\$50.00 Intro through Level 4 Tests

\$45.00 Non-Competing Horse (Schooling only)

OTHER SHOW FEES

\$25.00 Office Fee

\$50.00 Returned Check Fee

\$15.00 Incomplete Entry Fee

\$20.00 Late/Post Entry Fee (applies to entries RECEIVED after March 31, 2023)

\$25.00 Rider/Horse Change Fee: For either rider or horse after entries have been submitted. Change of both is a new entry.

\$20.00 Trailer-in per day (*do not pay if you've paid for overnight stabling or a day stall*)

STABLING FEES:

\$60.00 Day Stall (2 bags of required minimum bedding is included)

\$105.00 Overnight Stabling (2 bags of required minimum bedding is included)

- Smoking is prohibited in stall areas or near barns
- Use sharps containers provided in barn area. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

NOTE: Beginning in 2022, horses must have competed in at least one WDAA Recognized Show during the year to qualify for showing at the WDAA World Championship Show

ENTRIES

Accepted on first come, first serve basis by on-line entries or mail. One entry per horse/rider combination. Post entries will be accepted on a space available basis with late fee.

ALL COMPETITORS MUST SUBMIT WITH THEIR ENTRY. A CURRENT COGGINS DATE WITHIN 12 MONTHS OF SHOW DATE. AND SAFE SPORT CERTIFICATE EXPIRATION DATE FROM USEF MEMBERS.

MAIL ENTRIES:

A \$50 NSF fee will be charged for all returned checks.

Entry Cancellation/Refunds: Office fee is not refundable. Entries with written cancellation on or before the closing date will receive 100% refund of all fees minus the \$20 office fee. NO REFUNDS after Closing Date even if original Closing date is extended. Entries must be received by 6:00 pm on the closing date. NO REFUNDS for any reason after the start of warm-up day, including cancellation of a class or classes or all or part of the competition due to severe weather, accident or any other emergency.

Non-Compete Horses: must complete entry form for number. Stabling or haul in & office fee required

Ride Times: Preliminary ride times and a show schedule will be available on ADA's website, www.azdressage.org no later than Wednesday before the show. A ride time schedule will be emailed to rider. Emails must be valid and readable. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule.

No Shows: All "No Shows" that have not contacted the show office will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show and time slots may be filled. **Scratches During Show:** Competitors have responsibility to inform the Show Secretary in the Show Office of their intent to scratch a ride prior to the scheduled ride time. Scratches will not be accepted at the competition arena or with the Ring Steward. Scratches are not refundable.

ARENAS/FOOTING: Competition arenas are 20m X 60m with sand/dirt footing mixture. A sand/dirt footing mixture arena is available for warm-up, with a separate lunging area. Lunging is allowed only in the designated lunging area and not in the warm-up area during the show, competition arenas will be open for hand walking only around the outside of the dressage arena up to one half hour prior to the start of the first class. Mounted schooling is permitted in the competition arenas after the end of each competition day, weather and daylight permitting.

NOTE: Per WDAA rules, warm up and schooling for WDAA classes can **only be in the warm-up arena designated for the Western Dressage Fall Fest competitors.** When schooling/warm up or competition, WD riders must wear their bridle number.

Food/Concessions: Available on the grounds.

Parking: No car or trailer parking between the barns and arenas. Trailers must be parked in the designated areas. Do not block the fire lanes.

Awards: Award and ribbon to 1st place in each division, ribbon for 2nd through 6th place in each division. Ties will be broken per USEF DR 123.3

Management: Show management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally and/or cancel awards of prizes without claims for damages & change order of classes, cancel, split, or combine classes at its discretion if entries deem necessary.

Scratches: Scratches before the closing date may be made for any reason and all fees will be refunded except the office fee.

Dogs: Dogs are welcomed but must be on a 6' leash at all times and are NOT allowed in warm up areas! No expandable leashes. Any loose dogs will result in owner being charged \$50 that will be donated to the local Humane Society. Any dog becoming a nuisance will be asked to leave the grounds.

A Horse/Rider combination may enter no more than two consecutive levels, Freestyle levels included, at any one competition. Suitability, Hack and Equitation are excluded from the maximum limit of rides per day and horses in these classes may compete at any level for which they are otherwise eligible during the same competition. No horse may be ridden more than once in any Western Dressage class (including separate divisions or sections of the same class number). Horses cannot be ridden by more than two riders. Rides will be limited to 4 tests per horse, excluding suitability, equitation, and hack. If there is a conflict with breed division rules regarding WD102.2, the breed division rules will govern United States Equestrian Federation rules are in force from the moment show management allows access to the showgrounds. This includes conduct, correct saddlery and equipment, and attire. Exhibitors should also be aware of the USEF rules governing drugs and medications. MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

2023 USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules). Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes

NORTH (FLAGSTAFF):

I-17 South to SR-101 Loop – Eastbound into Scottsdale. Take the Pima/Princess exit. Make a left at Bell Road (second light) Continue east on Bell Road. Turn right on 94 Street. Travel south to the WestWorld entrance.

EAST (GLOBE):

US-60 (Superstition Freeway) West to SR-101 Loop, SR-101 North to Frank Lloyd Wright Blvd. exit. Exit at Frank Lloyd Wright Blvd.. Move to far right lane. Continue straight, crossing the Frank Lloyd Wright intersection; move to right lane. The entrance is ½ block from interssection. Turn right at large horse statue.

SOUTH (TUCSON):

I-10 to US-60 (Superstition Freeway), US-60 East to SR-101 Loop, SR-101 North to Frank Lloyd Wright Blvd. Exit at Frank Lloyd Wright Blvd., move to far right lane. Continue straight, crossing the Frank Lloyd Wright intersection. WestWorld entrance is ½ block north on the right at large horse statue.

WEST (CALIFORNIA):

I-10 East to SR-101 North (near Tolleson). Remain on SR 101 into Scottsdale. Take the Pima/Princess exit. Make a left at Bell Road (second light) Continue east on Bell Road. Turn right on 94 Street. Travel south to the WestWorld entrance. Follow signs to RV Check-In.

Please note that WestWorld has 3 entrances. The Main entrance is located just north of Frank Lloyd Wright on the north bound access road of SR-101. The north entrance is at 94th Street and Bell Road. The McDowell Mountain Ranch entrance is only open during show season and special events. Call in advance if you have any questions.
