For live shows each horse/rider combo will be limited to 2 rides per show day. If extra are available it will be posted on Facebook and will be assigned on a first come, first serve basis.

Each Western dressage test may be ridden only once.

A horse may only be shared between two people, for a total of 4 rides per day.

Awards 1st-8th and high percentage awards

Youth HP: Intro English, Training Level & higher, WD Intro, WD Basic & higher.

Adult HP: Intro English, Training Level, First Level & higher, Intro WD, Basic WD, Level One & higher

Classes will be split in Adult and Youth divisions

Versatility challenge will be held at the July show

WDAA and/or AQHA riders must wear approved show attire. All others, attire may be approved show or schooling attire.

Virtual Show Info:

Spring Virtual: Entries open 4/1/23 to 4/28/23, videos due 5/8/23

Fall Virtual: Entries open 8/1/23 to 9/1/23, videos due 9/10/23

There is no ride limit for the virtual shows.

Awards 1st-6th, high percentage awards and versatility awards.

Virtual show attire: approved show or schooling attire. Lifetime points WDAA riders must wear approved attire.

**New for 2023, you must be a CMHA member to show at the live shows in June, July and August. Virtual shows will be open to members and non-members.

**To qualify for year end awards, each horse/rider combination must receive a minimum of 6 qualifying scores in each division. For Sporthorse In Hand you must show under a minimum of 2 of the 3 judges. For more year end qualification information please see the Year End Awards file on the Facebook page.

Ride times will be posted on our Facebook page the Tuesday before the show by 10pm and will be posted at the show on Friday afternoon. If there is a conflict with your ride times you must contact the show manager before noon on Wednesday for accommodations to be made.

All stall assignments will be posted on the CMHA All Breed Horse Shows Facebook page by Thursday evening and will be posted at the show grounds. Shaving are available for purchase from the fairgrounds. Stalls are 10x10 and hard packed dirt. Stalls assignments are typically in the Dairy Barn.

Dogs are welcome but please keep them on a six foot leash.

Arrival of horses and campers anytime after 9am on Friday morning.

Helmets are required for all youth riding in English attire but are recommended for all exhibitors.

CMHA and their sponsors are not responsible for losses or accidents that may occur.

Show will run rain or shine as scheduled. Unless otherwise noted the dressage classes will run in the lower arena.

All intro, training and basic tests will be ridden in the 20x40 arena. First level and higher will be ridden in the 20x60 arena.

All live judges will Be American Quarter Horse Association (AQHA) approved for Classical Dressage. Joanne Coy will be AQHA approved for Classical and Western Dressage. Please clean up around your trailer and leave the grounds as clean as they were when you arrived. If you are showing from you trailer please do not park in the camping areas. Horses may be tied to the trailer on any hard packed area or the areas that do not have electrical hookups available. Please clean up after yourself and your horse to help us keep the fairgrounds clean.

Concession stand is available onsite.

If you plan on attending the open show portion, stalls and camping can be paid for at the show but dressage classes must be entered and paid for prior to the show.

Please practice good sportsmanship and be courteous to other exhibitors and staff.
