Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct CDS number and copy of membership card for rider and owner with entry form.



Directions to Galway Downs, 38801 Los Corralitos Rd., Temecula 92592

- From I-15 drive east on Temecula Parkway (Hwy 79 south) 5.92 miles to Los Caballos Rd, turn left. Then in 0.51 miles turn right
 on Los Corralitos Rd. Continue 0.32 miles (past main entrance, past mobile park) to stable gate. Turn left. Gate code is 9999#.
- Alternate route avoids speed bumps. From-15 drive east east on Temecula Parkway (Hwy 79 south) past Los Caballos Rd about 1 mile to Pauba Rd (well marked) turn left. Drive north about 1/2 mile to Los Corralitos Rd., turn left go to stable gate 0.17 miles, turn right. This route marked in blue on map.
- · Permanent stabling on the left after entering. Temporary FEI stabling to the right at the east end of the oval arenas.
- Day parking and trailer parking on the right after entering in the big open area. Please do not park trailers up close to the arena.
- RV parking adjacent to the temporary FEI barns.

RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.
- 2. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management whose decision shall be final.
- 3. Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse how management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.
- 4. The management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and cancel award prizes without claims for damages; to cancel or combine unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges.
- 5. Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees.
- 6. Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation.
- 7. In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio-hazardous medical waste containers will be provided. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.
- 8. No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform.
- 9. It is the tradition of the show that riders be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed and the horses properly presented. Management may in its discretion bar any person from entering the ring if not suitable presented to appear before an audience.
- 10. Life, Senior active and Junior active CDS Members shall be eligible to participate, A non-member may participate as a rider, owner, lessee, or agent upon payment of a \$25 CDS non-member fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the requirements of this rule: USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux, quadrille and Opportunity classes
- 11. ENTRY PROCEDURE: Entries must be made on an official entry form or photocopy of same and must be filled out completely, including all classes entered, all signatures, (no dittos), organization membership numbers and fees. Please include a photocopy of current CDS membership ID for rider and owner. Amateur must provide a copy of their USEF Amateur card or proof of application for an Amateur card. An Internet search will be done for entries missing any of the required membership photocopies at a charge of \$20. Entries are accepted on a first-come, first served basis until classes are filled. Entries received after the closing date will be accepted only if the schedule permits. Each late entry that has been accepted shall be assessed a late fee of \$50. Changes to entries (\$25 fee) after the closing date will be at the sole discretion of the show management. No telephone entries will be accepted. All entries must be completed and RECEIVED by the closing date with check or credit card information . PRIOR TO THE CLOSING DATE, entries may be faxed to 760-758-8358 or emailed to TEVCDS@gmail.com. A 5% handling fee for credit card payments will be added. Payment in full or an open check or credit card information must accompany the entry. Mail completed entries to: E.R. Hamilton, PO Box 732, Bonsall, CA 92003.
- 12. AMATEURS AND JUNIORS: Amateurs are defined by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book. All riders entering the Amateur classes must possess or have applied for an USEF Amateur Card prior to riding in the class. All riders in Amateur Divisions must present an USEF Amateur Card by the closing date or they will be entered in the Open Division. Cards may be applied for at the show office. Individuals are eligible as Juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they will be 18 years of age. Individuals are eligible as Young Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 years and until the end of the calendar year in which they reach 21 years of age. Competitors will compete as Adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22. Individuals possessing current amateur certification are only eligible as Adult Amateurs from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22.
- **13. REFUNDS:** All fees, less a \$30 administrative fee, will be returned if horse is scratched before the Closing Date. Scratches within 48 hours after closing, stabling and drug fees will be refunded. **THEREAFTER, NO REFUNDS FOR ANY REASON.**
- **14. RETURNED CHECKS:** Checks returned by the bank for any reason are regarded as a most serious offense and will be handled according to the following procedure: A 10% penalty (minimum \$25.00) will be assessed for each returned check. Credit cards that do not go through will incur a penalty of at least \$10 for each occurrence.
- **15. ARENA:** Show arena is 20 X 60 meters. Footing consists of sand mixed with dirt and textile footing. Only those horses registered with the show management are permitted use of the show facilities, warm-up arena and show arena. All horses in the warm-up arena must wear their competition numbers. Lunging is allowed in specific areas only and upon receiving permission of the ring steward.

RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION continued

- **16. STABLING, GROUNDS FEE:** Permanent stalls, cinder block construction, 12x12 stalls with Dutch doors. Temporary stalls, composite construction, center isles 10x14 stalls with bottom doors. Stalls, and grooming stalls and tack stalls \$160 (Friday thru Sunday.) If you need to arrive before Friday, or stay longer than Sunday, you must call and make arrangements (760-724-8430), extra days @ \$25. Late entry stall fees \$200 (Friday thru Sunday.) Grounds fee per show day of \$50 applies if not stabled.
- 17. BEDDING and FEED: Shavings and hay may be ordered on your entry or by emailing <u>TEVCDS@gmail.com</u> or texting to 760-724-8430. No straw allowed.
- 18. RV PARKING: In temporary stable area. Please make arrangements with Galway Downs directly at www.GalwayDowns.net
- 19. SHOW STATUS: In the event of inclement weather, natural or other disasters prior to the show, it is the competitor's responsibility to contact management as to the show status. Please call 760-724-8430. IN THE EVENT OF UNEXPECTED TRAFFIC DELAYS, it is the rider's responsibility to TEXT show management (760-724-8430) a minimum of 1hour prior to the start of the class. Please note that if a competitor is a NO-SHOW for ANY class, the rider forfeits his/her subsequent class reservation(s) and said slot may be given to another rider.
- 20. DOGS: Dogs must be on a leash. All animals should be managed so as to not disturb the competitors.
- **21. SCORED TEST:** Tests will be distributed to riders, or their authorized representative, after the results have been finalized and awards presented. Scores will be posted when available and will be at www.foxvillage.com..
- 22. STALLIONS: Stallions must be in a stall or remain in the trailer unless being managed by a qualified person.
- 23. SCHOOLING HORSES: Horses not entered in the show must be registered with the Horse Show office and will be given a number to be worn at all times when not in a stall or tied to a trailer. Appropriate stall or grounds fees (\$55.00) and mandatory fees (\$66.00) per day fee must be paid. Any person(s) riding a schooling horse must have signed an official entry blank. A schooling horse may be allowed in the warm-up arena at the discretion of the ring steward.
- **24. RIDE TIMES:** Times will be emailed and will be posted at TEV-CDS.com. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to contact show management if times are not received. Failure to enter the arena at the specified time may incur elimination.
- 25. HEADGEAR RULE: From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. If there are questions regarding this rule or the use of protective headgear at USEF dressage competitions please contact Halley Griffin by email at <a href="https://doi.org/10.1001/nc.
- 26. GOLF CARTS: and all other motorized vehicles require a valid driver's license to operate. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to Segway, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

27. GR845 Equine Vaccination Rule:

- At Federation licensed competitions horses, more than 7 months of age, entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine 103 manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.
- In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.

Points may be earned with more than one rider.

Owners and persons participating and/or riding a horse in the program must be current WDAA members in good standing.

Points awarded at all WD levels and Freestyle tests, as well as for rail classes.

WDAA World Championship Show test/classes earn triple points.

USEF shows with a USEFlicensed Western Dressage judge earn double points. Check the WD judge directory on the WDAA home page under "Important Links" to see whether your judge qualifies for double points.
