

Management reserves the right to change officials, combine or cancel classes and modify the schedule to make whatever changes are required by circumstances to the competition specifications.

Management reserves the right to refuse or require withdrawal of an entry for cause deemed sufficient by Show Management.

Ribbons will be awarded 1st-6th place. High Score will be given in all divisions. To be eligible for High Score, you MUST ride at least three (3) tests.

Refunds: Entries canceled for any reason prior to the closing date, October 7th, 2021 will be refunded everything except the Office Fee. In the event the competition is canceled, all entry fees except the Office Fee will be refunded.

USEF Membership Statement

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1)leadline; 2)exhibitions; 3)games and races; 4)classes for 4-H members; 5)walk trot (exemption: Friesian performance FR218) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6)USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7)NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8)Opportunity classes; 9)citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation;10)USEA beginner novice division; and 11)assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Minors Operating Motorized Vehicles

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including but not limited to golf carts, motorcycles, scooters or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of the rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from the operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelcharis and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

USEF Drug Fee – To provide funds for research, inspection and enforcement of rules regarding use of medication and drugs, each exhibitor must pay \$23 per horse (\$15 Drugs and Medications, \$8.00 Administration) entered in the show including halter and equitation horses.

Stabling

All horses must have a stall or pay a grounds fee. Requests for adjoining stalls from different owners will be honored if all entries are mailed together.

A NEGATIVE COGGINS TEST WITHIN THE LAST 12 MONTHS MUST BE INCLUDED WITH ENTRY.

Health Requirements – All horses entering Virginia are required to have an official health certificate within 30 days per the Board of State Veterinarians.

Show Management may, at its sole discretion, refuse an entry of an exhibitor, or the participation of, an agent, trainer, rider or handler who has shown an objectionable attitude towards a USEF Recognized competition or displayed previous unsportsmanlike behavior at a USEF Recognized competition or towards its management, as well as those persons suspended or expelled from any previous USEF Recognized competitions by USEF.

Payment of Fees — There will be a \$100 charge for any returned checks. Stopping payment on checks or placing holds on credit card charges is in violation of USEF rules and an all violations will be filed with USEF.

Failure to Check Out – Prior to leaving the show grounds, please come to the show office and settle you accounts. Failure to check out at the show office will result in a non-checkout fee of \$50.00.

Post Entries – Closing date is October 7, 2021. Entries postmarked after this date will automatically be considered Post Entries and assessed the post entry fee as shown in the fee schedule. A United Postal Service postmark will take precedence over postmarks from private meters, etc.

Condition of Entry – The Show Committee and the Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or cancel an entry, disqualify exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries and remove from the grounds any individual, stable or both without claim for damages. The submitting of an entry form to the show shall constitute an acceptance by each person signing same of the provisions herein set forth.

Protests - See USEF Chapter 6

Indemnity and Responsibility – All entries are accepted with the understanding that neither the Airfield 4-H Center or Heritage Arabian Horse Association, the Show Committee, nor any Show Official, will be held responsible for any loss, damage, or injury to any horse exhibited or any article of any kind. All horses shall be under the control and direction of the show committee but the solely at the risk of the exhibitor, who will be responsible for any loss, damage or injury to any person, animal or property occasioned by him, and the exhibitor shall indemnify the above mentioned parties against any and all loss, damages and liability thus occasioned, including but not limited to any and all legal costs, including attorney fees, which may be incurred as a result thereof.

This horse show is conducted in accordance with the rules of the USEF. The official rule book of USEF will prevail for this show. This prize list is based on rules of the current rule book and the handbook of the Arabian Horse Association, where they apply respectively; any changes or corrections of rules will automatically become a part of the prize list. Each participant is the show is responsible for knowledge of and is subject to the USEF rules. Questions not covered by USEF rules shall be decided by the show committee and its decisions will be final. By entering the show, each exhibitor agrees to abide by the final decision of the Show Committee and USEF Steward.

Directions to the Airfield 4-H Center – 15189 Airfield Rd., Wakefield, VA 23888 (757) 899-4901

Take Route 460 to Wakefield. East bound traffic turn right at the signal light on Route 460 onto Route 628. West bound traffic turn left at the signal light on Roto Route 628. Go 5 ½ miles on Route 628. Turn right onto Turkey Pen Road and go ¾ of a mile. The Airfield Conference Center Entrance is on the left. From Richmond, VA − Take I-95 or I-295 South to Petersburg. Take Route 460 East towards Suffolk/Virginia Beach. In Wakefield follow the above directions.

From Norfolk, VA – Take I 264 West to Bowers Hill area and pick up Route 58 West towards Suffolk. Follow Route 58 until you see the exit to 460 West. Turn onto Route 460 West until you get to Wakefield. Follow the above directions.

Sharps Containers - Competition management shall place a minimum of one sharps container per each competition whether or not stabling is provided. Additionally, at least one sharps container per fifty occupied stalls for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments in convenient locations in barns housing competition horses. It is competition management's responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitor or their agents, up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. Competition management will place a notice of this requirement either in its prize list or on a specific handout given to trainers on check in at the competition. If local law has different requirements, local law will prevail. GR 1210.4 Equine Vaccination Rule - 1. At federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management, Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration by or under the direction of a veterinarian. 2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations, name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration. 3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody and control of the horse, name serial number and expiration date of the vaccine and date of vaccine administration. 4.In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward or technical delegate when requested. 5. Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee. BOD 1/17/15 Effective 12/1/15

GUIDELINES FOR GAITED HORSES


There are a significant number of gaited horse breeds (about 30 in North America), all with gaits specific to their breed. In Western Dressage competition, the gaited horse will perform a saddle gait in place of the jog. The saddle gait selected should be the gait in which the horse is balanced and athletically comfortable performing. The saddle gait is a 4 beat lateral or diagonal gait, timely and evenly performed. The tempo, rhythm and foot falls of the gait they choose to show must not change throughout the test. The true four beat gait the horse performs, should be able to be ridden in a working, lengthened, free and collected manner as the Western Dressage test calls for.

All rules can be found in the USEF Rule Book under Western Dressage.

WD106 Saddle Gait

The saddle gait has a noticeable increase in cadence from the working walk. Excessive speed or slowness will be penalized.

- 1. In lieu of a jog, gaited horses perform gaits of various rhythms and footfalls. The gaited horse will perform a saddle gait in place of the jog.
- The saddle gait may be either a lateral or diagonal gait, timely and consistently performed. The tempo, rhythm and foot falls of the gait the rider chooses to perform must not change throughout the test. The gait the horse performs, should be able to be ridden in a working, lengthened, free and collected manner as the Western Dressage test specifies.
- 3. The quality of the saddle gait is judged by general impression, i.e. the regularity and rhythm of the steps, the cadence and impulsion. This quality originates from the horse having a supple back and well engaged hind quarters, and the ability to maintain the same rhythm and natural balance in all variations of the saddle gait.
 - a. Collected Saddle Gait. The horse, remaining "on the bit", moves forward with the neck raised and arched and showing clear self-carriage. The head approaches the vertical position and a light contact is maintained with the mouth. The hocks are well-engaged and must maintain an energetic gliding impulsion, enabling the shoulders to move more freely. Although the horse's steps are shorter than in the other saddle gaits, elasticity and cadence are not lessened.
 - b. Working Saddle Gait. With an energetic, regular consistent rhythm; the horse must go forward with consistent and elastic steps. The back must be relaxed and the shoulders free, while there is an obvious push from the hindquarters. The hind legs actively glide under the horse. The horse must show proper balance and maintain light contact with the bit. The horse's nose must be on or slightly in front of the vertical.
 - c. Lengthening of Stride. This is a variation of the Working saddle gait; the horse covers more ground while maintaining the same tempo, consistent rhythm as in the Working saddle gait. Speeding up is a fault.



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d. Free Saddle Gait. The Free saddle gait will show moderate lengthening of stride and frame compared to the Working saddle gait. Without hurrying, the horse goes forward with clearly lengthened steps, with impulsion from the hindquarters and uphill balance. The rider allows the horse to carry the head a little more in front of the vertical than at the Collected and the Working saddle gait. The horse's neck is "out", down and forward, with the nose slightly in front of the vertical, with a loose rein and the poll at approximately the same height as the wither (the neck is level). The steps should be consistent, the whole movement balanced and unconstrained, while maintaining a consistent rhythm.
