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Phase 1 - Entries Accepted

1. Entries for the show can be submitted anytime between 5/23/2024 to 6/3/2024 8 PM CST.
 - a. Complete an entry – ONLINE ENTRIES ONLY.
 - b. An automatic generated confirmation email will be provided to the person completing the entry.
 - c. A second email will be sent upon verification that the entry is complete. This email will contain your PREFILLED CLASS INFORMATION SIGN for use at the beginning of your videoed ride.
 - d. If you do not see your video sign in your in-box, check your spam folder. It normally takes 24 hours for the signs to be sent.

e. Note: No class changes after 6/3/2024 midnight CST (NO EXCEPTIONS!)

Phase 2 - Videos Submission Accepted

1. Videos can be submitted from the time the entry is made and you have received your prefilled sign (5/23/2024 – 6/3/2024) through 6/18/2024 **8 pm CST**.
 - a. Follow the guidelines on page four (4) to video your ride.
 - b. Upload your video(s) to your personal YouTube account. Watch this video to see how. <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=VtF2AgFSLAw>
 - c. Submit your videos by “copying and pasting” your video link(s) in the webform. <https://www.spotlighthorseshows.com/submit-video-links> This webform is also in the drop-down menu at the Spotlight Horse Shows main page.

Phase 3 - Judging and Score Board

1. The judges will judge the tests from 6/20/2024 through 7/3/2024 8 pm CST.
2. Initial scores and test sheets will be emailed to the competitor and the horse owner.

4. An Online Award Ceremony will be held 7/7/2024.

Online Show Guidelines

Please take all guidelines into consideration when preparing your video test submission.

1. Use arenas that are as close to regulation size as possible and be sure letters are set appropriately to be **easily viewed** by the judge. Cones with large letters on them and poles on the ground to delineate the corners are acceptable and encouraged. For arena measurements, please visit this link,

- a. Intro and Basic must use a 20 x 40-meter arena
- b. Level 1 through Level 5 must use a 20 x 60-meter arena
- c. All Freestyles are in a 20 x 60-meter arena
- d. Horsemanship classes – Walk-Jog 20x40, Intermediate 20x40, Advanced 20x60.

2. Videos of tests must be unedited from start to finish, including the prefilled class information sign, equipment, attire, and bit check. There must be always one continuous recording with the horse and rider visible.

3. Videos must be filmed in **LANDSCAPE** orientation (i.e., if using a phone, hold the phone sideways)

4. The dressage test must be videoed from behind C, 3 to 6 feet from the rail, where the judge would normally be seated. Try adding a little height by standing on a mounting block, for example. For Horsemanship classes, film from behind "C".

5. Prior to beginning the test, the **PREFILLED CLASS INFORMATION SIGN (including the DATE filmed) must be videoed for at least 5 seconds**. Remove the sign just before the ride begins. The videographer can hold the sign then move back to behind the camera or hold the sign in front of the camera at arm's length while also holding the camera. The sign must be in focus, for the correct ride, and held in front of the camera long enough to be readable.

6. Keep the horse in frame, paying close attention to the near corners. You may zoom in on the far end and corners. Videos must be in focus. Keep the camera centered on the horse on the centerlines.

7. Make sure to keep the letters in the frame that are elements of the test being performed. Keep the horse in the LAST one third of the viewing screen in landscape view (2/3 of the viewscreen in front of moving horse). This will allow the "judge" to see approximately two letters in front of the horse which is necessary for depth perception and line evaluation. In general, keep the horse's feet in the bottom 1/3 of the viewfinder.

8. Coaching during the test is not allowed EXCEPT for WDAA Exceptional Rider tests

9. The natural background sound for the test must be audible. Tests with no sound at all will not be accepted. Freestyles must have music in the background but not digitally added to the video itself.

10. The test may be called except for freestyle.

11. The video may not be a ride from a previous show.

Note: To prevent creating additional videos and possible elimination, please review your video before you complete your video session to ensure it is in Landscape mode; the prefilled sign is visible, and the correct sign was used. Also, ensure that the equipment check was performed prior to turning off the recording as a video without an equipment check will not be accepted. If you cannot plainly read the information on your required sign at the beginning of the video and see your equipment clearly on a regular computer monitor without zooming in, we cannot see it to approve your video for the judging phase.

EQUIPMENT CHECK REQUIREMENTS

1. As soon as the test is finished, the camera must **slowly circle the horse and rider showing all equipment and attire from both sides**, including spurs and whip if used. The spurs must be shown for a count of three seconds. You do not need to spin the rowels.

If the videographer is unable to enter the arena, at G the rider may turn the horse slowly, wait five seconds, then turn slowly to show the second side, and wait an additional 5 seconds to complete filming of the equipment.

2. Show the bridle on the horse, from both sides.
3. After a view of both sides of the horse is shown the rider must dismount for the bridle check.
 - a. Exceptional riders are exempt from the bit dropping requirement and are not required to dismount. Participants should still abide by all USEF regulations pertaining to attire, tack, and equipment for the recognized show.
4. Prior to dropping the bridle, show that two fingers can fit between the cavesson (if there is one) or bosal and the horse's cheek, then drop the bit.
5. Hold the bridle still so the bit can clearly be seen, in frame, for a minimum count of five seconds.
 - a. Stand close to the equipment and video from several angles.
6. Do the same with your curb strap/chain (if used) and bit.
7. If you are using a bosal, you must drop that as well. After you remove the bosal, show both sides of your horse's face, unobstructed, as well as the bosal. Please demonstrate flexibility of the bosal.
8. The cavesson noseband must be shown to the camera, both inside and out. Please demonstrate the flexibility of the cavesson noseband.
9. Prior to submitting your video, review the equipment check in detail to ensure that all of the above requirements have been met and that the equipment checks have a clear, focused, steady view of your tack.
- 10. You are responsible for knowing the correct rules for tack, attire, and equipment for Western Dressage. See [USEF WD121-123](#) for rules on tack and attire.**
- 11. If your equipment check is unable to be completed due to any of the above rules not being followed, your ride will have to be retaped and resubmitted.**

PLEASE NOTE

Show Management will review all submissions to ensure adherence to the guidelines as stated above. If a test is submitted that does not comply with these guidelines, Show Management will contact the exhibitor immediately via email or phone. The exhibitor will be allowed one resubmission if the video is rejected, and must submit a replacement video no later than noon CST on 6/19.

Rejected videos will NOT be judged and will not be refunded

Refunds:

Entries canceled for any reason **prior to the closing date** will be refunded, minus the office fee. In the event the competition is canceled, Total Entry Fees minus the office fee will be refunded.

Other than the competition cancelation, there are NO REFUNDS made after the Phase 1 closing date (6/3/2024).

Entry fees for videos not submitted by 6/18/2024 or not accepted by the Steward and not resubmitted by 6/19/2024 (noon) will not be refunded. The show incurs many costs, particularly after the closing date. Thank you for understanding.

2024 Online International Awards

- Everyone who places in a class or division will receive an item directly from Tioga Territory with their titles printed on it, along with the Online International Exhibitor logo.
- All others will receive a 2024 WDAA Western Dressage Online International Challenge Exhibitor patch.

A. Class Awards

1st – 10th place will be awarded in all classes, your placing will be represented on your item from Tioga Territory as Champion, Reserve Champion or top 10.

B. Division Championship Awards

Division champions (1st place in one of the following divisions) will receive an Online International buckle

1st through 10th place will be awarded in all classes, your placing will be represented on your item from Tioga Territory as Champion, Reserve Champion or top 10.

Division Calculations

Awarded to the highest average percentage of the top two scores at the level. One score MUST be from either test 3 or test 4 and the other score can be from any other test within the level.

Award Notes

- In the event of a tie, the combination with the highest single percentage will earn the tie breaker.
- Musical freestyles DO NOT count toward Division championship awards.

C. Overall High Score Awards The winner will receive a saddle pad from Circle Y Saddlery (Based on the top score earned in a class from one test across all levels except freestyle)

- Junior Rider = 13 and under
- Junior Rider = 14- 17
- Amateur Rider = 18 -39 years of age
- Amateur Rider = 40 – 59
- Amateur Rider = 60 and up
- Open Rider = 39 years of age and under
- Open Rider = 40 years of age and up

D. Special Awards

Special awards can be printed on an item from Tioga Territory if you receive one for placing in a class. If not, you may purchase an item from Tioga Territory and WDAA will cover the cost of printing your special award on that item.

Breed High Score Awards –The high score winner from each declared breed.

To compete for this Special Award, you must add this designation to your entry (on entry blank or chosen as a class in the online entry process).

International Challenge – Highest scoring horse and rider team from each non-US country competing. (Note: Video must be ridden and produced in the non-US country listed on the entry blank and International Challenge Eligibility form must be sent to the show secretary).

High Score Musical Freestyle – Highest score earned in a musical freestyle class.

High Score Military Veteran – Highest scoring horse and rider team where the rider is a Military veteran (Non-US Military is also included). To compete for this Special Award, you must add this designation to your entry (on entry blank or chosen as a class in the online entry process)."

High Score Professional Rider –Highest score earned in level 2 or higher by a declared professional equestrian. Professionals may not enter junior or amateur classes. To compete for this Special Award, you must add this designation to your entry (on entry blank or chosen as a class in the online entry process).

USA Award – Highest scoring horse and rider team from the United States of America competing.

WDAA Versatility Horse - Any horse and rider team that shows in all 3 divisions (Horsemanship, WDAA test and Freestyle). To compete for this Special Award, you must add this designation to your entry (on entry blank or chosen as a class in the online entry process).

E. 4th Annual WDAA Harmony Award

All exhibitors that meet the following requirements, will be part of a drawing for a beautiful trophy saddle.

1. A horse and rider team must have shown and been judged in the 2024 WDAA Online International Show and the 2024 WDAA World Championship Show
2. That team must have earned an 8.0 or higher, in harmony at both shows
3. Every test in which the horse and rider team achieve an 8.0 or higher in harmony will count as an additional entry in the drawing.

Competition Rules

WDAA Memberships: All owners, and riders **MUST be a member of WDAA** to compete in this show. You may join WDAA at www.westerndressageassociation.org.

Amateur Status: If you are entering amateur classes, you must submit a WDAA DECLARATION OF AMATEUR STATUS form (found below and on the WDAA site). Please read the form and provide needed documents accordingly. If you select option 1 (you possess an "ACTIVE" amateur card from USEF, AQHA, APHA or any other equestrian association), you must also submit a copy of the card. The DECLARATION OF AMATEUR STATUS can be found below on page 16:

The DECLARATION (and card if applicable) must be emailed to the show secretary at Gail@SpotlightHorseShows.com If you are found to NOT be an amateur, you will forfeit your entries with no refund.

Junior Status: Riders are eligible to compete as juniors if they are 17 years of age or less at the beginning of the 2024 competition year (December 1, 2023 – November 30, 2024). [GR 103](#).

Prefilled Class Information Sign: You will be provided with a sign to use at the beginning of the video. Signs will be emailed to you and will be available to print out. The beginning of the video must contain at least 5 seconds of this document. Video will not be judged without this prefilled sign – **DO NOT create your own sign.**

All decisions of equipment checkers, show secretary, judges and WDAA Board of Directors are final. There is no protest covenant at this non-USEF licensed event.

Breaking Scoring Ties – In the case of a scoring tie, ties will be broken per the USEF [WD127 – Scoring, Classification and Prize-Giving](#) rule.

- Therapeutic Rider classes (use WDAA Therapeutic Rider tests) Open to individuals with a diagnosed physical, social, or emotional disability. A **WDAA Statement of Eligibility for Exceptional Rider Classes** form is required to show in these classes. (Located below the Entry Blank).

Exceptional riders are exempt from the bit dropping requirement and are not required to dismount. Participants should still abide by all USEF regulations pertaining to attire, tack, and equipment for the recognized show. Reference [GR120](#) for additional information.

Class Restrictions

- Horses may be ridden by two riders. Each horse/rider combination requires a separate entry with all signatures and emergency contact. [WD 102](#)
- No horse may be ridden in the same class number more than once (even with a different rider) per [WD 102.2](#)
- Horse/rider combinations showing in walk/jog rail classes are not eligible for other rail classes or any test other than Introductory Level (Different horse/rider combinations are eligible for other rail classes and tests)
- Horses may only compete in levels that are adjacent with the same rider. For example, a horse may not be ridden in a basic level test and a level two test UNLESS with a different rider. [WD 102.](#)
- A horse may be ridden by a maximum of two riders. [WD 102.](#)
- To be eligible for Intro Level, a horse/rider combination must not have shown in a Western Dressage test at First level or above in the same competition year. [WD 130.1.](#)

Other: Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules and of the current USEF/WESTERN DRESSAGE rules will be judged in accordance therewith.

Entries and Scoring

A. General Information:

Entries must be entered online by the closing date. Please visit www.SpotlighthHorseShows.com for online entry. Every horse/rider team requires a separate entry and will pay a separate office fee.

For an entry to be considered complete, you must include the WDAA membership numbers for Owner and Rider. If WDAA membership numbers are not received by 6/5, the entry will not be accepted. No exceptions.

(Persons acting as counselors at summer camps, who are not hired in the exclusive capacity of riding instructors, are excluded and persons giving instructions and training to the handicapped are also excluded).
3. Accepted remuneration AND acted as an agent in the sale of a horse or pony or accepted a horse or pony on consignment for the purpose of sale or training that is not owned by me, my cohabitant, or family member, a farm/ranch/syndicate/partnership/corporation/business I, my cohabitant or family member controls.
4. Accepted remuneration for the use of my name, photograph, or other form of personal association as a horseman in connection with any advertisement or article to be sold.
5. Accepted prize money in equitation or showmanship classes, except in amateur or owner classes.
