COVID-19 PROTOCOLS AND PRACTICES

For this show, we will be observing the following practices and expect competitors to comply with all signage and published information. Updates and additions per state, local and Federation guidelines may be added at any time and will be distributed electronically to all competitors. It is your responsibility to disseminate the information to everyone in your group.

- **Temperatures:** Everyone on the grounds is required to self-monitor their temperature. 99.5 F (37.5 C) or below.
- Face Masks: Face coverings are required to be worn, at all times, when not mounted, and
 everyone is expected to bring their own. A participant may choose to wear a facemask or face
 covering when mounted on a horse and cannot be disqualified or penalized for doing so while
 competing.
- **Social Distancing:** A minimum, of six feet is the separation required. Groups who travel together may work out their own distancing, but face masks must be still be worn.
- **Hand Washing**: Must be done often in addition to the use of sanitizers.
- **Show Office**: We hope to conduct as much office business as possible by text, email, or phone. ONLY. If a problem is deemed to be too complicated, will limited access to the show office be granted. Packet distribution information will be emailed with times.
- Warm-up: A warm-up steward will be available to supervise warm-up areas beginning Friday morning. The monitor will keep a schedule of horses and times they are planning to use the arena(s). You must work with the steward. On show days, do not expect to enter any warm-up arena more than one hour prior to your designated time. Any equipment, attire, grooming, training items left unattended in any "common" area within the showgrounds will be removed.
- Limited Attendance: Only trainers, coaches, riders, grooms will be allowed on the grounds. If a rider is a minor, a parent will also be allowed. Each individual must be recorded with the office, must sign releases and must wear a wrist band and face mask at all times. No exceptions!
- Hospitality: Food will be available. All bleacher seating and hospitality areas will be closed.
- Spectators: No spectators will be allowed. (See Limited Attendance and Hospitality above)
- Awards: We are planning to distribute tests and awards outside the show office. Competitors are
 to observe social distancing when picking up the ribbon and/or prize. Classes, times and results
 will be on www.foxvillage.com, and updated as scores are imputed. It is HIGHLY recommended
 that exhibitors access their scores electronically if possible. Scores may be posted. If so, everyone
 is to observe social distancing when viewing.



High Point Qualifications for All levels - Intro through Grand Prix - Traditional and Western:

- Minimum classes to be ridden 3 at Intro through Third Level; 2 at Fourth level and above
- Minimum score for Year End awards, 55.000%
- Two tests per day/show will count. The highest two scores to be used.
- Qualifying period October 1 to September 30
- Points earned: First place = 5 points, Second place = 3 points, Third place = 1 point

To be eligible for year-end awards, you must do one of the following:

- **Be a** TEV chapter **sponsor**
- **OR Volunteer** a minimum of 4 hours per horse/rider combo. Volunteer hours may be assigned to horse/rider combo of choice in Rated or Schooling show. *Volunteer hours may be earned by*
 - 1.) Working at any TEV show (rated or schooling (Show set-up and tear-down worth double hours!)
 - 2.) Serving on a committee, 3.) Helping with a TEV educational event
- **OR** pay a nomination fee per horse/rider combo in current year. TEV chapter member \$25, non TEV chapter member \$35.

RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.
- 2. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management whose decision shall be final.
- 3. Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse how management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.
- 4. The management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and cancel award prizes without claims for damages; to cancel or combine unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges.
- 5. Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees.
- 6. Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation.
- 7. In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio-hazardous medical waste containers will be provided. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.
- 8. No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform.
- 9. It is the tradition of the show that riders be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed and the horses properly presented. Management may in its discretion bar any person from entering the ring if not suitable presented to appear before an audience.
- 10.CDS Members in good standing shall be eligible to participate, A non-member may participate as a rider, owner, lessee, or agent upon payment of a \$15 CDS non-member fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the requirements of this rule: USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux, and quadrille classes
- 11.ENTRY PROCEDURE: Entries must be made on an official entry form or photocopy of same and must be filled out completely, including all classes entered, all signatures, (no dittos), organization membership numbers and fees. Please include a photocopy of current membership ID for rider and owner. Amateur must provide a copy of their USEF Amateur card or proof of application for an Amateur card. An Internet search will be done for entries missing any of the required membership photocopies at a charge of \$20. Entries are accepted on a first-come, first served basis until classes are filled. Entries received after the closing date will be accepted only if the schedule permits. Each late entry that has been accepted shall be assessed a late fee of \$50. Changes to entries (\$25 fee) after the closing date will be at the sole discretion of the show management. No telephone entries will be accepted. Complete entry with check or credit card information must be mailed by closing date or a complete entry (with card copies and credit card payment) may be faxed to 760-728-6325 or emailed to dianaloire@aol.com. A 5% handling fee for credit card payments will be added. Payment in full or an open check or credit card information must accompany the entry. Mail completed entries to: E.R. Hamilton, PO Box 732, Bonsall, CA 92003.
- 12.AMATEURS AND JUNIORS: Amateurs are defined by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book. All riders entering the Amateur classes must possess or have applied for an USEF Amateur Card prior to riding in the class. All riders in Amateur Divisions must present an USEF Amateur Card by the closing date or they will be entered in the Open Division. Cards may be applied for at the show office. Individuals are eligible as Juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they will be 18 years of age. Individuals are eligible as Young Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 years and until the end of the calendar year in which they reach 21 years of age. Competitors will compete as Adults from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 22. Individuals possessing current amateur certification are only eligible as Adult Amateurs from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22.
- 13.**REFUNDS:** All fees, less a \$30 administrative fee, will be returned if horses are scratched before the Closing Date. THERE ARE NO REFUNDS FOR ANY REASON AFTER THE CLOSING DATE.
- 14.RETURNED CHECKS / CREDIT CARD DENIAL: Checks returned by the bank or credit cards denied for any reason are regarded as a most serious offense and will be handled according to the following procedure: A 10% penalty (minimum \$25.00) will be assessed for each returned check. Credit cards that do not go through will incur a penalty of at least \$10 for each occurrence.
- 15.**ARENA:** Show arena is 20 X 60 meters. Footing consists of sand mixed with dirt and textile footing. Only those horses registered with the show management are permitted use of the show facilities, warm-up arena and show arena. All horses in the warm-up arena must wear their competition numbers. Lunging is allowed in specific areas only and upon receiving permission of the ring steward.

RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION continued

- 16. STABLING, GROUNDS FEE: Permanent stalls, cinder block construction, 12x12 stalls with Dutch doors. Temporary stalls, composite construction, center isles 10x14 stalls with bottom doors. Stalls, and grooming stalls and tack stalls \$160 (Friday thru Sunday.) If you need to arrive before Friday, or stay longer than Sunday, you must call and make arrangements (951) 201-0686, extra days @ \$25. Late entry stall fees \$200 (Friday thru Sunday.) Grounds fee per show day of \$50 applies if not stabled.
- **17. BEDDING and FEED:** Shavings and hay may be ordered on your entry or by emailing <u>dianaloire@aol.com</u> or faxing to 760-728-6325. No straw allowed.
- 18. RV PARKING: In temporary stable area. Please make arrangements with Galway Downs directly at www.GalwayDowns.com
- 19. SHOW STATUS: In the event of inclement weather, natural or other disasters prior to the show, it is the competitor's responsibility to contact management as to the show status. Please call (951) 201-0686.
- 20. DOGS: Dogs must be on a leash. All animals should be managed so as to not disturb the competitors.
- **21. SCORED TEST:** Tests will be distributed to riders, or their authorized representative, after the results have been finalized and awards presented. Scores may be posted when available and will be at www.foxvillage.com.
- 22. STALLIONS: Stallions must be in a stall or remain in the trailer unless being managed by a qualified person.
- 23. SCHOOLING HORSES: Horses not entered in the show must be registered with the Horse Show office and will be given a number to be worn at all times when not in a stall or tied to a trailer. Appropriate stall or grounds fees mandatory fees of \$63 and a \$35.00 per day fee must be paid. Any person(s) riding a schooling horse must have signed an official entry blank. A schooling horse may be allowed in the warm-up arena at the discretion of the ring steward.
- **24. RIDE TIMES:** Times will be emailed to exhibitors and will be posted at TEV-CDS.com. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to contact show management if times are not received. Failure to enter the arena at the specified time may incur elimination.
- 25. HEADGEAR RULE: From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted.

If there are questions regarding this rule or the use of protective headgear at USEF dressage competitions please contact USEF.

26. GOLF CARTS: and all other motorized vehicles require a valid driver's license to operate. Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to Segway, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

27. USEF Equine Vaccination Rule:

- At Federation licensed competitions horses, more than 7 months of age, entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine 103 manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.
- In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.
- In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the

- owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.
- In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.

WDAA World Championship Show test/classes earn triple points.

USEF shows with a USEFlicensed Western Dressage judge earn double points. Check the WD judge directory on the WDAA home page under "Important Links" to see whether your judge qualifies for double points.
