Spring Fever offers Six Feet on the Ground, Long-Reining, Dressage, Western Dressage, and NAWD All-Around Freestyle and is an **excellent chance to practice for the WDAA International Challenge, as all WDAA tests will be judged by one of the Challenge judges, Sharron Sarchet!**

** Tests submitted by the early bird date will receive a \$10 discount on office fees.

This show is recognized by the Western Dressage Association of America (**WDAA recognition # 22-348**) and eligible for ½ points for Lifetime Achievement Awards. It is also a qualifying show for the WDAA World Show.

Fees are \$28/test for NAWD/FOSH, \$38/test for non-members plus a \$10 Office Fee per horse/rider combination for each show IF registration is received by the "early bird" date. Registrations received after this date will incur an office fee of \$20.

Please submit one registration per horse and rider combination; separate registrations are required for each show.

Upon registration, watch for an email with instructions for submitting your video link. Videos should be uploaded to your own YouTube account as "unlisted", and the YouTube link will be submitted for judging.

Awards: Top 6 places in each class for Dressage and Western Dressage for Junior (14 & Under), Young Rider (15-21), Adult Amateur, and Open Divisions will receive ribbons within 3 weeks after the show closes.

Video Instructions

PLEASE NOTE: At the discretion of the scoring judge or show manager, improper arena set up or improper filming/editing may be deemed inappropriate and may be cause for disqualification. Fees are non-refundable. Videos submitted on or before the "review date" will be reviewed by showmanagement and have the opportunity to be re-recorded if they are not acceptable.



1. The dressage court must be in proper position and measured to scale. Clear, visual markers are required for each dressage Court letter, each marker must be a minimum of 12 inches high. The minimum size allowed is 55ft by 110ft for a small dressage court and 55ft by 165 for a large court <u>Click here for your free Dressage Court Calculator</u>

2. At the beginning of the test, a sign should be shown that includes the rider and horse name; show name; date of video; and test information (class/level/test number). If it is not possible to show a physical sign an oral announcement may be made with this information. **NOTE**: the required information MUST be displayed on a physical sign for all WDAA western dressage tests (see WDAA online show rules attached)

3. At the end of the video, a tack inspection is performed by either (a) the cameraman circling the rider or (b) the rider slowly turning the horse around 360 degrees in front of the camera (either mounted or unmounted

Visible blood on the horse is cause for elimination.



4. After the rider dismounts, he/she must demonstrate that 2 fingers can be inserted between the horse's nose and both noseband and flash. The rider should then remove the bridle and hold it in front of the camera so that the bridle and bit can be inspected for a minimum of 7 seconds. Refer to WDAA online show rules for this inspection.

5. The camera/recorder must be positioned at the letter C at a minimum height of 4ft from the ground on a steady object or tripod. It must be far enough back so that the letter C can be viewed by the judge. Whenever possible, elevate the recording device by using a ladder, truck bed, or other elevated platform.

6. The video must be created and submitted in landscape format.

7. The full horse and full rider/handler MUST be within the frame of the camera at all times. Please use the zoom as needed to allow the judge to evaluate the horse and rider/handler while **including all letters** that are a part of any given movement. For example, for a 20m circle at A includes the entire far ½ of A, so focus your camera so that E and B are within the frame. If zoom is overused such that the judge cannot see the geometry of any movement, you may receive a score of 4 for "insufficient" or "0" for movement unclear or not shown.

8. If a video presents unclear, out of focus or the horse/rider/handler exits frame partially or completely for at least 3 maneuvers in a test, the test may be disqualified. Individual movements may also be penalized or given a lower score at the judge's discretion.

9. Video must be recorded from beginning to end without editing. If there is questionable content, the test may be disqualified at the judge's or show manager's discretion.

10. Besides a caller for your test when allowed by organizational rules, no instruction given to the rider/handler is permissible and will result in an automatic disqualification.

11. Videos may not be submitted to be judged more than once.

12. Every "error" (wrong direction, wrong gait, etc.) shall be penalized with a 2-point deduction. After 3 errors, the competitor is eliminated.

13. Movements that are not performed will receive a score of "0"

After recording your video, please upload it to your own YouTube Channel as "unlisted", and submit it for judging using the link provided in your order confirmation email. The date of your video must not be outside of the date range for the show you are entering.

WDAA RECOGNIZED ONLINE SHOW GUIDELINES FOR EXHIBITORS

- To be recognized by WDAA, online shows must meet the same criteria for recognition as do live shows. Refer to the Show Recognition section at <u>https://wdaalifetimepoints.org/show-recognition-information/</u>
- Online show hosts should provide this information by a link to this web page and in any other show materials to their exhibitors and judge for them to be informed about how these shows are to be conducted and judged.
- Online shows are available from several providers. All shows that meet the specific criteria provided by the show host in addition to those listed below are eligible for WDAA show recognition.
- Online rail classes are not eligible for WDAA recognition.
- WDAA Recognized ONLINE SHOW GUIDELINES FOR EXHIBITORS .
 - Use arenas that are as near as possible to regulation size and be sure letters are set appropriately to be viewed by the judge. Cones with large letters on them and poles on the ground to delineate the corners are acceptable.
 - Videos of tests must be unedited from start to finish, including the equipment, attire, and bit check.
 They must be one continuous recording with the horse and rider visible at all times.
 - Videos **must** be filmed in LANDSCAPE orientation.
 - After entering the arena, prior to beginning the test, a sign must be held up showing the name of the show, date of the show, horse's name, class # and test. Remove the sign just before beginning the ride. Please make sure that all information is clear and easy to read for the judge. The videographer can hold the sign then move back to behind the camera or hold the sign in front of the camera at arm's length while also holding the camera.
 - Keep the horse in frame, paying close attention to the near corners. You may zoom in slightly on the far corners. Videos must be in focus.
 - Make sure to keep the letters in the frame that are elements of the test being performed.
 - As soon as the test is finished, the camera must slowly circle the horse and rider showing all equipment and attire, including spurs and whip if used. If the videographer is unable or unwilling to enter the arena to do the filming, the rider may turn the horse slowly to allow complete filming of the equipment.

- Following equipment check, the rider will dismount and show that two fingers can fit between the bosal or cavesson and the horse's cheek, then drop the bit so it can be evaluated. NOTE: Hold the bridle so as not to obscure the curb strap or curb chain. Demonstrate that the curb strap or chain is flexible and is at least ½ inch wide. Make sure the judge can see all parts of the bridle, including bit and reins clearly.
- The test must be videoed from C, where the judge would normally be seated.
- The test may be called.
- Coaching during the test is not allowed.
- The natural background sound for the test must be audible. Tests with no sound at all will not be accepted.
- Bridle or saddle pad numbers are not allowed.
- Exceptional riders are exempt from the dropping the bit requirement in online shows.
- Ridden tests may be submitted to ONLY ONE online show. A video of a test/ride from another competition that has already been judged must be eliminated. Any video suspected of having been filmed during another competition will not be scored.
- All classes must be designated with a unique class number; no horse may be ridden more than once in any western dressage class with the same class number, including TOC classes.

Noncompliance with the above guidelines will be cause the test to be eliminated.

These guidelines are to help the judge give you the most accurate evaluation possible and to keep the playing field level for everyone. Always direct questions concerning showing to the online show host listed on the prize list.
