FEES AND ENTRY INFORMATION

ENTRIES using Equestrian Entries: Entries must be completed and paid for online at EqEntries.com. If you do not already have an Equestrian Entries account, please create a free account. A 5% non-refundable online processing fee for your completed entry is paid for with your credit card. No entries are accepted by phone or by mail. Payment is due with entries. Online entries may be submitted on the OPENING date of August 14 or thereafter, up to and including the CLOSING date of September 15, 2023. Post entries will be accepted within the ability of the show to accommodate additional entries.

Entries will be limited for this show due to stabling limitations. Entries will be accepted and assigned ride times in the order in which they are received and paid for online. If oversubscribed, additional entries will be placed on a waitlist. Rides may be scheduled from early morning through evening each day. The Show Committee reserves the right to limit entries or classes per horse, to add, divide, or cancel classes, or make whatever changes are required by the circumstances of the competition.

Ride Limits: Horse/rider combinations may enter a maximum of 3 classes, including Equitation classes. A horse may perform a maximum of 3 tests (including Equitation classes). No horse may be ridden twice in the same class and division, except for Test of Choice classes. Horses may only be shown at two consecutive levels.

Stabling and Tack Stalls: DUE TO THE DRESSAGE SHOW ON SATURDAY BEFORE THIS SUNDAY SHOW, STABLING WILL BE LIMITED FOR BOTH SHOWS. TACK STALLS MAY NOT BE AVAILABLE, AND PREFERENCE FOR TACK STALLS (IF AVAILABLE) WILL BE GIVEN TO TRAINERS/OWNERS WITH LARGER STABLES). Bedding not provided - bagged shavings available for purchase. Please pre-order all shavings needed. Permanent box stalls and vinyl temporary stalls with doors (all are minimum size 10 X 10). Stallions, horses over 17 hands and entries showing for the entire weekend will be given preference for permanent stalls. Due to the limited number of stalls available, we may be unable to honor requests for tack stalls. Please direct all stabling questions to the show secretary Hannah Mandell, Hannahmandell@gmail.com Cell: 563-209-6783. Stalls for the WDAA show will be available Saturday at noon.

STALL STRIP and SWEEP: It has been a challenging year for hiring stable help to strip and clean horse show stalls. Because of the current hiring climate and lack of available stable help, SHOW POLICIES THIS YEAR require the competitor to strip and thoroughly sweep their stall clean before departure. There will be a \$50 stall cleaning deposit for every horse and tack stall. Checks or credit card payments will be collected before rider packets are given out at show registration. If you have stripped and swept your stall at the end of the show day, you will receive your deposit back in full. We will return your separate check or issue a credit card refund within approximately one week. Stalls must be inspected by the Show Manager or Co-Assistant Manager before you leave to receive your stall deposit back.

Refunds: If an entry is canceled before the closing date, all fees minus the office fee and stabling fees are refunded. NO REFUNDS FOR STABLING. No other fees are refundable after the closing date for any reason, including in the event of cancellation of some classes due to severe weather, power failure or other emergencies.

Coggins: A negative Coggins (EIA) Report listing the horse's recorded show name within one year of show dates is required for all horses on the grounds, including haul-ins. Show numbers will not be assigned without negative Coggins.

Show Rules All classes will be conducted in accordance with the rules of WDAA. All decisions made by the Judge and/or Show Management are final and cannot be protested. Show Management reserves the right to ask any exhibitor to leave the show grounds for any reason, including but not limited to unsportsmanlike conduct and animal cruelty.

Force Majeure: In the event of a force majeure, this competition may be subject to cancellation. "Force majeure" shall mean fire, earthquake, flood, snow, ice, lightning, act of God, or the presence of contagious or infectious disease among humans (for example but not limited to Covid-19) or animals (for example but not limited to EHV 1/4 or strangles), work stoppages or other labor disturbances, riots or civil commotions, litigation, war or other act of foreign nation, power of government, or governmental agency or authority, or any other cause like or unlike any cause above mentioned which is beyond the control of the show management. In the event of cancellation before the show begins due to force majeure, all fees paid by competitors will be refunded.

Confirmation/Ride Times: Rides may be scheduled from early morning through evening. Provisional ride times and show updates will be emailed to competitors before the show. Official times will be posted at the show office by noon the day before the show. Please inform the show secretary of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving provisional ride times.

Awards: Ribbons or medals or other recognition through six places.

Arenas and footing: Dirt/sand footing. Standard-size dressage arena set inside 100' x 250' side walled Main indoor arena. Smaller attached indoor warm-up 70' x 120'. Inspiration Arena: 238' x 76' side-walled indoor arena with dirt/sand footing.

Schooling and Lunging: Schooling for the western dressage show will begin on Saturday at noon in the Inspiration Arena only, while the English Dressage Schooling show takes place in the Main Arena. Immediately after the last English dressage class on Saturday, Sunday WDAA competitors may school in the Main competition arena for at least two hours or until 9:00 pm. Lunging is allowed only in designated lunging areas.

Facilities, Management Rules and Procedures:

- Please note that **our concession stand will NOT BE OPEN** during this show. Competitors are advised to visit our local restaurants in Concord Township for meals and snacks.
- No smoking in the lobby, in or near barns or any arenas. Smoking is ONLY permitted in your personal car or truck.
- FREE Wi-Fi. Restrooms and showers are available in the Learning Center. Camping and motor home or trailer electricity is NOT available.
- NO PARKING BY BUILDINGS. NO PARKING BY BARNs OR MANURE PIT AREAS. Trailer and vehicle parking in designated areas only. Violators may be towed at the owner's expense.
- Show Management reserves the right to vary or add officials, to refuse any entry of any exhibitor for cause, to disqualify any exhibitor and/or his horse for cause, to cause an exhibitor to forfeit his winnings and ribbons for cause, to have horses removed from the grounds for cause, and to return any entry and/or stall fee before or during the show for cause, all without being liable for damage or compensation. Show management reserves the right to make any necessary changes for the safe and efficient conduct of this competition.
- Management reserves the right to combine or cancel classes, vary or add officials, and refuse any exhibitor's entry for cause.
- Dogs, except for service animals, are not allowed in the main lobby of the Learning Center. All dogs at the equestrian center must be on a leash no longer than 6' and held by a responsible adult/fixated object at all times.
- Lake Erie College and its employees will not be held responsible for loss or damage to persons, property, or horses.

***TESTS ABOVE LEVEL 1 will be for “practice only” and test scores will NOT be sent to WDAA for points. This WDAA recognized show is being judged by an “r” judge who will be judging tests in Intro, Basic and Level 1 only for official points and recording by WDAA. Tests above Level 1 may be ridden for practice and scores will not be sent to WDAA and points are not earned on these tests.**

Classes may not be run in this order.

All typical divisions of open, amateur, and youth riders will be pinned as one class at this show. The show may be limited to 50 tests due to limited stabling and available judging time.

No more than three rides per horse/rider combination.

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DIRECTIONS:

The Lake Erie College George M. Humphrey Equestrian Center is about 30 miles east of Cleveland. Take I-90 to St. Rt. 44 South towards Chardon, Exit 200. Four lane highway will become two lanes. At the traffic light, turn right on to Girdled Rd. Within 1 mile, the road bears right onto Hermitage Rd. Approximately 3/10 miles, turn left onto Pinecrest Rd. Equine Biosecurity Recommendations for your horse's health and safety

Lake Erie College is committed to the health and safety of our resident school horses and all our visiting competition horses.

To encourage everyone on the premises to use good practices and health safety measures to protect our horses, please observe the following suggestions:

At the Show

Wash and disinfect your hands frequently!

Do not handle or pet horses other than your own.

Do not let your horse touch other horses, particularly nose-to-nose.

Do not share water buckets, feed tubs, tack, or other equipment between horses.

You may elect to take temperatures on your horses twice daily. Report all temperatures over 102.0°F directly to the Show Manager.

Going Home

Clean and disinfect your tack, boots, equipment, and grooming supplies.

When you get home, shower, blow your nose and put on clean clothes and shoes before going near other horses at home.
