AHA Membership Statement

Each competitor (this includes at least one recorded owner and all trainers, drivers, riders, halter handlers, coaches and the person(s) signing the entry blank) in an Arabian Horse Association recognized Arabian Division, at the time of entry into competition, must submit a copy of a valid AHA Membership/Competition Card, join AHA or pay an AHA Single Event Membership Fee per competitor.

When an Agent signs for the Owner at an AHA Recognized Competition, both the owner and Agent must be members of AHA or pay the AHA Single Event Membership.

AHA Single Event Membership is not acceptable at AHA Regional or National Competitions.

Exhibitors in 10 & Under Walk-Trot Classes are exempt for AHA Membership requirements at Qualifying Competitions, but must have an AHA Membership with Competition Card at AHA Regional and National Competitions.

Exhibitors in Lead Line Classes or Parents/Guardians signing for Minors are exempt from Membership Requirements. (BOD 5/12)

The Equestrian Canada Federation (EC), the national federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction. The EC is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities.
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.
- Ensuring that owners, trainers, exhibitors and their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation, and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.
- Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices
- Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry
 regulations in all equestrian competitions.
- Reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses.
- The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibiting procedures, would determine to be cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

THE RULE BOOK

Exhibitors, Judges, and Show Officials are responsible for knowledge of the Rules. Both a complete knowledge of and compliance with the rules are essential, and all participants must be fully cognizant of all rules as well as class specifications in the division in which they compete. Full details of Horse Show operation - EC (including FEI) rules - list of recognized Judges - other vital information is in the RULE BOOK copyright for exclusive use of recognized shows. See current EC Rules and Amendments. Every individual is eligible to count points won at recognized EC Shows for Annual and Provincial Championship Awards. The current EC Rules and Amendments are presently in effect and have been used to compile the Rules and Regulations for this prize list

Passports are **not** required in a recognized "Breed" competition.

Person Responsible

The Person(s) responsible (PR) for a horse must be an adult who has, or shares responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rules. The PR is liable under the penalty provisions of the applicable EC Rules for any rule violations. Every entry form for an EC sanctioned competition must identify the PR and be signed by the PR.

The Person(s) responsible is ultimately responsible for the condition, fitness and management of the horse and is alone responsible for any act performed by himself/herself or by any other person with authorized access to the horse in the stables, elsewhere on the grounds, or while the horse is being ridden, driven or exercised.

- A: For adult entries into EC sanctioned competitions the PR shall be either the trainer, the owner of the horse of the competitor who rides or drives the horse during the EC sanctioned competition. Section A Page 101
- **B:** For Junior entries into EC sanctioned competitions the Junior competitor cannot be the PR. For Junior entries the PR may be either the trainer, the owner of the horse, or a parent/guardian of the Junior competitor.

It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC- sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition."

Membership Requirements

- 1. General Membership in AHA (EC Article B1302.3) and EC/USEF is required for all riders, drivers, owners, lessees, agents or trainers and handlers (see EC Article B1302.2). Exception: Owners that are listed on the registration papers as "and" or "and/or". For show purposes, only one owner is required to be a member. Joint ownership does not allow for the owners to ride in Amateur classes unless the joint ownership is of the immediate family. Refer to current EC rules.
- **2. Sport Horse License for Arabian/H/AA entries** All exhibitors, owners, trainers must possess a 2023 Provincial membership in their participating PSO and a 2023 "Silver" Sport License from Equestrian Canada to compete in this Region 17 Championship Show.
- **3. Amateur** No additional fee is charged to the Sport Horse License. However, Amateurs must complete the EC form. All exhibitors showing in AAOTR and AAOTH classes or are an "ADULT" in an AOTR and AOTH classes must carry a current "Amateur" Sport Horse License card from EC/USEF EC Rule #A902 Amateur Status must be applied for separately on an individual competitive license and is not automatic.
- **4. Farm, Syndicate or Business Horses** registered in the ownership of a Farm, Syndicate or Business must have an AHA Business Membership and EC/USEF Farm Certificate (see EC Rulebook for exact Canadian rule) AHA Business Memberships must be purchased directly from AHA (Article 701.6). A Business must provide documentation showing the owners of that business for owner classes. Joint ownership if not of immediate family will not be able to enter any "owner" class.
- 5. All competitors (riders, drivers and handlers), owners, trainers and coaches must be current members of AHA as well as members of EC and Horse Council BC (or applicable PTSO) and/or USEF, at the time of entry and at the time of showing. A Silver EC sport Licence is required. Holders of a Bronze EC sport licence may upgrade to a Silver sport licence for the cost difference of \$84.00 or may purchase a single event licence upgrade for \$22.00. EC non-members may purchase a temporary sport licence for the competition for \$76.00. AHA non-members may purchase a single event membership for \$45.00 (\$35 USD + \$10 exchange) for the Region 17 Pre-Show ONLY. Competitors in lead line and walk/trot classes are exempt from AHA membership.

If you wish to show at the Region 17 Championship Show, and you do not have a valid current competition membership card then you will have to purchase an AHA competition membership for the Region 17 Championship. See AHA Chapter 7. Article 705

6. Each competitor (this includes at least one recorded owner, all trainers, drivers, riders, halter handlers, coaches & the person(s) signing the entry form blank) in an AHA recognized Arabian division at the time of entry into a competition, must submit a copy of a valid AHA Competition card. When an agent signs for the owner at an AHA recognized competition, both the owner and agent must be members of AHA or pay the single event membership – exception Regional or National events. Exhibitors in Walk-Trot classes must have memberships in a Regional or National event.

Awards & General Rules

Ribbons to 3rd: placings to sixth in all classes.

Post Entry Fees: Will be enforced as of the start of the show. Sport Horse In Hand & Performance \$ 40.00; Halter and Performance classes \$ 40.00; Junior Rider and Equitation \$ 40.00; Dressage \$45.

Membership Cards must be shown. No competitor will be allowed to show without one of the above cards or a paid Temporary EC membership. No pending memberships. Photocopies of all cards and horses registration papers must accompany entries. Proof of ownership is required: both sides of the papers are needed if the owners name does not appear on the front. A copy of the Canadian registration papers is required by the show secretary for submission to AHA. Competitor numbers must be worn in the paddock or warm-up area prior to the class and in the show arena during competition. Failure to wear a competition number during the class may result in disqualification of the entry by the judge.

TBA Classes: All TBA Classes must be sponsored to run. A class will require a sponsorship of \$20.00. Sponsorships are in addition to the class entry fee. **Possible TBA classes**: Any AHA recognized classes in all Arabian and Half Arabian divisions excluding: dressage working cow, reined cow, cutting informal/formal combination working hunter, jumper, carriage driving, combined driving, eventing, games. There will be no championships run at the AAHABC Region 17 Preshow in 2023.

Entry Information

Entry Deadline June 12, 2023

1. Entries must be postmarked no later than June 12, 2023 for the Region 17 Pre-Show AHA #20231715942 Please use the 2023 entry form. All entries wishing to stable together must be emailed or mailed together. There is no quarantee of stabling together if entries are received separately.

Emailed entries must be **one per horse** which will include the Entry form completed with signatures (Back page of entry form must have signatures as indicated on the top and the bottom of that page), horse papers, and all memberships (AHA & EC) required for this entry. Minors can **not** sign the entry form.

- 2. E-transfer must be done with the treasurer and a copy sent in with email or mail.
- **3.** Cancelation of Entry. Exhibitors cancelling entries after the closing date of June 12, 2023 shall forfeit a refund of ALL fees unless accompanied with a valid Veterinarian Certificate showing the Owner name, Horse Name and cause of injury or illness.
- **4. Refunds will be considered upon receipt of a valid veterinarian certificate within seven (7) days** after the occurrence of said illness or injury & is received by the show secretary by email or at the show office. No vet outs will be accepted after 8:00 am, July 17, 2023. Granted refunds will be sent by mail after the close of the show and payable to the owner of the horse. Vet outs will be refunded the AHA Resolution 9/90 fee as per AHA rules.
- 5. There will be no refund of stall fees for any reason after June 26, 2023 unless the Region 17 Show Commission has cause to resell it and has agreed with the approval of the Trainer/Owner. However, if there is another horse owned by and/or exhibited by the same person as the vet-out horse then the new horse will be able to use the vet-out stall by contacting the show secretary who will contact the Show Commission for approval.
- **6.** The **vet-out processing fee of \$25.00 per horse plus office fee & number fee will be retained** on all entries that are an approved vet-out.
- **7.** Completion of Entry. Please make sure that all areas on the entry form are completed in full & signed where indicated. The entry form is considered a legal document. **No minor signatures.** All horses must be entered in the proper class and **must be entered in the name of their bonafide owner or lessee as per the registration papers**. Copy of a registered lease agreement must accompany entries for leased horses.
- **8.** Minors 18 years of age or younger, or those who are still showing in Junior classes, can NOT sign the entry form. A parent/guardian signature is required on all signature lines (including rider and/or owner). The parent/guardian or trainer may sign as the responsible person on the entry form, understanding that the responsibility of that signature(s) includes the most responsible person signature.
- **9.** Any entry accompanied with a postdated cheque will be processed on that date. If this date is after the closing date of entries, this entry will be considered a late entry and the double class fee will be charged.

 E-transfer must be paid when entered and confirmation included with the entry form, whether the entry is mailed or emailed.
- **10**. Refer to AHA Article 1201.4. It is the responsibility of the person(s) signing the Entry Form to verify that the horse is eligible to be entered and verified to compete in the respective Regional Championship class(es).

Essential Information

- **11.** Collect calls may be made to exhibitors/owners by the Entry Secretary if it is deemed necessary to clarify any information on the entry form or stabling form.
- 12. Acknowledgements will be sent out by email to all trainers or owners. Please make sure that an email destination is on the entry form.
- **13.** If items are required on your emailed acknowledgement, please bring those items to the show office. Please do not email or mail them. Provide items needed to complete your entry/entries at the show office when picking up your assigned packet.
- **14.** The Show Commission reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries of any owner. EC Rule Book A805.
- **15. Eligibility** All horses entered must be registered with the Canadian Arabian Horse Registry; the Canadian Half-Arabian/Anglo-Arabian Registry; AHA Arabian Registry; or the AHA Half-Arabian/Anglo-Arabian Registry.
- **16.** Geldings need to show as "Gelding" on the horse registration papers or entry may be considered incorrect. The only exception will be horses recently gelded whose papers have not yet been returned with the correction.
- 17. Returned Items Upon receiving a returned cheque or an invalid credit card a \$50.00 charge will be levied and must be cleared immediately. After 30 days a \$100.00 charge will be levied. If after 45 days payment in full has not been replaced, the Show Commission has the option to report the payee to AHA and EC for suspension and/or to impose further action for future shows. All corrected payments and charges will be accepted by certified cheque, money order, cash or new credit card.
- 18. For your convenience payment by credit card or e-transfer (exception: USA exhibitors) will be accepted at this Region 17 Championship Pre-show. You may also pay by cheque. All charges will be made in Canadian Dollars.

- a. The e-transfer must be completed prior to mailing or emailing the entry to the Region 17 Championship Show.
- **b.** Make a copy of the confirmed e-transfer and attach it to the entry form. A copy must be with the mailed or emailed entry confirming payment of the entries.
- c. If the e-transfer confirmation is not mailed or emailed with the entry it will be considered a late entry.
- **d.** Please type your name on the e-Transfer in the message box of the e-transfer transaction.

Exhibitor guidance

No entries will be processed and no stalls will be assigned without proof of payment. There will be a \$10.00 fee per horse for incomplete entries. All NSF cheques will be charged a \$50.00 NSF fee. Region 17 reserves the right to report any unpaid NSF cheques to AHA within 21 days of the horse show for which the NSF cheque was written.

The Region 17 Pre-show competition is sanctioned as a silver competition of EC c/o House of Sport 2451 Riverside Drive, Ottawa, Ontario, K1H 7X7 and is governed by the rules of EC (A602.1). Per Article A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person(s) responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this EC-sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.

All competitors (riders, drivers and handlers), owners, trainers and coaches must be current members of AHA as well as members of EC and Horse Council BC (or applicable PTSO) and/or USEF, at the time of entry and at the time of showing. A Silver EC sport Licence is required. Holders of a Bronze EC sport licence may upgrade to a Silver sport licence for the cost difference of \$84.00 or may purchase a single event licence upgrade for \$22.00. EC non-members may purchase a temporary sport licence for the competition for \$76.00. AHA non-members may purchase a single event membership for \$40.00.

Competitors in lead line and walk/trot classes are exempt from AHA membership. HCBC or equivalent provincial sport organization membership is required for insurance reasons.

When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance . See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.

Article A102 Safe Sport Environments

- 1. Effective 2022, EC Sport License holders at least 18 years of age must complete recognized safe sport training modules addressing the recognition and prevention of maltreatment in sport and concussion.
- 2. Effective 2022, Coach Status is required to engage in coaching activities at EC sanctioned events.

Stabling and RV reservation requests must be made on the Region 17 Stabling Form and the Region 17 RV Reservation Form, with payment to Region 17 Championship, including for the Pre-Show only.

Stabling must be accompanied with an entry form for the Region 17 Championship and or the Pre-Show. If Pre-Show exhibitor(s) are not showing in the Region 17 Championship, **entry forms must still be sent by June 12, 2023 to the Region 17 Show Entry Secretary,** Marla Patterson email: entries@region17show.com or mail: Marla Patterson, 6178 - 189 Street, Surrey, BC V3S 7T6.

All Stalls must be cleaned before leaving the grounds. Region 17 will require a \$50.00 Cheque or a Credit Card sent with the entry form to be held in your file until the stall (s) are cleaned.

NEW for 2023

Recreational Vehicle parking and Horse Trailers with Living quarters RV/Camping spots are available through prior reservation request only.

General Rules

- 1. NO SMOKING in the barns.
- **2.** All entry and stabling fees, copy of registration papers, amateur cards and numbers, AHA cards and numbers, EC/USEF cards and numbers MUST accompany entry forms for all owners, riders and handlers. A \$10.00 fee will be charged on incomplete entries.
- **3.** Exhibitors putting horses in stalls not assigned to them will have all entries forfeited. NO changing or removing of stall name cards! A stabling chart will be posted in the both barns and Portables (if applicable), as well as at the show office. First two bags of shavings will be provided for all stalls.
- 4. Exhibitors must park their cars, trucks and horse trailers only in the designated areas. **No vehicles in the holding area** and access areas during show hours.
- **5.** All classes to be judged under current EC rules, unless otherwise stated. Rules not covered by the Arabian division of the Rule Book will be covered under their respective EC class division.
- **6.** Should any question or dispute arise not provided for in the governing rules, the same shall be referred to the Steward and Show Committee whose decision shall be final.
- **7.** Every class offered herein which is covered by the Rules and Specifications of the EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book (A602.2).
- **8.** All entry forms must be completed and signed. NO entry form will be accepted UNLESS SIGNED BY PARENT OR GUARDIAN OF JUNIOR EXHIBITORS WHERE INDICATED. Juniors must give name, age and date of birth on entry form.
- **9.** There will be no refund of entry fees if horses are withdrawn after official date of closing, unless a Veterinarian's Certificate is presented to the Entry Secretary up to and including the final day of the show. Doctor's Certificate's will be honoured for Equitation riders only, but must be presented before the conclusion of the show. All queries must be directed to the Show Committee. \$ 10.00 or 10%, whichever is greater, will be withheld from all cancelled entries.
- 10. The Show Committee reserves the right to cancel classes with insufficient entries: Halter classes less than four (4); Performance classes less than four (4); or to combine it with another class, or to divide a class if necessary. In the event that a class is cancelled due to lack of entries, the whole entry fee will be returned and exhibitors notified accordingly.
- **11.** The Show Committee reserves the right to change the order of a class, if necessary. Contestants would be notified, by public announcement, at least 1 class session prior to the change. Classes cannot be held earlier than scheduled unless all entries in that class sign off.
- **12**. It is each exhibitor's responsibility to keep informed with possible class/schedule changes and delays. All changes will be announced. It is up to each individual to be ready and on time for his/her classes!
- 13. All horses entered must be registered with either the Canadian Partbred Registry, AHA or CAHR. (Arabians with AHA or CAHR; Half & Anglo Arabians with AHA or Canadian Partbred Registry). Registration numbers must appear on the entry forms and contestants MUST show proof of registration and ownership prior to receiving their numbers. No entry numbers will be given out unless copies of these are produced at the show office. (A602.1).
- 14. All horses must be serviceably sound. In the case of suspected unsoundness, the Judge may have the animal examined by the Show Veterinarian and the decision of the Show Veterinarian shall be final. If the Veterinarian is not on hand, the decision of the judge shall be final. In case the veterinarian finds the horse in question unsound, the bill shall be the responsibility of the horse owner. In case the horse in question is deemed fit to show, the bill shall be the responsibility of AAHABC.
- **15.** The use of chains, rollers or similar devices on the show grounds during or before a show is prohibited and the Show Committee shall bar violators from further participation for the remainder of the entire show. Shoeing regulations are as per EC Rule Book.

- 16. All horses and riders must be appropriately attired or will not be permitted to enter the ring.
- 17. Each exhibitor is responsible for arriving in the holding area promptly after the class is called by the Whipper-In. A class will be called no more than three (3) times and anyone arriving for a class once the gates are closed will not be permitted to enter the ring, nor will they have their entry fee refunded. Upon entrance of the first horse, a 'two minute' gate will be adhered to.
- 18. There shall be no conferring with the Judge prior to or during the show. If anyone desires to meet the Judge, this can be arranged through the Show Steward. A protest must be in writing and must be addressed to the Secretary of the Show, and be accompanied by a \$ 111.00 deposit in cash or a certified cheque. It must be filed within forty-eight (48) hours of occurrence of the alleged violation in the class concerned. All protests will be handled according to the EC Rule Book.
- **19.** Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location (A602.5).
- **20**. Horses shall not be punished unnecessarily anywhere on the show grounds. Rules regarding cruelty and abuse covered by the EC will be strictly enforced.
- **21.** The Show Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry. Upon any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the Officials on the part of any owner, groom, rider, handler, driver, etc., the owner may forfeit his/her entry and such action will be reported to the EC and AHA. The management reserves to itself the right to remove any handler or horse from the show without being liable for compensation.
- 22. All dogs must be kept on a leash while on the show grounds. Please pick up after your dog.
- 23. Bicycles, motorcycles, scooters, golf carts, etc. are allowed on the show grounds but prohibited from operating near or in the show ring, warm-up rings, stabling areas. Minors who do not have a valid drivers license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle are not permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind on the show grounds. The parent(s), legal guardian(s) or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent/guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation.
- **24.** No riding of horses into the stabling areas.
- **25.** All horses artificially, improperly or unfairly prepared or tampered with before coming in the show area will be disqualified. If it is ascertained that an exhibitor has made, or caused to be made, any false statement in regard to any animal or article exhibited or if any exhibitor shall attempt to interfere with the Judge in performance of his/her duties, he/she shall be excused from competing or exhibiting.
- **26.** All American exhibitors are advised to check into Border regulations well in advance. Please do not write cheques payable in Canadian funds as we are heavily penalized by the banks with service charges. US cheques in US funds or Canadian money orders are acceptable and appreciated.
- **27.** All horses entered in any AHA approved show shall be owned, handled, ridden or driven by a member of AHA or the horse owner, rider, driver or handler shall pay an additional SINGLE EVENT FEE of \$ 45.00 . Juniors are not exempt.
- 28. The Veterinarian will be on call and at the expense of the exhibitor calling him. Payment must be made at the time of service for medical attention rendered and is to be paid by the owner or the agent of the horse. VET PERMIT: No Veterinarian other than the official Show Veterinarian will be permitted to treat, medicate, or attend to a horse on the grounds without the expressed written permission of the show management/official veterinarian. Exhibitors wishing to use another veterinarian must designate the farm or training stable the veterinarian will be working for, and obtain a permit for that veterinarian at the show office. Any veterinarian on the show grounds to treat horses must register with the official Show Veterinarian and must record, in writing, with the official show veterinarian, the name of the horse(s), owner, trainer and treatment of said horse(s) on the official form available at the show office or the official show veterinarian. The examination and treatment record used by the examining veterinarian can be substituted for the official form. Any veterinarian treating horses who fails to comply with this required course of action will be expelled from the show grounds. Show veterinarian: Wise Equine Veterinary Services: (604)888-0087

- **29.** All exhibitors shall be under the direction and control of the Show Committee but solely at the risk of the exhibitor. Each exhibitor will be solely responsible for loss, injury, damage done to; occasioned by; or arising from; any animal exhibited by him/her.
- 30. Junior exhibitors are not eligible to ride in Adult Amateur Owner (AAOTR) or Adult Amateur (AATR) classes.
- **31.** WHIP ABUSE: Judges will be required to excuse from the ring any horse shown at halter or performance that possesses a whip mark (welt) on any portion of its body. Rule 3-12: Any person reported to the Show Management as abusing a horse with a whip or other such devices, whether it be in the stable area, trailer area, hitching ring, warm up ring or show ring; and causing a disturbance as to affect the conduct and safety of other horses, and/or exhibitors, and/or spectators, shall be liable to disciplinary action. Such action may vary from a warning to expulsion from the ring, to suspension of a number of shows, to report to EPRB. NO ABUSE of horses shall be tolerated! In the event that this division fails to have a rule to cover a situation or where the rule is contradictory or ambiguous, then the Steward/Judge/Show Officials shall refer to the current AHA handbook for guidance.
- 32. Lungeing is allowed in the designated lungeing areas only! No exceptions.
- **33.** All adult entrants riding in AOTR/ATR classes MUST have 'Amateur Status' indicated on their current EC card to participate in any Amateur divisions.
- **34.** All horses ridden at Thunderbird Show Park during the Region 17 Pre-Show and Championship rental period must be appropriately saddled, bridled and ridden in a safe manner. Riders must wear appropriate footwear when riding. Riders not following this rule may forfeit entries.
- 35. Riders must dismount prior to entering stabling areas.
- **36.** Gate holds must be asked for and approved at least 3 classes prior. Gate holds are approved by the whipper in and show manager. Gate holds will only be granted for tack, rider or horse changes. Gate holds, if granted are 3 minutes only. That, added to the 2 minute open gate, provides a total of 5 minutes.
- **37.** Horses that are NOT competing in the show may not be brought on to the show grounds without permission of Show Management.

RV / Camping Rules

Assigned spots will be available Saturday at 4 pm July 15th and must be vacated by noon Monday July 24th, 2023

- 1. All RV Parking & hook-ups will be assigned by Region 17 only. Priority will be given to Region 17 exhibitors and sponsors.
- **2. Complete the RV Reservation request form** and send with payment directly to the Region 17 Show Entry Secretary, Marla Patterson.
- 3. Reservation requests must be received by June 12, 2023 (along with the entry form to the Region 17 show.
- 4. If there are not sufficient spots, a waitlist will be taken.
- 5. If RV space is available, spectators only must submit a request no later than July 12, 2023.
- 6. Each unit needs to register with the Show Offfice.
- 7. Units are not allowed to plug into each other for any reason.
- 8. Campfires are prohibited. Approved barbeque equipment is allowed. (propane, electric or briquette).
- 9. Pets must be kept on a leash at all times or contained in a firm pet type enclosure.
- 10. Fire lanes must be kept clear at all times.
- 11. Any trailer that is plugged into Thunderbird's electricity must be registered with Region 17, pay the full camping charge and display the RV Tag in the window closest to the entrance of the RV/trailer. Tags will be provided at the Show Office.
- 12. Once assigned, RV/Camping spots may not be moved or exchanged without written approval by Region 17.
- 13. Spots are priced by Amperage and sewer service. Spots with sewer service will be charged a weekly sewer fee.
- 14. For spots without sewer service, a contact name will be provided and individual arrangements can be made to have tanks pumped out. Pump-out service is provided on Wednesday and Saturday at \$50 each visit. Arrangements must be made and paid for by the individual camper.
- 16. When parking, ensure yo are not blocking access to any other unit.

EC Coach Status Requirements



In 2023, minimum Coach Status requirements will be enforced at all EC-sanctioned events. Recognizing some coaches will not have completed their EC Coach Status requirements when enforcement begins, the EC Board approved Temporary Coach Status (TCS) for the 2023 show season. Temporary Coach Status (TCS) will come into effect on July 1, 2023.

TCS applies to Canadian-residents coaching one or more athletes at any EC-sanctioned event and who do not meet minimum EC Coach Status requirements as listed below:

EVENT SANCTIONING	MINIMUM Coaching Requirement in 2023
EC Bronze and/or Silver	EC Registered Coach Status
EC Gold and/or Platinum	EC Licensed Coach Status



Currently, EC Coach Status requirements are only for those whose primary place of residence and coaching practices are within Canadian borders. Those whose primary place of residence is outside of Canada are considered International Coaches and are exempt from EC Coach Status requirements at this time.



The **TCS** fee is determined by the event sanctioning level and the individual coach's EC Coach Status. **TCS** is valid for one (1) EC-sanctioned event only. The TCS fee will increase annually until it is retired at the end of 2025.

Coaches without minimum coaching requirements must complete a TCS Form and submit this to the show office with appropriate payment. The show office will not issue numbers to athletes of any coach with insufficient coaching status until the TCS form and fee has been submitted.

The TCS fee may not be added to a trainer split or applied to one or more athletes' show bill without written consent from those included on the split and/or bill(s). This fee is to be incurred by the coach and not the athlete(s).

Border Crossing



With a few simple preparations, it is easy to cross the border. **People need a valid passport.** Covid tests and vaccinations are **NOT** required.





For horses, vaccination requirements are the same as USEF-licensed competitions a valid Coggins (Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA)) test.. "All horses attending EC sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1 and 4) vaccinations within six (6) months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the competition. No horse shall have received vaccination within seven (7) days prior to arrival at the event."



USDA website with link to Health Forms

A United States origin Health Certificate is required. It must be issued by a veterinarian no more than thirty (30) days prior to export.

A single health certificate can be used for multiple-horse consignments if all of the following provisions are met:

- **a.** All horses must be from a single consignor, they must be consigned to the same destination, and they must come from the same premises of origin.
- **b**. All horses must have current EIA test charts, and these charts must be attached to the health certificate. These charts must have accurate drawn descriptions of the horse, adequate to unambiguously identify the animal and link it to the certificate
- **c.** All horses must be identified on the health certificate with a written description.



USDA Health Forms

You may wish to check in with American Customs and provide them with a list of your tack and equipment before proceeding to Canada Customs. This is entirely optional, but could save some time on your return.

A Canadian Border Services agent will inspect your papers on arrival.

U.S. origin horses exported to Canada with a U.S. issued export health certificate (valid for 30 days from the date of inspection) may re-enter the U.S. for an unlimited number of times during the 30 day period **without** an USDA Veterinary Services port inspection. The importer must present the original export health certificate to customs at a land border port of entry designated for animals from Canada.

Horses entering Canada temporarily for competition do NOT require a "Border Bond" or security deposit



CBSA Memorandum D8-1-1

WA Dept of Transportation Border Information

It is common for third party importers to reference a 'border bond' when importing horses into Canada.

This is NOT required for horses imported temporarily for competition.

Refer to Canada Border Services Agency Memorandum D8-1-1.

"Horses

107. Horses and other equines imported temporarily for pasturage, competition, training or breeding qualify for customs duty free entry under tariff item No. 9993.00.00 and are non-taxable for the purposes of the GST/HST under the Non-taxable Imported Goods (GST/HST) Regulations and Item 39 of the Schedule to the Temporary Importation (Excise Levies and Additional Duties) Regulations. These provisions apply whether the importer is a resident or a non-resident of Canada.

108. Unless the inspecting officer has reasonable cause to believe that the horses will not be exported, the requirement to document the horses on a Form E29B and post a security deposit is waived. However, the importer must present any documentation required by OGDs" (Other Government Departments - such as the Health information described above.)

It is recommended you bring a copy of the Prize List and a copies of your entry forms as evidencr of temporary import for competition.

The Washington State Department of Transportation website provides excellent resources, including links to current border wait times and links to state-wide traffic cameras to check current conditions.


Equine Canada Ruling on Vaccination

IMPORTANT ARTICLE A602 -- MANDATORY INFORMATION

"All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. ARTICLE A802 ENTRY FORMS (7.) the following statement, must be signed by the person(s) responsible): "I hereby certify that every horse listed on this entry form has met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations".

ARTICLE A519 VACCINATIONS

All horses attending EC sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1 and 4) vaccinations within six (6) months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the competition. No horse shall have received vaccination within seven (7) days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be asked to leave event site at the discretion of competition management.

The frequency of vaccine administration should be as recommended by the vaccine manufacturer or veterinarian. It is recommended that vaccines be administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian. Competition management may request supporting documentation confirming a horse's compliance with mandatory vaccination requirements. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccines, a letter must be provided with the entry form from a veterinarian, on official letterhead, stating the equine cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns. At the discretion of competition management, a log of the horse's temperature prior to arrival at the event site or during the event can be requested.

OUR COMMITTMENT TO SAFER, MORE INCLUSIVE EQUESTRIAN SPORT

Whether you are an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, EC Sport Licence holders play a key role in ensuring the safety and wellness of equestrian sport.

EC SPORT LICENCE HOLDERS

Effective 2022, all EC Sport Licence holders must complete two (2) EC-recognized Safe Sport training modules: Fostering Healthy Equestrian Environments & Concussion Management

- Access these e-learning modules through ECampus at no cost as an EC Sport Licence holder.
- · Certificates of completion are valid for three (3) years.

Those who do not complete Safe Sport training within 30 days of EC Sport Licence purchase or renewal are listed as "Not in Good Standing" and ineligible to participate in EC events/activities until training is completed.

Check your Safe Sport training status by logging into MyEC and clicking on the ECampus button.

ECCOACHES

NEW in 2023 Effective July 1, 2023, all Canadians who coach athletes at EC-sanctioned events must meet minimum EC Coach Status requirements:

- EC Bronze & Silver events = EC Registered Coach (minimum)
- EC Gold & Platinum events = EC Licensed Coach

Coaches may apply for **Temporary Coach Status** (TCS) at EC-sanctioned events through until the end of 2025. TCS is valid for one (1) EC-sanctioned event only. Applicants must complete an affidavit and pay the associated fee at each event where TCS is requested.

Athletes may declare themselves as **Self-Coached** if they do not have an identified coach at a given EC-sanctioned event. Self-Coached athletes enter their own name and EC Sport Licence number where coaching information is required on entry forms.

IMPORTANT REMINDER: "When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance." **EC Rules, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.**
