events at 3'3" or higher must be placed in the Open Varsity Division. These riders should be capable of performing Dressage Seat Equitation Tests 1-11 Riders participating in Varsity Intermediate Dressage Test are expected to compete throughout the season in Varsity Intermediate Dressage Seat Equitation or Varsity Open Dressage Seat Equitation. To be eligible for post season competitions (individual or team) riders must have accumulated the required points and participated in a minimum of two (2) Varsity Intermediate Dressage Seat Equitation at classes during the regular season.

D5i. JV Novice Dressage Test

Test: IEA Novice Rider Test

Open to riders in grades 9-12. This division is open to all riders who have not competed in 6 or more first level tests or competed at a level higher than first level in any recognized or schooling dressage competition guidelines on equivalent FEI and foreign federation tests. Riders may not have competed in the FEI 4 year old test or above. Riders may not have been rated C+, C-3 or higher by the United States Pony Clubs, Inc. Riders must be able to walk, trot, canter & halt in a group class. These riders should be capable of performing Dressage Seat Equitation Tests 1-7. Riders participating in JV Novice Dressage Test are expected to compete throughout the season in JV Novice Dressage Seat Equitation or Varsity Intermediate Dressage Seat Equitation. To be eligible for post season competitions (individual or team) riders must have accumulated the required points and participated in a minimum of two (2) JV Novice Dressage Seat Equitation or Varsity Intermediate Dressage Seat Equitation classes during the regular season.

Dressage Seat Equitation Classes

D2i. Varsity Open Dressage Seat Equitation

Open to riders in grades 9-12. Riders must be able to walk, trot, canter & halt in a group class. These riders should be capable of performing Dressage Seat Equitation Tests 1-14.

D4i. Varsity Intermediate Dressage Seat Equitation

Open to riders in grades 9-12. Riders must be able to walk, trot, canter & halt in a group class. These riders should be capable of performing Dressage Seat Equitation Tests 1-11.

D6i. JV Novice Dressage Seat Equitation

Open to riders in grades 9-12. Riders must be able to walk, trot, canter & halt in a group class. These riders should be capable of performing Dressage Seat Equitation Tests 1-7.

D7i. JV Beginner Dressage Seat Equitation - Walk/Trot/Canter

Open to riders in grades 9-12. This division is open to any rider that has not competed in 6 training level test or competed at a level higher than training, in any recognized or schooling dressage competition; including those recognized by USDF, USEF or USEA. Riders may not have been rated C-2 above by the United States Pony Clubs, Inc. Riders must be experienced enough to canter on an unfamiliar animal in a group. To be eligible for Class 7, a rider must have had at least one year continuous professional instruction, must demonstrate proficiency at the trot and canter, and be capable of competing on a variety of unfamiliar horses. These riders should be capable of performing Dressage Seat Equitation Tests 1-6. Riders may not enter cross-enter into class Class 8 Walk/Trot.

Dressage Rider Tests for DSE Classes

A rider must be prepared to perform the test appropriate for the Dressage Seat Equitation class in which the rider is participating. Riders may be requested to perform the following tests collectively or individually during a show or competition. A dressage judge may choose from the following list, using tests 1-5 for the Beginner Walk/Trot classes, 1-6 for the Beginner Walk/Trot/Canter classes, 1-7 for the Novice classes, 1 - 11 for the Intermediate classes and 1-14 for the Open classes.

WHEREAS, I recognize and agree that the equine professional(s) at SVE has/have made reasonable and prudent efforts to determine my ability to engage in the "Equine Activity", and has/have sufficient knowledge of my equine and horseback riding skills as for me to relieve, release and hold harmless said equine professional(s) from any continuing duty to monitor my Equine Activities.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of being granted access and/or use of the facilities of this show and for other good and valuable consideration, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, I agree as follows:

- 1. Assumption of the Risk. The remaining provisions of this Agreement, however, shall continue in full force and effect, and to the extent required, shall be modified to preserve their validity.

Emergency Response Protocol

In case of Emergency/Accident

- 1. Do not move the patient or horse.
- 2. Call for the EMT and TD.
- 3. Secure a loose horse.
- 4. EMT will evaluate the patient and determine status.
- 5. If required EMT will call 9-1-1.
- 6. A "Silent Role" will be requested of the Paramedics when approaching the showgrounds.
- 6. Ring Steward will move all obstacles for ambulance access. And keep spectators away from the scene.
- 7. Safety Coordinator will keep the road clear and direct the Paramedics to the accident site.
- 8. The Show will hold until all emergency vehicles have left & the show staff has resumed their positions.

After Emergency has been controlled

- 1. The Manager will resume the competition when possible. The needs of the injured person and/or horse take precedence over the resumption of the competition.
- 2. The TD will begin investigating the emergency and preparing required reports.
- 3. If contacted by News Media, no names will be released. A general statement may be made that an accident has occurred resulting in injury and is still under investigation.
- 4. The TD will call USEF in the event of a serious accident or fatality.

In case of a Tornado, Bad Storm or other emergencies requiring safe shelter, all attendance on the grounds should seek shelter.
