- * EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.
- * Rules may have changed from the current USEF rule book. Check for changes on WWW.USEF.ORG. It is the rider/owner/trainers responsibility to be aware of changes
- * Junior/Young Rider Classes: Open to Junior and Young Riders only; any rider is eligible until the end of the calendar year in which they reach 21
- * Adult Amateur Classes (AA): Participants must possess a current USEF Amateur Card and qualify under the USEF Amateur rules. Open to Amateurs only; Riders must compete as adults from the beginning of the calendar year to have an amateur status with USEF.
- * Open Classes: Open classes are for all participants.
- * Opportunity Classes: Riders/Horses competing only in the "opportunity" classes are exempt from membership requirements and do not have to pay non-member, horse ID, or USEF drug fees. Owners, Trainers, and Coaches are exempt from the membership for these classes only. Scores earned in opportunity classes may not be used towards USEF/WDAA awards programs. These classes must follow all USEF Dressage Division rules and applicable USEF General Rules, including dress and saddlery
- * Classes per day: Horses are limited to a maximum of three dressage rides per day at fourth level and below (including Tests) or two Dressage rides per day above fourth level. Horses competing at both Fourth Level and Prix St. Georges, or their equivalents, are limited to two Dressage rides per day. Dressage Seat Equitation, Quadrille, Pas de Deux and Materiale classes are excluded from the maximum limit of rides per day and horses in these classes may compete at any level for which they are eligible during the same competition.
- * Consecutive Levels: Horses may enter no more than two consecutive levels, Freestyle levels included, at any one competition.
- * **Sharps Disposal:** Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. Containers are located at the end of each barn aisle and within center aisles when center aisles are present within the barns
- * **Protective Headgear Rule:** From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses and those competing in all classes and tests must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must be immediately prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and

Membership Statement

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR222) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Motorized Vehicle Rule: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

- * **Weather/Acts of God/Accidents or Emergency Policy:** Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, Accidents or Emergencies. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to CDI or USEF Program classes. No refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, Accidents or Emergencies.
- * **No Shows:** All "No Shows" that have not contacted the show office will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show and time slots may be filled. Exhibitors enter with this understanding and agreement.
- * **Membership/Registration Requirements:** Riders/Owners/Trainers/Coaches must be current USEF members, or a \$45 Non-Member Show Pass fee will apply. Riders/ Owners must also be a member of the USDF (participating for GAIG/USDF qualifying) or a \$35 Non-Member fee will apply. Horses must have at least a USDF HID number (\$35) to show. For GAIG/USDF qualifying the horse needs a USEF life or annual membership and a USDF life membership. Horses with only a HID are not eligible.
- * **Awards for USEF Classes:** Divisions (Jr/Yr, AA, Open) may be run concurrently as one class. Divisions will be pinned separately.
- * Riders must clearly specify division choice. When no designation is made, riders will automatically be entered as open.
- * Riders may enter only one division per class.
- * Ribbons to sixth for each class. No awards for qualifying classes.
- * Champion and Reserve ribbon awarded for the highest percentage at each per division (Open/Adult Amateur/Jr) for the weekend.
- * **Awards Notice:** It is the responsibility of the competitor to retrieve any awards obtained during the competition. Unclaimed awards will be assumed unwanted unless other arrangements are made prior to the completion of the competition.

Entry Information Requirement: Competitors are responsible to include a copy of all memberships for horse, owner, rider, and trainer listed on entry form.

- * NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED WITHOUT MEMBERSHIP CARD COPIES & COGGINS.
- * No horse will be permitted on the grounds without proof of vaccinations for Equine Influenza Virus & Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) within 6 months prior to arriving. Rule GR845
- * Entries must be received by Midnight of the closing date in the time zone of the competition. Any entry requiring a signature, payment, or copies of proof of valid membership will be considered incomplete and may incur additional fees.
- * No refunds after closing date, for any reason.
- * All fees must be paid in US funds.
- * Fees must accompany the entry form for each show entered. Entries not accompanied by fees will be considered late and not entered until fees are received including any late or post entry fees.
- * Entries postmarked or submitted after closing date will be considered late.
- * Numbers will not be given out until entries have been submitted to the show AND owners, riders and coaches or trainers have signed all entry blanks.
- * All entries for Open Classes are taken on a first come, first served basis. Only one horse-rider combination per entry form
- * Late Entries: Late entries will be accepted after the closing date if space is available, upon payment of an additional late entry fee.
- * Post Entries for: Entries will be accepted to fill scratches, up to the start of competition, if scheduling permits. No late entry fee will be required but will be required to pay a post entry fee in addition to the normal class fee.
- * Policy for Accepting Post Entries and Filling Scratches in classes: Must be eligible for class. Must have previously entered in competition as a competing or non-competing horse. Must register with secretary and put name on wait list.
- * Post entries in national classes will only be accepted to fill scratches in allotted time slots that are available ("allotted time" slots are determined by the Official schedule posted at the show office). Exceptions will be made when two or more competitors meet the same criteria and are deemed equal in priority status. Exceptions may also be made when conditions are created by weather or other natural disasters.
- * Online entries are accepted at www.equestrianentries.com.
- * Entries may be emailed to centerline@longvuestables and payment made by Venmo, Paypal, or Square. Checks may be mailed (must be post marked before the closing day)
- * Musical Freestyles: Music must be in an MP3 format and must be presented to the announcer at least two hours before scheduled ride. The schedule for sound checks will be posted at the show.
- * Cancellation prior to or on closing date - entire entry minus office fee.
- * Weather/Acts of God/Accidents or Emergency Policy: Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, Accidents or Emergencies. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to CDI or

USEF Program classes. No refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, Accidents or Emergencies.

FACILITY:

- * Important notice to all affected parties: Third parties may come upon the property or enter the facilities where any herein described or listed event will occur; provided, that this is a license to enter the premises, for the purpose of observing or participating in the event, but not otherwise, and such license to any individual is subject to revocation by the owner, lessee or organizer, and entry for any purpose other than granted herein, shall be deemed criminal trespass and subject to appropriate legal proceedings.
- * Stabling: Permanent stalls with doors, stall size 12x12
- * Bedding: Additional bags available on the entry form
- * Arenas: A sand/clay mixture footing is in both arenas. Both the warm up and competition arenas are covered.
- * All classes will be conducted in a standard size arena 20x60
- * Dogs: Facility rules require that dogs must be on a leash (not to exceed 6 feet in length) or suitably restrained in a tack stall/cage etc. Loose animals/animals left in vehicles in distress, etc. can and will be removed from the grounds at the owner's expense.
- * Photography: Centerline Show Series will be using a professional photographer for the duration of the show. By entering the competition competitors are giving the show permission to take photographs and to use those photographs in promotion of this event and future events.
- * Directions: From I-24 E – Take exit I-75 N towards Knoxville. In 19 miles take exit 20 onto US-64 East. Turn left onto Bypass US-64. Continue onto Pleasant Grove Rd. In half a mile turn right and you will arrive at facility.

WDAA Horse Lifetime Performance & Award Program

WDAA supports a Lifetime Performance & Award Program. This is a point-tracking system awarding cumulative milestone achievements to horses competing in Western Dressage. Enrolled horses earn points by competing in tests and rail classes at WDAA recognized shows. Class placings and percentages are converted to a point system, which follows the horse as they travel up the levels on their journey. The program was designed to be approachable and realistic for every horse and rider, regardless of their stage of training. The Lifetime Performance & Award Program follows the WDAA mission statement, values the partnership between horse and rider, and encourages a systematic education developing both the physical and mental abilities of the horse. The program does not require extensive travel nor significant financial investment; instead rewarding training, participation and performance. Points follow the horse and transfer to new owners. The result is a record system celebrating attainable goals that further the relationship of horse and rider within the Western Dressage system.
