Division & Championship Awards on Show Weekends

Introductory, Training Level, First Level, Second Level and Above, Western Dressage Intro, WD Basic, WD Level One, WD Level Two & Above

Up to 6 Ribbons will be presented per class at each show day. Champion and Reserve awards for all listed divisions above. Only one Champion & one reserve winner, per division, per weekend. To be eligible for year-end awards, the same horse and rider must compete as the same combination and attend a minimum of six shows. Each day counts as one show, meaning you must attend six days of showing to be considered for year-end awards. Show management retains the right to split and combine classes as they see fit. If less than 6 entries enter a class, small ribbons will be awarded.

Entries

Entries must be submitted via online form at <https://horseshowoffice.com>. Entries close at midnight on close date. There will be a \$50.00 late fee for post entries after the closing date. All Entry Fees are non-refundable after the closing date.

Show Fees

- Class fee: \$20/class
 - EMT & Office Fee: \$35
 - Haul-in Fee: \$25 (if not stabled on grounds)
 - Stabling: \$100 (\$50 STALL DEPOSIT REQUIRED, REFUNDED/VOIDED IF STALL IS STRIPPED ON DEPARTURE FROM SHOW)
 - Tack Stall: \$100 (may be limited by show management)
 - Shavings: \$10/bag
 - Camping Fee: \$25
 - Non-competing horse: \$30
 - Late Entry Fee: \$50.00 per entry (Any entry submitted in the Late Entry Window)
 - Class Change/Time Change Fee: \$25.00 per change (if possible) after the Show Registration window

Division Qualifications

All classes will be split into JR/YR, AA, and Open divisions for placings.

- Junior (JR): Individuals are eligible as Juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18.
- Young Rider (YR): Individuals are eligible as Young Riders from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21.
- Adult Amateur (AA): Riders aged 22 & over as of January 1st, 2024 who do not qualify as professionals
- Open: All riders who do not qualify as JR/YR or AA
- Test of Choice Classes: Classes will be split by test, or JR/YR, AA, and Open if there are enough entries.

Please specify the Level, Test, and Division you plan to ride on your entry form. Classes may be entered up to 4 times with the same horse/rider combination. Each ride must be ridden with a different test following USEF/USDF rules regarding showing consecutive levels.

PLEASE INDICATE YOUR DIVISION AND CLASS DESCRIPTION (LEVEL AND TEST NUMBER) ON ENTRY FORM; FAILURE TO DO SO WILL RESULT IN BEING PLACED IN OPEN IF CLASSES ARE SPLIT.

RULES & REGULATIONS

WYN FARM LLC Management or "Management" reserves the right to itself to interpret all questions and conditions regarding or arising out of an incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these Rules/Regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management, their decision to be final. The Horse Show Management reserves the right to limit entries, refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel award prizes, without claim for damages; to cancel or combine any classes, or to reschedule classes, after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or judges; to change specifications in dressage classes in order to facilitate the time schedule or as competition warrants, or make any

changes management deems is in the best interests of the show.

If the show is canceled by show management for any reason (unsafe weather or emergency) all show fees will be reimbursed.

Every horse entered for competition will be under the control of the Horse Show Management, but Management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Horse Show, its members, directors and employees, sponsoring entities, and facility harmless for any loss or accident to his horse, horses or equipment which may occur from sickness, fire, negligence or otherwise.

Shows start at 9:00AM, but subject to change, please review ride times. Changes in ride times may be made by show management after the closing date and publications of ride times. Ride times available Friday evening before the show at HorseShowOffice.com. Ride times are posted on the show office bulletin board on Friday.

Multiple riders are permitted to show one horse. Each horse can be ridden in 2 consecutive levels.

EMT may be on grounds during show hours. Closest hospital is Sparrow Hospital in Lansing, Michigan.

Tests are the current USDF, USEA, or WDAA Tests. Horses may be entered in two consecutive levels only. Riders may have all tests read. Ties will be broken by the highest judges' corrective marks.

Coggins/Vaccination: No entry will be accepted without a photocopy of a negative Coggins test for each horse brought to the show grounds, with horse's name matching entry forms. A photocopy of a negative Coggins test dated within 12 months of the closing date of entered show must be submitted with each entry form. Entries submitted without a negative Coggins test will not be accepted. Proof of Influenza vaccination within the past 12 months is also be required. Please submit documentation with entry.

Campers: Camper Fee \$25.00 per weekend. No Electric or water hook up. May bring generators.

Protective Headgear: All riders must wear an ASTM/SEI approved riding helmet while mounted anywhere on the show grounds (Professionals included). Any rider violating this rule will be immediately prohibited from further riding until the headgear is properly in place. Wyn Farm LLC makes no representation or warranty, expressed or implied, about any protective headgear, and cautions riders that serious injury may result despite wearing protective headgear as all equestrian sports involve an intrinsic element of risk.

Schooling: Management reserves the right to limit schooling in the show rings as needed. Lunging is only permitted in designated areas; prohibited on grass and in show arenas

Rings: All weather footing. Main Ring: 300' x 285' Schooling Ring: 180' x 90'. All tests will be run in a 20 x 60m (standard) arena or a 20 x 40m (small) arena. Ring size can be changed at management discretion.

Scratches: After the show registration closing date cancellations for any reason are charged all fees. No exceptions.

Dogs: ALL DOGS must be leashed. Dogs must ALWAYS be leashed while on the show grounds, (including handheld dogs). No dogs will be allowed in any schooling area, show ring or in the secretary office without management permission. Management reserves the right to ask a dog to leave the property. No leash may exceed 6 feet in length.

Smoking: No smoking on property.

Veterinary Care & Farrier Services: All local on call vets & farrier services in the area will be listed on our show office bulletin board on Friday during haul in. This is to ensure the most up to date and available services at that time. The closest emergency large & small animal vet is Michigan State University on 736 Wilson Rd, East Lansing, MI 48824.

Attire: All riders MUST wear approved ASTM helmets while mounted. Boots with a heel, shirt/jacket with collar and

sleeves required. Riders in Intro may show in a polo shirt with a collared neck and half chaps. Western dressage riders must wear show attire, but chaps are optional.

Awards: Up to 6 ribbons per class will be presented at each show. Champion and Reserve awards for all listed divisions, 3 entries per division must compete for championships to be awarded, divisions & classes may be combined or split at management discretion. Championships will be awarded based on the highest percentage test per horse and rider team. Divisions & classes may be combined by management.

Year End Awards & Championships

Year End Champion, reserve, and third through sixth place awards are given in the following divisions:

- Intro Level Open, Intro Level JR/YR, Intro Level AA,
- Training Level Open, Training JR/YR, Training Level AA,
- First Level Open, First Level JR/YR, Training Level AA,
- Second Level Open, Third Level and Above, Musical Freestyle,
- Western Dressage Intro Open, Western Dressage Intro JR/YR, Western Dressage Intro AA,
- Western Dressage Basic Open, Western Dressage Basic JR/YR, Western Dressage Basic AA,
- Western Dressage Level One Open, Western Dressage Level One JR/YR, Western Dressage Level One AA,
- Western Dressage Level Two Open,
- Western Dressage Level Three Open and Above.

Awards will be based on the highest percentage ride. Riders must attend at least 6 of the 10 shows to qualify. Each day is considered a show. To receive points towards year-end awards the rider must use the same name at each of the shows. The points follow each horse and rider combination. Awards through 6th place. Circuit Championship divisions may be combined or split at management discretion.

Special Classes Rules and Regulations:

- English and Western Musical Freestyles
 - The Musical Freestyle class will be judged following the USDF guidelines for Training Level through Fourth Level, and the WDAA guidelines for Intro through Level 4. The performance should clearly show the unity between rider and horse as well as harmony in all the movements and transitions. It is an open class, so that all levels of riders and all test levels will be combined for placings. A sound system will be available. Please have your music selections available as a MP3 on a device that can be plugged in using an auxiliary cord or a USB thumb drive, with a backup copy on a CD.
- English and Western Equitation Classes:
 - Open to all Adult Amateur, Junior, and Open riders. Riders will be judged on hands, seat, aids, performance of the horse, and harmony between horse and rider. The class is offered as Walk/Trot (Jog) or Walk/ Trot (Jog)/ Canter (Lope) and will be performed on the rail, and will show the gaits in both directions. Horses should back easily and stand quietly.
 - A horse/rider combination is eligible for Walk/Trot English Dressage Equitation if they are not competing in above the Intro Level at the individual competition. A horse/rider combination is eligible for Walk/Jog Western Dressage Equitation if they are not competing in Western Dressage above the Intro Level at the individual competition.
