Western Dressage

(Two divisions - Amateur/Youth and Open)

- Level 5 Tests 1, 3, 4

Fees

- \$450/division. This includes 2 preliminary tests and a required test. A rider may choose not to compete in all three tests but will not receive a refund for any unriden tests.
- \$100 optional payback. (100% of payback is distributed by level/division based on average percentages)
- Stall or grounds fee (see below)
- No office, drug, tail fee will be charged

Stabling

- Super Barn \$425
- Barn 4, Barn 6, Barn 8, Barn 9 \$325
- Barn 5 \$225
- Grounds Fee \$75 flat fee (one-time charge if not stalled)

- Stalls do not include shavings.

When you start your entry, the first question is "horse already entered". If the answer is no the stabling option will appear at the bottom of the form.

Operations

- Classes will take place on the day scheduled. The order of classes will depend on entries. Ride times will be posted at www.horseshowconsulting.com approximately October 27.
- Arenas will be available for schooling beginning at noon on October 31.
- Show will be eligible for WDAA Lifetime points program.

Awards

Preliminary Tests

- Ribbons for each Preliminary test
 - 1st-10th for each division (amateur/youth and open)

Required Test

- No individual test ribbon

Championship

- Belt buckle – 1st place
- Trophy – 1st to 3rd place
- Ribbons – 1st to 15th place
- No payback other than jackpot

Championship places are calculated by an average of the highest percentage of the Preliminary test combined with the Required Test at the level. Required test may be double judged.

Restrictions

- No qualifying for 2022.
- Horse/Rider combination may only ride in 2 levels that are adjacent (ex. Training and First Level or Introductory and Training level; Basic and Level 1 or Introductory and Basic)
- Horse may be ridden by a different rider in a level that is not adjacent
- Horse may compete in the same test if the rider and division (open vs amateur/youth) is different. Ex. a horse may not compete in an amateur/youth test twice with different riders but may compete in the same test with an amateur/youth rider and an open rider.
- A horse/rider combination may not cross enter between amateur/youth and open divisions
- No horse may compete in more than 6 tests/day
- Rider may carry a whip
- Tests may be called or ridden from memory
- Bits, saddlery, and attire must conform to standard dressage and western dressage rules (ex. no double bridles except in dressage third level and higher)
