POST LATE ENTRIES will be accepted, if the schedule allows, and will be charged a \$25 late entry fee. **CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:** Every horse and pony entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but the Show management will, in no case, be responsible for loss or damage that may occur, and It shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor should hold the horse show , the officials, the show employees, the show facility, it's directors, and employees, USEF, its directors and employees harmless for any loss or accident to his horse, horse or equipment which may occur from accident, sickness, fire or otherwise. Management reserves the right to cancel, combine or divide classes, or to change officials as it deems necessary, decision of Show Management is final. Failure to enter the ring by scheduled time may incur elimination. This is the responsibility of the exhibitor. Score sheets will only be given to riders or their authorized representative after results have been posted.

SCRATCHES AND CANCELLATIONS: Scratches made before closing date will be refunded minus the office fee. It is the responsibility of the competitor to call (239)21-3293 or email <u>a2cwd@outlook.com</u> before the closing date to be eligible for a refund. NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN AFTER THE CLOSING DATE FOR ANY REASON including Acts of God, weather,

etc.

PRIZES AND AWARDS: Ribbons will be awarded 1st through 6th place through all divisions. High Point ribbons and prizes for each shows top scorers will be awarded for the three divisions of Open, Adult Amateur, and Junior/Young rider with the eligible classes to include Intro though 5th level only. Suitability, Hack, and WDSE are not eligible for high point awards.

RETURNED CHECKS: All checks returned by the bank for any reason will be charged a \$50 fee. Accounts will be given 10 days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be turned in the USEF for further disciplinary action.

A SHARPS CONTAINER will be available in the show office for disposal of any needles. Competition management may fine any individual including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

STABLING: Barn has restrooms with showers. Electric and water hook-up for stalls. Dirt floors with 10 x 10 permanent stalls with rubber mats.

Arena: Show will be in the indoor arena which connects to the barn with a covered walkway and covered arena for warm up. Show arena is 120' x 240'. Warm Up is in the outdoor covered arena is 120' x 140'. All arenas have a dirt/sand footing

NON-COMPETING HORSES: Required to have bridle number on anytime they are out of the stall

NOTICE TO ALL ATTENDEES AND PARTICIPANTS: We will have a photographer taking pictures during the event, approved by show management. With your entrance to the show, you are giving Centerline Show Series permission to use photos and videos of you and your horse that may be used in future promotional materials or advertising used for CSS.

* All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for Safesport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for Safesport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at <u>www.usef.org</u>.

*Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including

but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. **Required apparel:**

a. Suitable western hat. Protective headgear may be worn without penalty. (See GR801).

b. Long-sleeved shirt with any type of collar: short sleeves may be worn at the discretion of the judge.

c. Trousers, pants, a one-piece long sleeved equitation suit provided it includes a collar.

d. Boots

- 2. Optional apparel:
- a. Necktie, kerchief, bolo tie or pin.
- b. A vest, jacket, coat and/or sweater.
- c. Spurs. Western style, with or without blunt tines, English dressage style, roller ball, and blunt bumper spurs as depicted in Figure A, are permitted. Rowels must be vertical. Spurs with sharp tines are not permitted.
- d. Chaps, shotgun chaps, chinks, armitas, or split riding skirt.
- e. Protective headgear is acceptable: not required to be of Western style
- 1. Western Dressage classes are open to riders on horses, mules and/or ponies of any origin. Classes may be

restricted to one or more breeds at a licensed breed restricted competition.

2. A Horse/Rider combination may enter no more than two consecutive levels, Freestyle levels included, at any

one competition. Suitability, Hack and Equitation are excluded from the maximum limit of rides per day and

horses in these classes may compete at any level for which they are otherwise eligible during the same competition.

3. Horse/rider combinations may ride the same test twice at the same competition, given they are separate class numbers.

4. No horse may be ridden more than once in any Western Dressage class including separate sections of the same class number.

a. Horses may be ridden in junior, amateur, and open sections at the same competition.

5. Horses cannot be ridden by more than two riders. Shows may further limit number of rides per horse and level if stated in their prize list.

6. If there is a conflict with breed division rules regarding WD102.2-4, the breed division rules will govern.

7. For purposes of competition in Western Dressage classes:

- a. Junior exhibitor definition: See GR128
- b. Amateur exhibitor definition: From the beginning of the competition year in which they reach 18,

individuals must possess a current Amateur Certification to be eligible to compete as Amateurs at a

Federation Licensed Competition. Adult Amateur riders as defined in GR1306 and GR1307. At non-Federation Licensed Competitions, organizers should consult the appropriate breed or show rules for

eligibility to compete as an Amateur.

c. An individual may not compete as a Junior Rider and as an Amateur in Western Dressage Equitation at

the same competition.

8. WDAA Membership.

a. To be eligible to participate and/or compete as an exhibitor, owner, lessee, agent, coach, or trainer in any Western Dressage class or at any Western Dressage Federation Licensed Competition persons must be

active members of WDAA or pay a non-member fee equal to the price of an annual membership for each competition. Lessees are considered owners in connection with this membership requirement. In the event of an entry under multiple ownership, only one owner need be a member or pay a non-member fee. The competition is responsible for listing either the active member or the owner that paid the non-member fee in the results. The competitions will be responsible for forwarding a list of the names of individuals who pay non-member fees at the competition to WDAA with the post competition report. Payment of nonmember fees for the purpose of competing does not entitle the individual to any privileges of the WDAA membership.

b. WDAA membership is a requirement for participation at the WDAA World Championship Show.

9. Federation Membership. A Federation non-member, who wishes to participate as a rider, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Federation Competitions, Reining Competitions or Federation Open Western competitions that hold Western Dressage classes, must pay a show pass fee for each competition. Lessees are considered owners in connection with this membership requirement. In the event of an entry under multiple ownership, only one owner needs to be a member or pay a show pass fee. The competition is responsible for listing either the active member or the owner that paid the show pass fee in the results. Exception: Local Competitions, competitions restricted to a particular breed, and GR901.9. Participants in the following classes are exempt from the requirements of this rule: leadline; exhibitions; games and races; classes for 4-H members; walk trot; academy classes, and Opportunity classes.

The competitions will be responsible for forwarding copies of all Show Pass forms completed at the competition to the Federation with the post competition report. Payment of show pass fees for the purpose of competing does not entitle the individual to any privileges of the Federation membership.

10. An exhibitor is not allowed to request a Time-Out in Western Dressage.

11. If it becomes necessary to interrupt a Western Dressage competition, and/or as to cause suspension of judging, the unfinished portion may be recommenced and rescheduled for the same or following day at the option of the Show Committee with the officials' consent. All scores recorded before the interruption will stand. When classes are re-commenced after a delay on the same day, competitors must be given at least 30 minutes notice of the starting time. Exhibitors whose ride times are changed to a subsequent day as a result of the interrupted competition or inclement weather condition, must be individually notified at least two hours prior to a rescheduled ride time.

12. Competitions may limit the number of rides and/or the number of levels in which horses may compete if printed in the prize list.

13. Electronic communication devices used for purposes of coaching exhibitors during a competition are prohibited in all classes in the Western Dressage Division. Exhibitors with a permanent hearing impairment are permitted to use an electronic communication device upon submission of a written certification from a treating medical professional's office certifying the permanent hearing impairment and certifying the requirement of an electronic communication device. The medical certification must be provided to the competition Steward within a reasonable time prior to competing who shall attach a copy to the Steward report.

14. An exhibitor with a disability (other than hearing) will be provided reasonable accommodation upon submission of a written certification from a treating medical professional's office certifying the disability and identifying the accommodation necessary for the exhibitor to compete safely. The medical certification must be provided to the competition Steward within a reasonable time prior to competing who shall attach a copy to the Steward report. BOD 6/28/21 Effective 12/1/21

GUIDELINES FOR GAITED HORSES

There are a significant number of gaited horse breeds (about 30 in North America), all with gaits specific to their breed. In Western Dressage competition, the gaited horse will perform a saddle gait in place of the jog. The saddle gait selected should be the gait in which the horse is balanced and athletically comfortable performing. The saddle gait is a 4 beat lateral or diagonal gait, timely and evenly performed. The tempo, rhythm and foot falls of the gait they choose to show must not change throughout the test. The true four beat gait the horse performs, should be able to be ridden in a working, lengthened, free and collected manner as the Western Dressage test calls for.

All rules can be found in the USEF Rule Book under Western Dressage.

WD106 Saddle Gait

The saddle gait has a noticeable increase in cadence from the working walk. Excessive speed or slowness will be penalized.

- 1. In lieu of a jog, gaited horses perform gaits of various rhythms and footfalls. The gaited horse will perform a saddle gait in place of the jog.
- 2. The saddle gait may be either a lateral or diagonal gait, timely and consistently performed. The tempo, rhythm and foot falls of the gait the rider chooses to perform must not change throughout the test. The gait the horse performs, should be able to be ridden in a working, lengthened, free and collected manner as the Western Dressage test specifies.
- 3. The quality of the saddle gait is judged by general impression, i.e. the regularity and rhythm of the steps, the cadence and impulsion. This quality originates from the horse having a supple back and well engaged hind quarters, and the ability to maintain the same rhythm and natural balance in all variations of the saddle gait.
 - a. Collected Saddle Gait. The horse, remaining "on the bit", moves forward with the neck raised and arched and showing clear self-carriage. The head approaches the vertical position and a light contact is maintained with the mouth. The hocks are well-engaged and must maintain an energetic gliding impulsion, enabling the shoulders to move more freely. Although the horse's steps are shorter than in the other saddle gaits, elasticity and cadence are not lessened.
 - b. Working Saddle Gait. With an energetic, regular consistent rhythm; the horse must go forward with consistent and elastic steps. The back must be relaxed and the shoulders free, while there is an obvious push from the hindquarters. The hind legs actively glide under the horse. The horse must show proper balance and maintain light contact with the bit. The horse's nose must be on or slightly in front of the vertical.
 - c. Lengthening of Stride. This is a variation of the Working saddle gait; the horse covers more ground while maintaining the same tempo, consistent rhythm as in the Working saddle gait. Speeding up is a fault. Free Saddle Gait. The Free saddle gait will show moderate lengthening of stride and frame compared to the Working saddle gait. Without hurrying, the horse goes forward with clearly lengthened steps, with impulsion from the hindquarters and uphill balance. The rider allows the horse to carry the head a little more in front of the vertical than at the Collected and the Working saddle gait. The horse's neck is "out", down and forward, with the nose slightly in front of the vertical, with a loose rein and the poll at approximately the same height as the wither (the neck is level). The steps should be consistent, the whole movement balanced and unconstrained, while maintaining a consistent rhythm.

WDAA HORSE LIFETIME POINTS & AWARDS PROGRAM RULES

OVERVIEW OF THE WHLPAP RULES AND HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS

Information below provides new rules in effect as of December 1, 2019.

- 1. WDAA Membership is required for participation in WHLPAP. The horse owner and any other person(s) riding the horse in competition must be current WDAA members in good standing. JOIN OR RENEW NOW
- 2. This award program is open to all horses, ponies, and mules regardless of breed registration, type, age, etc. Enrollment is required by submitting a *Horse Lifetime Enrollment Form* along with the enrollment fee of \$100 before or within 30 days following participation in a recognized WDAA show. A number will bhttps://wdaalifetimepoints.org/wdaa-lifetime-enrollment-form/ assigned to the horse, which follows the horse for life.
- 3. Points can ONLY be earned at WDAA recognized shows in tests and classes judged by USEF- Western Dressage Judges. USEF "r" Western Dressage judges are approved to judge Western Dressage Intro, Basic, and Level 1 tests and Western Dressage Suitability, Hack, and Equitation rail classes. USEF "R" Western Dressage judges are approved to judge all levels of Western Dressage tests and Western Dressage Suitability, Hack, and Equitation rail classes. L graduates are not eligible to judge WDAA recognized shows.
- 4. Eligible competitions include WDAA recognized shows of any level, from schooling shows, up to and including the WDAA World Show.
- 5. Points may be earned with more than one rider. All riders must be current WDAA members.
- 6. Points are cumulative and need not be earned in one competition year.
- 7. Points earned from test and rail classes will be calculated within the WHLPAP software.
- Visit the WHLPAP Program How Points are Calculated page for details on how the points are calculated for WDAA Tests and Rail Classes.
- 9. No points can be earned for tests scored less than 60%.
- 10. No points can be earned for rail class placement beyond 6th place or for classes having 2 or fewer competitors.
- Double points may be earned for an horse enrolled in WHLPAP if the WDAA Recognized Show is USEF licensed ONLY if the judge officiating is a current USEF-licensed Western Dressage judge (see chart below).

- 12. Tests from the previous calendar year may be submitted with required documentation and fees. Tests from the previous calendar year must also be accompanied by an <u>Annual Recording Form</u> and fee for that year.
- 13. A horse enrolled in the program can continue to earn points with a new owner if the horse is sold, and the points earned with the previous owner will stay with the horse. To transfer the points from one owner to the new owner, a <u>Horse Transfer Form</u> must be completed and submitted with the required fee.
- 14. If a WDAA Recognized Show is double-judged by 2 USEF-licensed Western Dressage judges, **only one score from one judge per ride can be submitted**. You may pick the higher score of the two judges for each ride to submit.
- 15. In no circumstances may a horse earn more than double points for a single ride, except at the WDAA Western Dressage World Championship Show, where a single ride earns triple points.
- 16. Scores earned at non-USEF-licensed WDAA Recognized Shows judged by USEF-licensed Western Dressage judges earn single-factor points.
- 17. Online shows recognized by WDAA are eligible to earn .5 points.
- 18. No points will be awarded for WHLPAP submissions until Official Recognized Show results have been received by WDAA. Show Management is required to submit show results within 14 days to WDAA.

WHLPAP PROGRAM – HOW IT WORKS

Horse Lifetime Points & Awards are based on scores a horse achieves at all levels, Freestyle, and dressage rail classes over the course of its Western Dressage career.

Enrollment is required by submitting a *Horse Lifetime Enrollment Form* along with the enrollment fee of \$100 before or within 30 days following participation in a recognized WDAA show. A number will be assigned to the horse, which follows the horse for life.

Each CALENDAR year of competition an *Annual Recording Form* must be completed and a fee of \$50 must be submitted (**including the year of enrollment**) to submit points from shows for that year. Scores from the previous CALENDAR year may be submitted with an annual recording form and a **\$100** fee for that year.

Submit tests and rail classes using the **Test and Rail Class Submission Form** for points to be recorded. A fee of \$10 per test/rail class is required.

The participant will be responsible for submitting the *Test & Rail Class Submission Form* accurately and completely filled in, including the horse's name, Lifetime Recording Number and owner/exhibitor information requested on the form. In addition, a scanned (or hard copy by mail) copy of the portion of each test that shows the total score and percentage awarded, judge's signature, competition/show date, and horse information must be provided. Submissions with errors or omissions will be returned to the member to complete and will delay point processing.

 We strongly recommend that all forms be completed and submitted using our online forms with payment by PayPal. Forms and payments submitted by US mail can take 60 days or longer to process. Please note the WHLPAP office is only staffed part-time. Scores submitted using the online form with complete and accurate information will usually be available within 10 – 15 business days.
