\$25.00 Rider/Horse Change Fee: For either rider or horse after entries have been submitted. Change of both is a new entry.

\$30.00 Trailer-in per day (do not pay if you've paid for overnight stabling or a day stall)

STABLING FEES:

\$60.00 Day Stall (2 bags of required minimum bedding is included)

\$105.00 Overnight Stabling (2 bags of required minimum bedding is included) Arena will not be available for schooling on Thursday prior to competition day. Facility will only be available for hand walking and moving into stalls and set up.

- Smoking is prohibited in stall areas or near barns
- Use sharps containers provided in barn area. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

Accepted on first come, first serve basis by on-line entries or mail. One entry per horse/rider combination. Post entries will be accepted on a space available basis with late fee. ALL COMPETITORS MUST SUBMIT WITH THEIR ENTRY. A CURRENT VACCINES & COGGINS DATED WITHIN 12 MONTHS OF SHOW DATE.

MAIL ENTRIES:

Complete entries (All signatures, Coggins date, Safe Sport Certificate (USEF Members) date and payment) To be mailed to the Show Secretary.

A \$50 NSF fee will be charged for all returned checks.

Entry Cancellation/Refunds: Office fee is not refundable. Entries with written cancellation on or before the closing date will receive 100% refund of all fees minus the \$20 office fee. NO REFUNDS after Closing Date even if original Closing date is extended. Entries must be received by 6:00 pm on the closing date. NO REFUNDS for any reason after the start of warm-up day, including cancellation of a class or classes or all or part of the competition due to severe weather, accident or any other emergency.

Non-Compete Horses: must complete entry form for number. Stabling or haul in & office fee required

Ride Times: Preliminary ride times and a show schedule will be available on ADA's website, www.azdressage.org no later than Wednesday before the show. A ride time schedule will be emailed to rider. Emails must be valid and readable. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule.

No Shows: All "No Shows" that have not contacted the show office will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show and time slots may be filled. **Scratches During Show:** Competitors have responsibility to inform the Show Secretary in the Show Office of their intent to scratch a ride prior to the scheduled ride time. Scratches will not be accepted at the competition arena or with the Ring Steward. Scratches are not refundable.

<u>ARENAS/FOOTING</u>: Competition arenas are 20m X 60m with sand/dirt footing mixture. A sand/dirt footing mixture arena is available for warm-up, with a separate lunging area. Lunging is allowed only in the designated lunging area and not in the warm-up area during the show, competition arenas will be open for hand walking only around the outside of the dressage arena up to one half hour prior to the start of the first class. Mounted schooling is permitted in the competition arenas after the end of each competition day, weather and daylight permitting.

NOTE: Warm up and schooling for WDAA classes can **only be in the warm up arena designated for the Western Dressage Fun in February competitors**. When schooling/warm up or competition, WD riders must wear their bridle number.

Food/Concessions: Available near the grounds. Concession stand might be available inside the Equidome.

Parking: No car or trailer parking between the barns and arenas. Trailers must be parked in the designated areas. Do not block the fire lanes.

Awards: Award and ribbon to 1st place in each division, ribbon for 2nd through 6th place in each division. Ties will be broken per USEF DR 123.3

Management: Show management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally and/or cancel awards of prizes without claims for damages & change order of classes, cancel, split, or combine classes at its discretion if entries deem necessary.

Scratches: Scratches before the closing date may be made for any reason and all fees will be refunded except the office fee.

Dogs: Dogs are welcomed but must be on a 6' leash at all times and are NOT allowed in warm up areas! No expandable leashes. Any loose dogs will result in owner being charged \$50 that will be donated to the local Humane Society. Any dog becoming a nuisance will be asked to leave the grounds.

HORSE AND RIDER CLASS AND DRUG RULES: A Horse/Rider combination may enter no more than two consecutive levels, Freestyle levels included, at any one competition. Suitability, Hack and Equitation are excluded from the maximum limit of rides per day and horses in these classes may compete at any level for which they are otherwise eligible during the same competition. No horse may be ridden more than once in any Western Dressage class (including separate divisions or sections of the same class number). Horses cannot be ridden by more than two riders. Rides will be limited to 4 tests per horse, excluding suitability, equitation, and hack. If there is a conflict with breed division rules regarding WD102.2, the breed division rules will govern United States Equestrian Federation rules are in force from the moment Show Management allows access to the showgrounds. This includes conduct, correct saddlery and equipment, and attire. Exhibitors should also be aware of the USEF rules governing drugs and medications. FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of

(Competition). I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4. NORTH (FLAGSTAFF):

I-17 South to SR-101 Loop – Eastbound into Scottsdale. Take the Pima/Princess exit. Make a left at Bell Road (second light) Continue east on Bell Road. Turn right on 94 Street. Travel south to the WestWorld entrance.

EAST (GLOBE):

US-60 (Superstition Freeway) West to SR-101 Loop, SR-101 North to Frank Lloyd Wright Blvd. exit. Exit at Frank Lloyd Wright Blvd.. Move to far right lane. Continue straight, crossing the Frank Lloyd Wright intersection; move to right lane. The entrance is ½ block from intersection. Turn right at large horse statue.

SOUTH (TUCSON):

I-10 to US-60 (Superstition Freeway), US-60 East to SR-101 Loop, SR-101 North to Frank Lloyd Wright Blvd. Exit at Frank Lloyd Wright Blvd., move to far right lane. Continue straight, crossing the Frank Lloyd Wright intersection. WestWorld entrance is ½ block north on the right at large horse statue.

WEST (CALIFORNIA):

I-10 East to SR-101 North (near Tolleson). Remain on SR 101 into Scottsdale. Take the Pima/Princess exit. Make a left at Bell Road (second light) Continue east on Bell Road. Turn right on 94 Street. Travel south to the WestWorld entrance. Follow signs to RV Check-In.

Please note that WestWorld has 3 entrances. The Main entrance is located just north of Frank Lloyd Wright on the north bound access road of SR-101. The north entrance is at 94th Street and Bell Road. The McDowell Mountain Ranch entrance is only open during show season and special events. Call in advance if you have any questions.

- Online shows recognized by WDAA earn half points.
- USEF-licensed shows judged by USEF-licensed Western Dressage judges earn double points for horses enrolled in WHLPAP.
- Test scores at the WDAA World Championship Show earn triple points for horses enrolled in WHLPAP.
- If a WDAA Recognized Show is double-judged by 2 USEF-licensed Western Dressage judges, only **one score from one judge per ride** can be submitted. You may pick the higher score of the two judges for each ride to submit. **Average scores are not permitted**.
- Submissions from these tests and rail classes described above will be doubled within the WDAA Horse Lifetime Points and Awards Program software
- In no circumstances may a horse earn more than double points for a single ride, except at the WDAA Western Dressage World Championship Show, where a single ride earns triple points.
