Adult Amateur Classes (AA): Participants must possess a current WDAA and USEF Amateur Card and qualify under the USEF Amateur rules. Open to Adult Amateurs only; riders must compete as adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which the reach the age of 22. Junior/ Young Rider Classes: Open to Junior and Young Riders only; must possess a current WDAA card; any rider is eligible until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 17.

Open Classes: Open classes are for all participants. Must possess a current WDAA card.

Opportunity Classes: Riders/Horses competing only in "opportunity" classes are exempt from membership requirements and do not have to pay non- member, horse ID, or USEF drug fees. Owners, Trainers, and Coaches are exempt from membership requirements for these classes only. Scores earned in opportunity classes may not be used towards USEF/WDAA awards programs. These classes must follow all USEF Dressage Division rules and applicable USEF General Rules, including dress and saddlery.

Class Restrictions:

-Horses are limited to a maximum of four rides per day.

- Horses may enter no more than two consecutive levels, Freestyle levels included, at any one competition.
- -Horses may be ridden by two riders. Each horse/rider combination requires a separate entry with all signatures and emergency contact. WD 102
- -No horse may be ridden in the same class number more than once (even with a different rider) per WD 102.2
- -Horse/Rider combinations showing in walk/jog rail classes are not eligible for other rail classes or any test other than Introductory Level (Different horse/rider combinations are eligible for other rail classes and tests).
- -Horses may only compete in levels that are adjacent with the same rider. For example, a horse may not be ridden in a basic level test and a level two test UNLESS with a different rider. WD 102
- -To be eligible to show in Introductory classes a horse and rider combination must have NOT shown in Level 1 or above in this competition year.

Exceptional Rider Division – (Exhibition)

• **Physically Challenged classes** (use standard WDAA tests) Open to individuals with a diagnosed significant physical disability. A WDAA Statement of Eligibility for Exceptional Rider Classes form is required to show in these classes. This form should be sent in or uploaded to an online entry (Form can be found below entry blank in this prize list.)

• Therapeutic Rider classes (use WDAA Therapeutic Rider tests) Open to individuals with a diagnosed physical, social, or emotional disability. A WDAA Statement of Eligibility for Exceptional Rider Classes form is required to show in these classes. This form should be sent in or uploaded to an online entry (Form can be found below entry blank in this prize list.)

Horses and riders entered only in the Exceptional Rider Division are exempt from USEF membership requirements, and do not have to pay non-member (show pass). Federation and drug fees do not apply.

Horses entered only in these classes are still subject to and must comply with the Drugs and Medication rules and are subject to drug testing. Participants must abide by all USEF regulations pertaining to attire, tack, and equipment for the recognized show. Reference GR120 for additional information. Exceptional riders may not cross enter between Physically Challenged and Therapeutic classes.

Current Rules: The rules may have changed from the current WDAA / USEF Rule Book. It is the competitor's responsibility to check the current WDAA / USEF Rule Book for any changes. Current Rules can be found on <u>www.USEF.org</u> <u>www.westerndressageassociation.org</u> Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current WDDA / USEF rulebook will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

Stabling: Temporary stalls with doors, stall size 12x12.

Arenas: A sand/fiber mixture footing is used in both arenas. All classes will be conducted in a standard size arena (20 x 60) unless posted otherwise. Designated lunging arenas will be posted by management prior to the start of the competition.

Entry Information:

Entry Information Requirement: Competitors are responsible to include a copy of all memberships for horse, owner, rider, and trainer listed on entry form. **NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED WITHOUT MEMBERSHIP CARD COPIES & COGGINS. No horse** will be permitted on the grounds without proof of vaccinations for Equine Influenza Virus & Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) within 6 months prior to arriving. Rule GR845

Entries must be received by Midnight of the closing date in the time zone of the competition. Any entry requiring a signature, payment, or copies of proof of valid membership will be considered incomplete and may incur additional fees.

No refunds after the closing date, for any reason.

- All fees must be paid in US funds. Fees must accompany the entry form for each show entered. Entries not accompanied by fees will be considered late and not entered until fees are received including any late or post entry fees.
- Entries postmarked or submitted after closing date will be considered late. Numbers will not be given out until entries have been submitted to the show AND owners, riders and coaches or trainers have signed all entry blanks.

All entries for Open Classes are taken on a first come, first served basis. Only one horse-rider combination per entry form Late Entries: Late entries will be accepted after the closing date if space is available, upon payment of an additional late entry fee. Post Entries for: Entries will be accepted to fill scratches, up to the start of competition, if scheduling permits. No late entry fee will be required but will be required to pay a post entry fee in addition to the normal class fee.

Policy for Accepting Post Entries and Filling Scratches in classes: Must be eligible for class. Must have previously entered in competition as a competing or non-competing horse. Must register with secretary and put name on wait list. Post entries in national classes will only be accepted to fill scratches in allotted time slots that are available ("allotted time" slots are determined by the Official schedule posted at the show office). Exceptions will be made when two or more competitors meet the same criteria and are deemed equal in priority status. Exceptions may also be made when conditions are created by weather or other natural disasters. **Online entries** are accepted at <u>www.Horse</u>ShowOffice.com

Musical Freestyles: Music must be in an MP3 format and must be presented to the show office at least two hours before scheduled ride. The schedule for sound checks will be posted at the show. Sound checks will be scheduled the Friday afternoon prior to the start of the competition at 3pm unless otherwise scheduled with competition management.

Cancellation prior to or on closing date - entire entry **minus** office fee. **Weather/Acts of God/Accidents or Emergency Policy:** Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, Accidents or Emergencies. No refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, Accidents or Emergencies.

NO REFUNDS FOR ANY REASON AFTER CLOSING DATE.

All fees collected on behalf of WDAA / USEF to be submitted to the Federation provided all outstanding show fees are paid in full; else it will be applied to those fees.

Weather/Acts of God/Accidents or Emergency Policy: Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, Accidents or Emergencies. No refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, Accidents or Emergencies.

No Shows: All "No Shows" that have not contacted the show office will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show and time slots may be filled. Exhibitors enter with this understanding and agreement.

Membership/Registration Requirements: Riders/Owners/Trainers/Coaches must be current WDAA members, and any rider competing as an amateur must have a USEF amateur status card/membership.

Awards for USEF Classes: Divisions (Jr/Yr, AA, Open) may be run concurrently as one class. Divisions will be pinned separately. Riders must clearly specify their division choice. When no designation is made, riders will automatically be entered as open. Riders may enter only one division per class. Ribbons to sixth for each class. Champion and Reserve ribbon awarded for the highest percentage at each per division (Open/Adult Amateur/Jr) for the weekend.

Additional Award Programs: Scores earned at this show count towards the following award programs (it is optional to participate in these programs):

• *USEF Horse of the Year Awards:* This show counts toward USEF Western Dressage Horse of the Year points. It is optional to participate in this program. If you choose to do so, you must have all the appropriate USEF horse registrations and owner/rider memberships and be enrolled in the Program. For more information, please contact <u>www.usef.org</u>. Please provide horse, rider and Owner USEF numbers on the entry blank.

Awards Notice: It is the responsibility of the competitor to retrieve any awards obtained during the competition. Unclaimed awards will be assumed unwanted unless other arrangements are made prior to the completion of the competition.

Bedding: Additional shavings are available for purchase at \$10. order can be included with entry.

Protective Headgear Rule: From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses and those competing in all classes and tests must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must be immediately prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted.

Important notice to all affected parties: Third parties may come upon the property or enter the facilities where any herein described or listed event will occur; provided, that this is a license to enter the premises, for the purpose of observing or participating in the event, but not otherwise, and such license to any individual is subject to revocation by the owner, lessee or organizer, and entry for any purpose other than granted herein, shall be deemed criminal trespass and subject to appropriate legal proceedings.

Numbers must be worn at all times when a horse is being exercised or ridden.

Show Management reserves the right to vary or add officials and refuse any entry for a cause; to disqualify any exhibitor and/or his or her horse for cause; to cause an exhibitor to forfeit his or her ribbons and winnings for cause; to return any entry and/or stall fee before or during the show for cause; all without being liable for damage or compensation. Show management reserves the right to make any changes deemed necessary for the safe and efficient conduct of this competition.

Sharps Disposal: Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. Containers are located in the show office for proper needle disposal. **Dogs:** Facility rules require that dogs must be on a leash (not to exceed 6 feet in length) or suitably restrained in a tack stall/cage etc. Loose animals/animals left in vehicles in distress, etc. can and will be removed from the grounds at the owner's expense.

Photography/Videography: This Flight Line Dressage show uses a professional or freelance photographer/videographer for the duration of the shows. By entering the competition competitors are giving the show permission to take photographs and video and to use said media in promotion of this event and future events.

Credit Cards: Credit cards are an acceptable form of payment, but the payee assumes ALL applicable fees.

Directions: From I-59 South: Take exit 59 to merge onto US-98 E towards Lucedale, Mobile. In 3.2 miles take the exit onto US- 49 towards Gulfport, Wiggins. Keep right towards Camp Shelby, Gulfport. In 53 miles turn right onto MS-53. In 4 miles turn left onto county farm rd.

No Refunds after the closing date, for ANY REASON. Refunds discussed prior to the closing date MUST be reconciled prior to the closing date of the show or they will not be refunded!!

Special Awards

Required memberships and paperwork for special awards must be submitted with entries. Documents for special awards WILL NOT be accepted once the first day of competition has begun. It is the responsibility of the participant to confirm eligibility for all special awards. Awards can be mailed in a pre-paid envelope provided by the competitor, OR at the expense of the competitor; a \$20 minimum which MUST be prepaid. All shipping arrangements MUST be made prior to the competition.

<u>Special Awards are earned on Saturday Only – Scores from test ridden on Sunday will only be applicable for</u> <u>overall High Point Awards. They Will NOT be applied toward the scores for any special awards.</u>



Dancing In Flight Musical Freestyle High Point Awards

The Dancing in Flight Musical Freestyle High Point and Reserve awards will be presented to the highest scoring musical freestyles ridden on **SATURDAY ONLY** (regardless of division). Freestyles will all be ridden in the WDDA / USEF Test of Choice Freestyle Class (Class #240). Any ties for High Point or Reserve will be split by the Artistic Impression scores.



High Point Unicorn: This award will be given to the highest scoring horse and rider combination riding in the Test of Choice classes on **SATURDAY ONLY.** The highest scoring horse in the WDAA and Gaited WDAA Level 1-Level 5 tests of choice (class 237 and 5037) will be awarded with a high point unicorn ribbon. For every horse participating in these classes a \$10 donation will be made in support of the development of the National Flight Dressage Show Foundation! This class will help cover the fees required to form the foundation and help bring cost effective horse showing to the nation through the support of other competitions nationwide. This award will help the Flight Line shows increase diversity and inclusion to the sport of dressage! These classes will be pinned separately (Jr/Yr, AA, Open).

Adulting Ain't Easy High Point Award: To be eligible for this award riders must be Adult Amateurs of least 21 years of age AND horse and rider must have reached a combined age of 45 years. A beautiful high point ribbon will be issued to the winter, along with a wine and cheese basket, and high point saddle pad. Nominations must be completed prior to the start of the competition. Scores must be earned in a test of any level Level 1 through Level 5. (Intro/Basic/Opportunity/Freestyles/Equitation/Rail Class scores are not eligible).

Overall High Point Champion

This award will be given to the highest scoring horse and rider combination regardless of division for the weekend. Only scores acquired during WDAA/USEF Basic-Level 5 tests will be eligible for this award (i.e.: Freestyles/Equitation/Rail classes are ineligible). Scores acquired during Intro/Opportunity Level tests are not applicable.

Intro Level High Point Champion and Reserve

This award will be given to the highest and second highest scoring horse and rider combinations regardless of division for the weekend. Only scores acquired during WDAA/USEF Intro level tests will be eligible for this award.

Opportunity Level High Point Champion and Reserve

This award will be given to the highest and second highest scoring horse and rider combinations regardless of division for the weekend. Only scores acquired during rides in classes specified as "Opportunity" will be eligible for this award regardless of the level of test.

Gaited Horse High Point Champion and Reserve

This award will be given to the highest scoring gaited horse and rider combination regardless of division for the weekend. Only scores acquired during WDAA/USEF Basic-Level 5 tests will be eligible for this award (i.e.: Freestyles/Equitation/Rail classes are ineligible). Scores acquired during Intro/Opportunity Level tests are not

applicable.

Horse Health Requirements for Entry:

Management strives to provide an excellent showing environment. An integral part of an excellent showing environment includes healthy horses. Exhibitors, especially those traveling long distances, can contribute to that healthy environment by following some basic recommendations listed below. Please monitor our web site for any additional and possibly mandatory requirements.

IMPORTANT EQUINE HEALTH INFORMATION

We will adhere to GR845 in which:

At Federation licensed competitions horses, more than 7 months of age, entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.

- 2 In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations, name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.
- 3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.
- 4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds.

The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.

- 5. A current negative Coggins test. Must remain in your possession at all times. Note: The horse show does not keep Coggins originals. Please renew before it expires, and not just before it is necessary to leave the state. It is strongly recommended that all horses be vaccinated for Equine EHV-1 (either modified live or killed vaccine) no sooner than 7 days prior and no later than 180 days prior to entering the show grounds. Most EHV-1 vaccines are only considered effective for 180 days. Check with your veterinarian about which vaccine you use.
- 6. Once the horse leaves the facility you may be required to show a new Statement of Health upon your return to the facility. Current vaccination against WNV, EEE, WEE, Tetanus and Rabies is strongly recommended
- 7. You should be able to document your horse's normal temperature before arrival. Please do not ship horses with elevated temperatures. It is recommended that you establish a log of temperatures taken at least twice daily. If there is an elevated temperature for more than a 24-hour period, please consult your local Veterinarian immediately.
- 8. Every effort should be made to minimize stress and commingling of horses shipped long distances. Extra hours on a horse van or moving from stable to stable is the fastest way to compromise your horses' and your neighbors' horses' health.
- 9. Any horse on the show grounds with a fever of unknown origin or of suspicious origin must be reported to Management. It is always better to err on the side safety. Isolation stalls will either be available on the grounds or at a local veterinary practice if the need arises.

Please take the time to review equine good hygiene practices and impress its importance to your groom in everyday care

Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement, to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) lead line; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR222) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.6

FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longueur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition.

I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

Warning: Under the Equine Activity Liability Act, each participant who participates in an equine activity expressly assumes the risks of engaging in and legal responsibility for injury, loss, or damage to person or property resulting from the risk of equine activities.

In accordance with GR1301.7Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to Segway, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Exhibitors should exercise extreme caution before medicating their horses and should be aware of the US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION rules governing drugs and medications. A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK.
