STABLING FEES:

\$60.00 Day Stall (2 bags of required minimum bedding is included)
\$105.00 Overnight stall (2 bags of required minimum bedding is included)
Bedding Policy: the ADA contract with WestWorld specifies that additional shavings must be purchased at WestWorld. No outside bedding can be brought in to WestWorld. Contact them at 480-312-6814 for more information for any additional bedding to avoid delays in receiving bedding upon arrival. Pre-ordered bedding will be delivered to your assigned stall.

- Smoking is prohibited in stall areas or near barns
- Use sharps containers provided in barn area. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

***If you are competing in the Western Dressage in the Desert (on Friday) AND the ADA Spring Celebration (on Saturday and/or Sunday) stabling requests and fees should be entered on the entry for Spring Celebration show entry form also. Western Dressage overnight stabling is for Thursday night only. We will coordinate with ADA to maintain your stall assignment.**

NOTE: Beginning in 2021, horses must have competed in at least one WDAA Recognized Show during the year to qualify for showing at the WDAA World Championship Show

ENTRIES

Accepted on first come, first serve basis by on-line entries or mail. One entry per horse/rider combination. Post entries will be accepted on a space available basis with late fee. **ALL COMPETITORS MUST SUBMIT WITH THEIR ENTRY. A CURRENT COGGINS DATE WITHIN 12 MONTHS OF SHOW DATE. AND SAFE SPORT CERTIFICATE EXPIRATION DATE.**

MAIL ENTRIES:

Complete entries (All signatures, Coggins date, Safe Sport Certificate date and payment) to be mailed to the Show Secretary.

A \$50 NSF fee will be charged for all returned checks.

Entry Cancellation/Refunds: Office fee is not refundable. Entries with written cancellation on or before the closing date will receive 100% refund of all fees minus the \$20 office fee. NO REFUNDS after Closing Date even if original Closing date is extended.

Entries must be received by 6:00 pm on the closing date.

Non-Compete Horses: must complete entry form for number. Stabling or haul in & office fee required

Ride Times: Preliminary ride times and a show schedule will be available on ADA's website, www.azdressage.org no later than Wednesday before the show. A ride time schedule will be emailed to rider. Emails must be valid and readable. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule.

No Shows: All "No Shows" that have not contacted the show office will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show and time slots may be filled. **Scratches During Show:** Competitors have responsibility to inform the Show Secretary in the Show Office of their intent to scratch a ride prior to the scheduled ride time. Scratches will not be accepted at the competition arena or with the Ring Steward. Scratches are not refundable.

ARENAS/FOOTING:

Competition arenas are 20m X 60m with sand/dirt footing mixture. A sand/dirt footing mixture arena is available for warm-up, with a separate lunging area. Lunging is allowed only in the designated lunging area and not in the warm-up area during the show, competition arenas will be open for hand walking only around the outside of the dressage arena up to one half hour prior to the start of the first class. Mounted schooling is permitted in the competition arenas after the end of each competition day, weather and daylight permitting.

NOTE: On Saturday and Sunday, competitors for the *ADA Spring Celebration* will also be on the grounds competing. Per WDAA rules, warm up and schooling for WDAA classes can **only be in the warm up arena designated for the Western Dressage in the Desert competitors**. When schooling/warm up or competition, WD riders must wear their bridle number.

Food/Concessions: Available on the grounds.

Parking: No car or trailer parking between the barns and arenas. Trailers must be parked in the designated areas. Do not block the fire lanes.

Awards: Award and ribbon to 1st place in each division, ribbon for 2nd through 6th place in each division. Ties will be broken per USEF DR 123.3

Management: Show management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally and/or cancel awards of prizes without claims for damages & change order of classes, cancel, split, or combine classes at its discretion if entries deem necessary.

Scratches: Scratches before the closing date may be made for any reason and all fees will be refunded except the office fee.

Competitors arriving after 6:00 PM must contact the Barn Manager to make arrangements for stall access.

Dogs: Dogs are welcomed but must be on a 6' leash at all times and are NOT allowed in warm up areas! No expandable leashes. Any loose dogs will result in owner being charged \$50 that will be donated to the local Humane Society. Any dog becoming a nuisance will be asked to leave the grounds.

A Horse/Rider combination may enter no more than two consecutive levels, Freestyle levels included, at any one competition. Suitability, Hack and Equitation are excluded from the maximum limit of rides per day and horses in these classes may compete at any level for which they are otherwise eligible during the same competition. No horse may be ridden more than once in any Western Dressage class (including separate divisions or sections of the same class number). Horses cannot be ridden by more than two riders. Rides will be limited to 4 tests per horse, excluding suitability, equitation, and hack. If there is a conflict with breed division rules regarding WD102.2, the breed division rules will govern United States Equestrian Federation rules are in force from the moment show management allows access to the showgrounds. This includes conduct, correct saddlery and equipment, and attire. Exhibitors should also be aware of the USEF rules governing drugs and medications. FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of _____ (Competition). I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

Federation Release, Assumption of Risk, Waiver, and Indemnification

This document waives important legal rights. Read it carefully before signing.

I AGREE in consideration for my participation in this Competition to the following:

I AGREE that the "Federation" and "Competition" as used herein includes the Licensee and Competition Management, as well as all of their officials, officers, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers and Federation affiliates.

I AGREE that I choose to participate voluntarily in the Competition with my horse, as a rider, driver, handler, vaultor, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, trainer, or as parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor. I am fully aware and acknowledge that horse sports and the Competition involve inherent dangerous risks of accident, loss, and serious bodily injury including broken bones, head injuries, trauma, pain, suffering, or death. ("Harm").

I AGREE to hold harmless and release the Federation and the Competition from all claims for money damages or otherwise for any Harm to me or my horse and for any Harm of any nature caused by me or my horse to others, even if the Harm arises or results, directly or indirectly, from the negligence of the Federation or the Competition.

I AGREE to expressly assume all risks of Harm to me or my horse, including Harm resulting from the negligence of the Federation or the Competition.

I AGREE to indemnify (that is, to pay any losses, damages, or costs incurred by) the Federation and the Competition and to hold them harmless with respect to claims for Harm to me or my horse, and for claims made by others for any Harm caused by me or my horse while at the Competition. I have read the Federation Rules about protective equipment, including GR801 and, if applicable, EV114, and I understand that I am entitled to wear protective equipment without penalty, and I acknowledge that the Federation strongly encourages me to do so while WARNING that no protective equipment can guard against all injuries. If I am a parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor, I consent to the child's participation and AGREE to all of the above provisions and AGREE to assume all of the obligations of this Release on the child's behalf I represent that I have the requisite training, coaching and abilities to safely compete in this competition.

I AGREE that if I am injured at this competition, the medical personnel treating my injuries may provide information on my injury and treatment to the Federation on the official USEF accident/injury report form.

BY SIGNING BELOW, I AGREE to be bound by all applicable Federation Rules and all terms and provisions of this entry blank and all terms and provisions of this Prize List. If I am signing and submitting this Agreement electronically, I acknowledge that my electronic signature shall have the same validity, force and effect as if I affixed my signature by my own hand.
